

FROM THE DESK OF FATHER ARENS

My friends,

This weekend, the Christmas mystery continues with our celebration of the Epiphany. This feast, first and foremost, celebrates the beginning of the announcement of the Good News of the Savior to the world.

The Magi had a very important role in the preaching of the gospel. It was through them that the news of the Savior began to be spread. Going home "by another route" they had opportunities to share this great message. From these places, it began to fill the whole world.

While we often celebrate the gifts that were given to Jesus, these gifts are not the primary focus of the feast. The gifts indicated that the Magi knew who Jesus was: God and man come down to earth. They tell us that the Magi knew precisely about Him whom they were going to proclaim to the world.

Our custom of giving gifts at Christmas comes from this gesture to our Lord. While all the consumerism and secular celebrations have ended by now, the faith continues to invite us to ponder this mystery. We will have a few weeks now to look more closely at the Christmas mystery and Jesus' manifestation at Epiphany through the scripture readings at Mass. This will all come to a conclusion on the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, February 2, when our preparations for Lent will begin.

During this time, may we continue to give praise and thanks to God for sending us a Savior, and may our celebration of the real reason for Christmas bring us closer to our Savior throughout the whole year.
