

### FROM THE DESK OF FATHER ARENS

My friends,

We continue our celebration of the Christmas mystery this weekend with the feast of Holy Family. This feast continues our reflection on the humanity of Jesus and how God, who created the heavens and the earth, was born in time and made human.

Of all the mysteries of our Lord's life that we celebrate, Christmas is probably the most celebrated. This would make sense, since it is the feast that God identifies with us most closely. For centuries humanity knew that God dwelt in heaven and at times appeared on earth in various ways, but this would be the first time that God would be physically present in a tangible and visible form. Because God came down from heaven to dwell among us, it seems natural that this feast would be held in high regard and much festivity.

The Feast of the Holy Family continues this theme. Not only did God come down to earth and take human form, but He also lived in a human family. In this way, God would identify with us even more and we would be reminded that He experienced a significant aspect of life that all human beings do. With this experience, He would also raise the family up to an even higher dignity.

In our day and time, we see the family under attack in many ways. When Christ became part of a human family, He demonstrated to us that He had high expectations for the family and that it would be a place where He Himself would be present. The family is the source of many good things, and is even the way that the faith is passed down from generation to generation. With the breakdown of the family comes many negative consequences for the Church and for humanity in general.

And so we continue to call upon Christ to strengthen our families and assist them with His grace. Christ knew that family life would be a challenge from time to time and would sometimes be a source of sadness and difficulties. But He has promised to be with every family. The more that a family allows Christ to be present, especially through prayer and the practice of the faith, the more the family will be filled with peace, harmony and goodness.

Finally, one more note about the feast days. Usually January 1st, the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God, is a Holyday of Obligation. This year, since it falls on a Saturday, it is not. Mass will still be offered on that day at 9am for those would like to celebrate the feast and ask God's blessing upon the coming year.




