There Is Much to Be Done

Growing up Catholic means I must have heard a million times the passage in Matthew's Gospel about how doing things for the "least of these" means you have done them for Jesus. Okay, that is an exaggeration to make a point. But it has been a slogan for so many social justice activities, from clothing and canned food drives, to letter writing campaigns and peaceful protests.

Growing up I only knew how to help the least of these through the school and church activities of the time. Today, YouTube and GodTube are filled with videos of creative ways people reach out to one another. Have you seen the one about the pizza party for the homeless? How about the fake lottery ticket or the house bought from online donations for a poor man? There are even videos of people paying for the car behind them at the drive-through! The awesome thing about this is that it serves as a witness to others. It is not boasting but instead sharing the Good News. Giving and good stewardship can be contagious! Our pastor has several times over the years handed out \$10 bills to confirmation candidates and asked them to "pay it forward." They can keep the money or use it to make a difference in someone else's life. One teen planted a garden for an elderly woman. One bought ingredients for brownies and sold them to give even more than \$10 to charity. The teens not only learned something about good stewardship in the process, but also served as great examples to the parish community.

As always, there is much to be done. The King is coming soon! Let's spread the news and some love at the same time!

Advent 2020 A Sense of Place

On Thanksgiving weekend, when many of us cannot go to other places to celebrate the holiday with the people we love, the holy season of Advent begins. This year we are unable to celebrate the season and our customs in the same ways as we have done before. However, we are preparing some ways in which our sense of place in our church and in our homes may ground us in the love of God, help us to serve family, friends and strangers and open our hearts to hope for the future and spread it to others.

In our worship the Advent Candles will not be in the pews because there are so few people to make up the wreath. They will be in lanterns at the altar that will light our way to a sense of place called Church.

We will still have an empty manger, but cannot fill it at church. Here are some things you can begin to do now to more fully experience the Sense of Place which is church, home and your inner being.

MANGER:

Make a manger at home in a craft project or using any container, like a bowl or box which is meaningful to you. See below for an idea.

ADVENT WREATH:

Make an Advent Wreath and light it when we light the Advent Candles at the video Mass. These wreaths are limited only by four candles and your imagination. Some helpful websites: <https://mariebostwick.com/diy-advent-wreath/> or <https://www.pinterest.com/pin/98657048058774629>.

Begin thinking about a special item that you have that is meaningful to you. Something that brings you joy, peace, hope, evokes a good memory. That gives you that sense of place in your life. Bring it to Mass on the Feast of Christ the King or have it with you that weekend when you watch the on-line Mass. We will bless those objects at that Mass and use them for contemplation during Advent.

Guiding Star Wakota

New Building Heralds Service Expansion

The walls came tumbling down last week at the Wakota Life-Care Center on Robert Street South. In their place, construction has started on a two-story, 10,000-square-foot building that will house the renamed and revitalized Guiding Star Wakota—the nonprofit organization that for more than four decades has provided compassionate care to pregnant women, their infants, and their families.

“We have a long history of serving women in northern Dakota County and Ramsey County. Our programs and services will not only continue but also expand when Guiding Star Wakota moves into its new space next year,” said Renee Skidmore, president of the Guiding Star Wakota Board of Directors. “We’ll have the capacity to offer many more services on site, such as an expanded curriculum of parenting and life skills classes, doula support, mental health counseling, and facilitated support groups.” In addition, Wakota plans to partner with a medical clinic to provide on-site, life-affirming healthcare services for entire families.

Contributions from individual donors have covered much of the \$2.9 million construction cost, with major funding provided by the Peter J. King Family Foundation.

While construction is underway, Guiding Star Wakota has relocated to Suite 14A at Signal Hills Center at 1201 Robert Street S. It is open Monday through Friday, from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm.


