

AGUA EN VINO

Padre Jairo Congote

Uno tiende a pensar que Cristo sólo hacía milagros para sanar defectos o enfermedades o posesiones diabólicas en las personas. Comparado con lo que implica devolver la vista a un ciego, el milagro de convertir agua en vino parece casi sin importan-

cia. Pero no fue trivial para Cristo, por dos razones: una, porque no es trivial para él atender al ruego de su Madre; dos, porque cada detalle de nuestra vida es importante para él. Nuestro Dios no cuida sólo de lo grande y voluminoso de nuestra existencia sino que está atento a lo pequeño y discreto: quien ama no quiere sólo dar vida sino también alegría. Jesús en una ocasión estuvo presente en unas bodas compartiendo el gozo y la alegría de los novios y también cómo El, que era un invitado, al final los convidó a todos y les dio un vino mucho mejor.

La palabra de Dios nos dice que de la misma forma Jesucristo hoy quiere compartir la alegría y la fiesta de su amor. Jesucristo comparte todas nuestras ilusiones, esperanzas y alegrías; todo el deseo de felicidad que tenemos, las ansias de plenitud y la realización personal, el anhelo de empezar un nuevo hogar... Todo lo que sentimos, deseamos y queremos vivir, en la medida que es sincero y auténtico, es compartido y bendecido por el mismo Dios.


Jesucristo se compromete a darnos su fuerza. De la misma manera que Jesús les dio el vino mejor, también a nosotros nos quiere dar su gracia para que seamos fieles a los compromisos que delante de Él asumimos.

Por el sacramento del matrimonio se comprometen a vivir su amor de una manera total y completa. Entregándose el uno al otro. Se comprometen a vivir el amor de la misma forma que lo han aprendido de Dios: un amor generoso, que busca siempre el bien y la felicidad de la persona amada, un amor capaz de sacrificio y perdón; por esto, de la misma forma Jesucristo se compromete a ayudarles, a darles su gracia, a fin de que su amor sea capaz de superar todas las dificultades que puedan encontrar en su camino. En su matrimonio no todo será de color de rosa, no les faltarán dificultades, pero pueden estar seguros que la ayuda de Dios no les faltará nunca y les dará fuerza para que su amor pueda superar los momentos difíciles que vengan: difícultades económicas, enfermedades, momentos de incomprensión. Estamos llamados también a convertir el agua en vino. De la colaboración entre Jesús y María surgió un hecho admirable, el primero de los signos obrados por el Señor. Y san Juan nos ha subrayado que la conversión del agua en vino fue motivo de alegría para los novios que veían cómo su fiesta corría el riesgo de "aguarse" por causa de un descuido, y para los invitados que así podían continuar alegres la fiesta. Y al mismo tiempo, hizo que creciera la fe en Jesús de los discípulos que habían presenciado el hecho. También ustedes están llamados, ejerciendo cada uno su papel propio, a "convertir el agua en vino". Que de las cosas más habituales y cotidianas, esas que valoramos tan poco, esto es "el agua", ustedes deben hacer "vino", algo de valor, sabroso y que alegra a quien lo bebe. Su amor, su fidelidad en las penas y en las alegrías... es lo que convertirá lo vulgar y diario, el "agua", en motivo de alegría para los demás, para aquellos a quienes traten y los observen. Y así a la vez en su amor harán visible a Dios, Aquel a quien nadie ha visto pero a quien san Juan se atreve a definir como "el Amor". De esta manera siempre que ustedes actúen con amor será motivo de que aumente la fe de los que los observen, de la misma manera que creció la fe en los discípulos que acompañaban a Jesús y a su madre en las bodas de Caná. 
