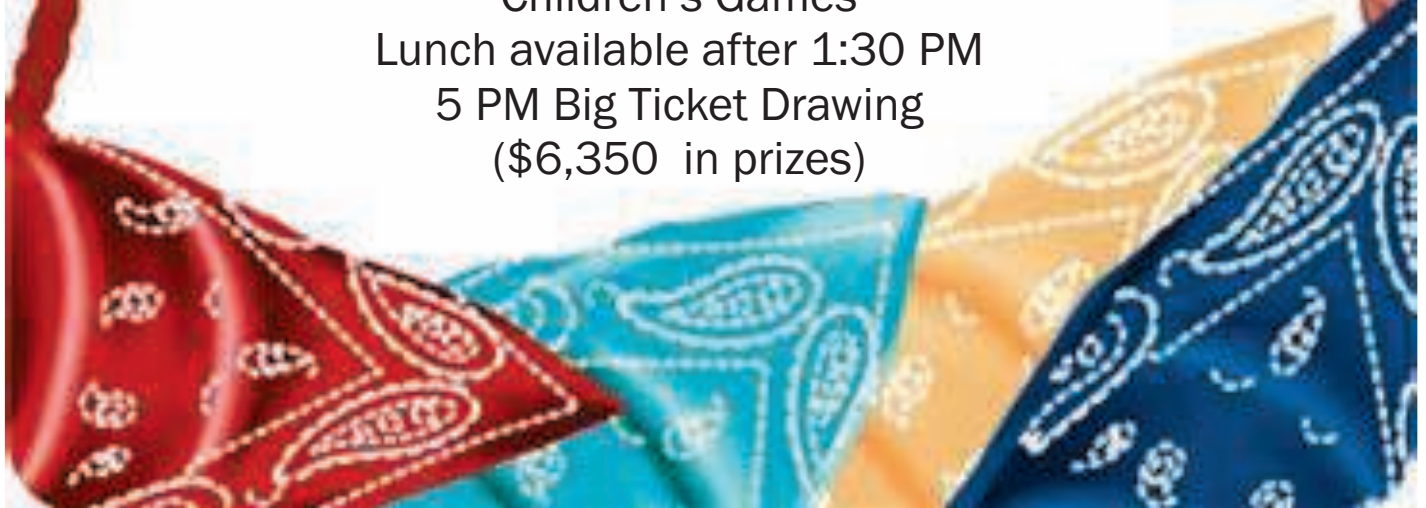

FROM THE DESK OF FATHER ARENS

My friends,

In the gospels, Jesus covers a lot of ground in a very short time. Not only does He teach about the New Covenant and the sacraments, but He also presents the concept of the Church and its membership in heaven and on earth. Jesus also teaches about the end of time. Not so much about the end of the world, though, but rather the fulfillment of everything He has said and done.

Jesus reminds His followers that they don't know the day or the hour when everything will come to an end and encourages them to be ready at all times to see this great event. Jesus has given us the sacraments, especially the Sacrament of Reconciliation, to make sure that we can be ready to see the Lord at any time and take our place in the Communion of Saints as the Kingdom is fulfilled.

When we receive the sacraments of the Church, a great mystery takes place. Although we will have to wait for the end of our life to see God face to face, we see and experience Him on earth in mystical signs. We know that He is present in our liturgical celebrations and through them we see just a glimpse of what is to come in heaven and what will take place at the end of time.

We are in the last few weeks of Ordinary Time before the beginning of Advent. The liturgy will focus us on both the end of time, but also the beginning of the Reign of God. May we be ready for the Lord as He enters our lives, both now through the Sacred Mysteries of the sacraments, and at the end of our earthly days when His kingdom is fulfilled.
