My friends,

With the Christmas Season now complete, the liturgy gives us a few weeks to ponder the mysteries we have celebrated. When the Magi entered the manger scene in Bethlehem, they knew who Jesus was, believed, and expressed their faith. This was the first of the epiphanies we find in the gospels.

For each weekend now, until Lent, we will hear one gospel account of a little "epiphany." For each of these little epiphanies, something divine takes place, and because of it, people begin to believe that Jesus is true God.

It will be good for us to reflect on these to remind ourselves of the miracles of Jesus and how these continue in our own day and time. When God appears to each of us through some divine action, we pray that we will have our eyes open and the faith to believe that Jesus is true God and has come to raise our lives up.

On Saturday the 22, the Church in America observes the Day of Prayer and Penance for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children. It is so very sad that we have to have a day like this in our calendar, but it is a necessary reminder of one of the greatest tragedies in human history. Each of us has the responsibility to work for the end of this gruesome practice and defend the most defenseless in our society. Please choose an act of penance to perform on this day. Also, Mass will be offered at 9am on Saturday for the intention of protection of the unborn.

Also, please stay tuned in regard to our Synod meeting that will be taking place soon in our parish cluster. More information will be forthcoming in future bulletins.
