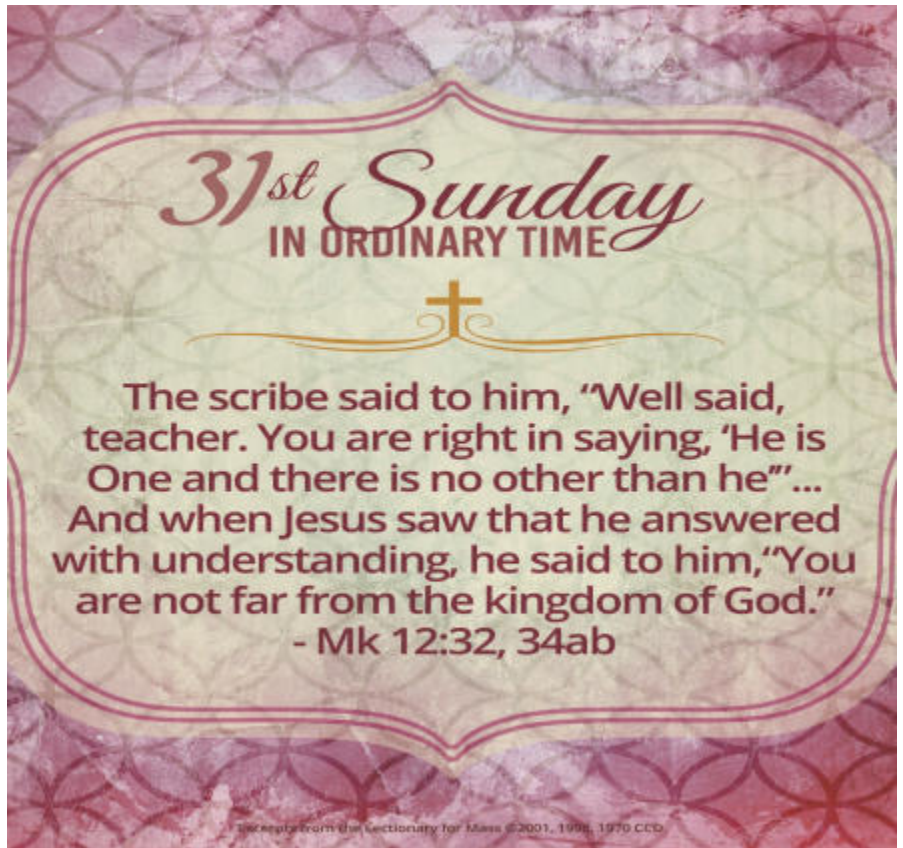

FROM THE DESK OF FATHER ARENS

My Friends,

Last week I heard something interesting about the observance of Halloween. There seem to be some proposing that Halloween be permanently moved to the weekend instead of having that particular celebration fall on a different day of the week each year. Whether or not this is received well who knows, but it is certainly interesting in my view.

The Church has been doing this sort of thing for many centuries. There are certain feast days that are always moved to the nearest weekend, and some that remain on a particular day. For instance, our celebrations of Epiphany and the Ascension are always transferred to the nearest weekend. Easter itself is always observed on a Sunday, but Christmas is always on its proper day of December 25.

But what is more interesting, I think, is the discussion that arose in regard to why Halloween is on October 31st. Obviously, we all know that it is the eve of All Saints day, and the Halloween celebration was one that was first about the saints in heaven, and not about ghouls, goblins, skeletons and scary attire. Returning to the roots of Halloween might be a good thing, as it was, and continues to be, the vigil of a great feast. Dressing up as saints calls to mind good things and great examples of holiness. It is also something that teaches about the faith.

Whatever the case may be, All Saints day is the beginning of our special month of remembering our faithful departed and of praying for them. May they soon join the angels and saints in heaven, and may we always show our love for them by lifting them up in prayer.

Beginning next week I will be taking some of my vacation time. Usually I do this in the spring and the fall, depending on the schedules and events of the parishes. Sometimes it's tricky to plan it around all of the events, but taking a little time off from time to time is very important for a priest amidst the busyness of parish life. I'll be leaving on Monday and will return on Saturday the 17th, in time for our weekend Masses and our St. Stan's parish festival. Should you need assistance finding a priest in my absence, please contact the parish office and they will help you to track down one of the many priests in town.
