

My friends,

I am happy to report that I have emerged from COVID quarantine and am back at things. Like many at this time, the extent of my illness was just that of a bad cold and cough and didn't include any of the dangerous symptoms. I want to thank all of you who kept me in your prayers during those two weeks. I promise to keep all of you in prayer and especially pray for your healing if you find yourself experiencing that or another illness. Even though we still see challenges and difficulties due to the pandemic, we continue to thank God for seeing us through things and guiding us with His hand. May He bring healing to all.

You may have seen details emerge in regard to meetings at parishes clusters in regard to the next Synod of the Catholic Church. Each parish cluster has been invited to set aside some time to reflect on our faith and look at some important questions. How are we doing in regard to living out our faith? What is our level of understanding? What is our level of participation and putting our faith into action in our daily lives? These are some important questions that are always good to look at. The Synod meeting is one way we can together see where we are at and how we can grow in our faith

There will be two Synod meetings in our parish cluster. One will be held for adults and another session will be held for youth. Since the cultivation of the faith happens in each stage of life, our young people will also be invited to participate and share their faith during one of their Religious Ed sessions on a Wednesday night. There will also be a third session of the Synod and this will be conducted for the newly married and the parents of recently baptized children. They will be contacted individually.

The main session for adults from our parish cluster of St. Stanislaus and St. John's will be on Saturday, January 29 at 9:30am at St. Stanislaus. The morning will begin with a time of prayer in Church (Eucharistic Adoration and Benediction) and continue with small group and large group discussions in the hall. The prayer component of the morning will be led by our parish clergy, Deacon Justin and myself, and the discussions will be led by a lay leader. Thanks to Dean Beckmann for agreeing to take this important role. For more information on the meeting and the questions that will be discussed, please see the enclosed flyer.

Dean will summarize the discussions and will submit the fruits of the discussions to the diocese, who will collect them and forward them on to the US Conference of Bishops. From there, they will go on to the Synod.

The purpose of the Synod Meeting is to reflect upon the faith. Pope Francis has reiterated that this is not a time to reformulate Church doctrine or propose things that are contrary to the Church's faith and morals. Rather, it is a time to listen, discuss, reflect, pray and grow.

May the Holy Spirit guide us all on our journey, and may He bring healing, hope and happiness to us all.
