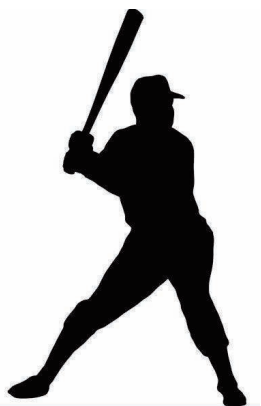

FROM THE DESK OF FATHER ARENS

My Friends,
When we look into the sanctuary of our Church, we see Jesus Christ crucified. The crucifix we look at is never a perfect representation of the likeness and wounds of Jesus because every image in the sanctuary has been adjusted to look a little more like a heavenly image. In other words, the suffering and death of Jesus is captured, but also, in a small way, the resurrection. In fact, every statue and sacred image in Church is usually designed to picture not only an earthly existence, but a heavenly one where the wounds of sin have been repaired.

So goes our lives of faith. We might have a horrible week or be extremely burdened by our current sufferings, whether they are large or small. But when we come to Mass, we dare to look forward to the day when there is no more suffering or sin, and when all is right again with God and the world. The liturgy never presents us with symbols of death or hopelessness, but every symbol, even the image of the dying Jesus, is filled with the hope of life.

Although we are a long way from that state where suffering and sin are no longer, the sacred liturgy gives us a foretaste of this reality, as we use many signs of the life of heaven at Mass. May our prayer life and our lives of service help remind us and others that, in the midst of life's challenges, Jesus is risen and shares with us His risen life.

Please note one change in the weekday Mass schedule next week. On Wednesday morning at 8:15am, Bishop Quinn is coming to bless the school and classrooms. To accommodate this, Mass on Wednesday morning will be moved to 7:30am.
