Hospital Visitation:


Due to privacy laws, hospitals no longer notify the parish office if parishioners are admitted. Please contact the rectory if you or one of your family members are going to be hospitalized.

On this special day, I am doubly blessed to be your spiritual father.



DRESS UP, NOT DOWN FOR SUNDAY MASS, EVEN IN SUMMERTIME



"Every year, this sensitive summer subject crops up: What to wear for church. We Minnesotans spend much of the winter bundled up in jackets, sweaters, hats and gloves, and we relish the day when warmer weather lets us peel off all those layers. But how much is too much? What is appropriate dress for church?"

The Catechism of the Catholic Church says that when it comes to the celebration of the Eucharist, "Bodily demeanor (gestures, clothing) ought to convey the respect, solemnity and joy of this moment when Christ becomes our guest" (No. 1387). Clothing ought to reflect respect and solemnity. When it comes to church clothing, it is time to "dress up," not "dress down."

When I served St. Benedict the African Catholic Church on the South Side of Chicago, it was customary among African-American Catholics there to wear one's "Sunday-go-to-meeting-clothes," a slogan for the best clothes in one's closet. When people came to Mass, they looked sharp.

In the Holy Land and Rome, there are signs at many sacred sites and security guards that refuse admittance to those who are dressed inappropriately.

Consider how you may dress if you were invited to meet the president at the White House or attend a formal dinner.

Doesn't a visit to meet Jesus and attend his great banquet, the Eucharist, rank higher? Shouldn't how we dress reflect this? The Lord deserves our Sunday best."

Cuando es fuerte la Tempestad

Con Cristo ha llegado lo nuevo y Cristo calma la tempestad. El prodigio es realizado por Jesús para suscitar y confirmar la fe de sus discípulos en él: ¿Por qué son tan cobardes? ¿Aún no tienen fe? A la fe se orienta el hecho, como se registra de nuevo en la pregunta final de los discípulos: ¿Quién es este que hasta el viento y las aguas le obedecen? La cuestión planteada incluye la respuesta obvia del evangelista y de la primitiva comunidad apostólica: “Este es Dios”. Por tanto, el milagro de la tempestad calmada viene a ser un signo de la divinidad de Jesús que se revela como encarnación del Dios bíblico que domina los elementos hostiles de la naturaleza desatada, aquí el mar embravecido; lo cual es prerrogativa exclusiva de Dios. Desde siempre, en el grupo de los discípulos que reman desesperadamente dentro de la barca zarandeada por la tempestad en el mar proceloso, la tradición vio una imagen de la Iglesia. Si no se agita en las borrascas es porque Jesús va con ella en la travesía, aunque a ratos no captemos los signos de su presencia por el Espíritu y creamos que Dios nos deja solos ante el peligro. Jesús dormía en la barca, pero más dormida estaba la fe de sus discípulos. Podemos trasladar la escena a la situación de la Iglesia, tanto la de los orígenes que pronto conoció la persecución, como la Iglesia de hoy y de todos los tiempos que camina entre cansancios y esperanzas hacia Dios. Debido a nuestra poca fe, a veces nos ponemos nerviosos; pero Jesús no falla. El guía siempre a su Iglesia, lo mismo en tiempo de calma que de crisis y adversidad. Cristo lo prometió y lo cumple: Yo estaré con ustedes hasta el fin de los tiempos. Por eso el poder del infierno y del mal no hundirá su Iglesia.

