



The Mass Must Be Lived

A young mom sat next to her 10-year old son during the 9 a.m. Mass with Father Tim presiding. "When's it gonna be over?" the boy whispered pleadingly. "Soon," the mom replied. As the congregation stood, the boy perked up. Father Tim then gave the final blessing and said, "The Mass is never ended: it must be lived." The boy plopped down in the pew, crossed his arms, glared angrily at his mother, and muttered, "You said 'Soon."

Not soon, but now is the time to live the Mass, to be aware of our place in God's creation. Everyone of us can change something in our relationship with Mother Earth. The 3 Rs (Reduce, Reuse, and Recycle) should always be preceded by a 4th R: Reconsider. What is the local and global impact of my action or inaction? Can I live simply so others can simply live?

Pope Francis' 2015 encyclical Laudato Si' challenges us to meet the needs of the poor and vulnerable through an ecologically sustainable economy by recognizing the interconnections in the natural world and accepting our responsibility to promote a healthy planet. By focusing on pollution, waste, and misuse of resources, we can clean up creation, the face of God.



Everyday Stewardship

First Corinthians and the Stewardship of Social Media

"Love is patient, love is kind ..." As familiar as these words are, they never seem to stray into the territory of becoming trite or silly. At their core they communicate a truth about us and about our Creator that never fails to inspire.

But despite the fact that you've probably heard it at many weddings over time, First Corinthians isn't just for newlyweds. It wasn't written for married folks. It's for every single one of us, in every state of life and every social situation, in every country and culture and language across the globe.

Which means that First Corinthians is even for the online world. It's for Facebook and Twitter and Instagram and all the other platforms I'm forgetting (there seems to be a new one every day, doesn't there?).

A sense of division — whether rooted in politics, culture or anything else — is growing in our world, and it's never more obvious than when we observe interactions online. It is far easier, after all, to remember what love is when a human being of flesh and blood stands before us. When all we see is an avatar or a profile picture on a screen — especially accompanied by an opinion with which we vehemently disagree — even the most loving Christians can throw First Corinthians out the window.

As everyday stewards we know that we are charged to be not only gracious but grateful. We receive others but we also give thanks for what they bring to us — even if that's an opportunity to "strive eagerly for the greatest spiritual gifts."

So before the next time you post anything online, I suggest giving First Corinthians a read — and remember, love never fails.

A Letter from FSCS Principal

On one of the particularly frigid days in early January, with indoor recess, I encountered a small group of First Graders playing cards. They invited me to join and handed me some "Go Fish" cards. When I inquired about a few of the rules retrieved from the depths of my memory bank, one of the girls informed me forthrightly that "your idea of how to play this game is really old-fashioned." I chuckled and went along with any variation they wanted to play, flexing with the whim of how the rules seemed to change a bit with each turn taken. Surely no one version of the rules was "mission critical" to the desired outcome of matching the fish.

This experience stuck with me, and comes back to mind today as we prepare to celebrate Catholic Schools Week, because there definitely *are* guiding principles and convictions which are "mission critical" for the endeavor of Catholic schooling. Rooted, as we are, in the gospel of Jesus Christ – his ways of living, ways of believing, ways of loving and ways of serving – we have the rich legacy of a pathway that is timeless. Infusing all of our striving towards excellent educational outcomes is the pastoral priority embedded in the pattern of the Faithful Shepherd – to "pasture" in a manner so that each may be found and all may be fed.

At the essence, then, of our parish Catholic School, is the mission to form disciples – followers of this way of Jesus Christ – and to equip them to transform the world around them. At Faithful Shepherd, we do this as a direct extension of the mission of this parish, and always as partners in the mission of each family. Because our Catholic Christian faith is about giving the gospel a life in the here and now, it is never "old-fashioned." The essential focus for those of us living our discipleship in 2022, therefore, is the challenge to establish the "means and the methods for the mission" in ways that are ever new – and to continue to re-invent and to re-invest in Catholic schooling in a contemporary style which equips each new generation to respond to the call to holiness in this day, and to express the reign of God in this place.

Maybe we could say that Jesus played "Go Fish" as he invited and formed disciples – and the rules were pretty straightforward: "Love one another as I have loved you." In the Catholic School environment, we provide an eco-system, if you will, in which the school of fish learns to ever more completely "match" the pattern of gospel living into which we have been immersed. 


Gospel
