From Father Michael Garry

The traditional date for the celebration of Epiphany in the west is 12 days after Christmas on January 6th. Since 1970, in the United States the celebration of Epiphany is transferred to the first Sunday after January 1st. It is one of the oldest Christian feasts, going all the way back to the end of the 2nd century. In Western Christianity, the feast commemorates principally (but not solely) the visit of the Magi to the newborn



Christ. Of the mysterious Magi, the Gospels give us next to no details other than a mere mention. Venerable Bede (a scholarly saint who died in 735AD) provides us with some colorful details that have since become the traditional image of the wise men: "The first was called Melchior; he was an old man, with white hair and a long beard; he offered gold to the Lord as to his king. The second, Gaspar by name, young, beardless, of ruddy hue, offered to Jesus his gift of incense, the homage due divinity. The third, of black complexion, with heavy beard, was called Baltasar; the myrrh he held in his hands prefigured the death of the Son of Man."

About their lives after leaving that day, Scripture says nothing. But never failing, legend has since filled the vacuum: Many years after Christmas, St. Thomas the Apostle visited the Magi and, after catechizing them, initiated them into the Christian faith. They were then ordained priests, and later bishops. Toward the end of their lives, the Christmas star revisited them, this time leading them to one another for a reunion. The city of Sewa in the Orient is said to be the place of their burial. The history of the veneration of the relics of the three kings is more clear from an historical standpoint. Their relics were brought from Constantinople to Milan in the sixth century. Then, in the year 1164 the relics were brought to Cologne by the Emperor Frederick Barbarossa. The relics are housed in a beautiful gold reliquary constructed sometime between 1180 and 1225. It is the largest reliquary in the western world and, from an artistic standpoint, is regarded as a masterpiece. It is placed above and behind the high altar in the Cologne Cathedral in western Germany and is a popular place of pilgrimage to our present day.

As Catholics we need not commit ourselves to all the legendary details of the Magi, but we certainly wouldn't be wrong in doing so. Numerous times some of these popular and sometimes fantastical stories have been vindicated by historical evidence centuries later. There are, however, core truths that cannot be doubted by a believing Catholic—for example that they really visited our Lord. Personally, I find charming these 'legendary' details our common Christian tradition hands down to us. They add to the atmosphere of the holiday and help us enter into the celebration. If nothing else, the fact that Christians have been talking about this for centuries upon centuries means something.
