



From Father Michael Garry

TODAY IS PALM SUNDAY of the Passion of the Lord and the beginning of Holy Week. Today the Church recalls Christ's entry into Jerusalem in order to accomplish the Paschal Mystery. For this reason, at the beginning of Mass, there is the option of a solemn procession in which we read the related Gospel passage before processing into the church with palms in memorial of Christ's entry.



What has always seemed a little strange to me is that only two times a year—on Palm Sunday and Good Friday—do we read the Gospel account of the crucifixion of our Lord. These passages are extremely rich in meaning and I would love the opportunity to preach on them more, but that's all we get two days a year! Perhaps the reason or instinct behind the Church's decision to only have the passage read twice a year is because the reality of Christ's Passion actually takes place sacramentally at every Mass, creating a kind of redundancy with the reading. It's a question I haven't seriously looked into, but that's my initial thought. Either way, we relish these readings whenever they come around.

Our Catholic tradition has scores of books and meditations written on the Passion narrative. Many of the classic texts have fallen by the wayside and have been forgotten in more recent times. There are many classic reflections on the crucifixion narratives. One example is an anthology of reflections by Archbishop Fulton Sheen called, *The Cries of Jesus from the Cross*. This anthology is arranged into seven chapters, each of which address one of the seven last words spoken by Christ on the Cross. Each chapter also has a selection from Sheen's other books on topics such as the Beatitudes, the seven deadly sins, the seven virtues, the seven words of Jesus and Mary, etc. These reflections may be read one after another as they appear in the book, or they may be read randomly as the reader chooses. Since the anthology comprises seven separate books by Sheen, the reader may also read one complete book at a time. For example, by reading the fourth reflection from each chapter the reader will have read Sheen's *Victory over Vice* book. Archbishop Fulton Sheen has always been a hero of mine, and so I am more than happy to recommend any of his many books, or audio and video recordings.

I pray you all have a prayerful and blessed Holy Week. Spend some time in prayer alone, and contemplate these Gospel texts! And, don't be afraid to explore the reflections found in our tradition.