En la vida tenemos momentos de prueba para nuestra fe, similares a los de la tormenta en el lago para los discípulos. Cuando la tempestad nos azota despiadada, cuando la Iglesia de Cristo es perseguida, cuando nos visita insistentemente el dolor como a Job, cuando el mal triunfa y se oscurecen los valores del bien y de la virtud, cuando sufrimos injustamente, cuando la pobreza, la desgracia o la muerte hacen abruptamente acto de presencia en nuestra vida, cuando, en una palabra, nos duele el silencio de Dios que parece estar “dormido” como Jesús en la barca, entonces surge espontánea la queja en nuestros labios: Señor, ¿no te importa que nos hundamos? Si nuestro grito es oración, está bien; pero si es desconfianza en la Providencia, duda y falta de fe en definitiva, tendremos que escuchar el correctivo de Jesús: ¿Por qué son tan cobardes? ¿Aún no tienen fe? Porque la fe es precisamente lo único que puede dar respuesta a nuestros interrogantes angustiosos, semejantes a los que se hacía el paciente Job, tales como: ¿Por qué han de sufrir los inocentes, por qué muere un padre o una madre de familia tan jóvenes, por qué progresan y se enriquecen individuos sin conciencia mientras gente honrada pasa necesidad y pobreza, por qué la guerra y el hambre en el mundo, por qué la insolidaridad y el distanciamiento cada vez mayor entre países ricos y pobres, por qué la gradual destrucción de la naturaleza, por qué el cáncer, la pandemia, el sida, por qué en fin tanto sufrimiento en la tierra de los hombres?

La fe tiene la respuesta. A veces nos preguntamos con Job si Dios “sabe” lo que pasa en este bajo mundo. Dios habla a Job desde la tempestad, le revela la trascendencia de su ser y de sus designios, que el hombre ha de acatar con fe sumisa y obediente. Es la lección religiosa que se desprende del fascinante libro de Job. Para esclarecer el misterio del dolor inocente, era necesario esperar hasta que se conociese el valor del sufrimiento de los hombres, unido al sufrimiento de Cristo. Dos textos de san Pablo responderán al angustioso problema de Job: “Los sufrimientos del tiempo presente no son comparables con la gloria que se ha de manifestar en nosotros” (Rom 8,18). “Completo en mi carne lo que falta a las tribulaciones de Cristo, en favor de su cuerpo que es la Iglesia” (Col 1,24). No es el estilo de Dios intervenir directa y milagrosamente contra la maldad de los malos. Aun sin aprobar el mal, respeta la libertad que le dio al hombre y deja actuar a las causas segundas. Pero no perdamos la fe. Dios sabe lo que hace, y el tiempo es suyo, así como la justicia. Nuestro esfuerzo por serle fieles, el mérito de la virtud y del amor a los hermanos no se pierden.

Dios anota en su libro nuestra vida errante y recoge en su odre nuestras lágrimas para premiarlas largamente (Sal 55). Haz que te descubramos, “Dios dormido y ausente”, en medio de los múltiples proyectos, fracasos y aspiraciones, cansancios y esperanzas, frustraciones y anhelos de tantos hermanos nuestros, los hombres que sufren y esperan.



4 THINGS EVERY CATHOLIC PARENT SHOULD MAKE SURE THEIR CHILDREN KNOW BEFORE LEAVING HOME:

***You are loved.** It has been proven over and over that young adults who know beyond any doubt that their parents love them are less likely to engage in risky behavior, including premarital sex, drugs and alcohol. This doesn't mean you will condone all their choices or bail them out of every difficult situation, but it does mean that in a changing world, your love will be a steadfast constant they can rely upon.

***Know your faith.** The "real world" is going to challenge our children's Catholic beliefs. Catholics with a weak knowledge of the teachings of the Church often fall victim to evangelization by other faiths, or, worse, fall away from faith completely. Even if your children have had the best Catholic education, don't assume they fully understand what they've been taught. Take time to discuss the faith. Listen to your children and ask pointed questions.

***The Church is your home.** Make sure your children know that they may be leaving your family home, but they never have to leave their church home. When bouts of homesickness threaten (as they probably will), a nearby Catholic Church and the Mass can be a touchstone of safety in what can feel like an impersonal world.

***Pray daily.** As important as friends are, friendship with God is even more important. Our children need to understand that friendship with God requires time and energy. While it is true that God is always there waiting for us, and that God does, in fact, take the initiative to contact us, we need to spend time every day in prayer in order to know and understand God's will for our lives.
