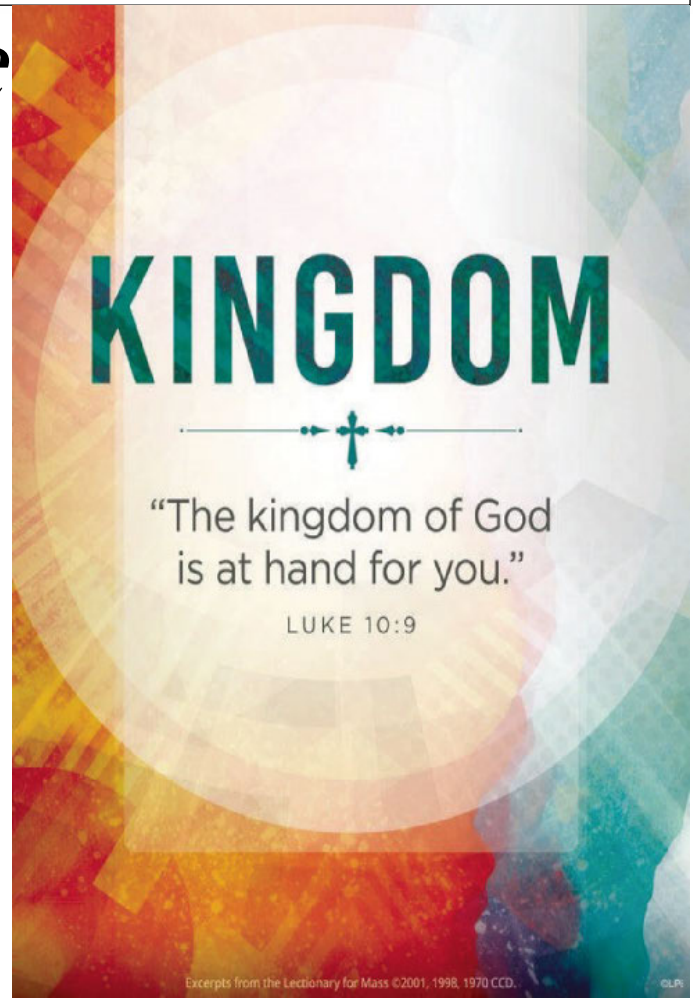

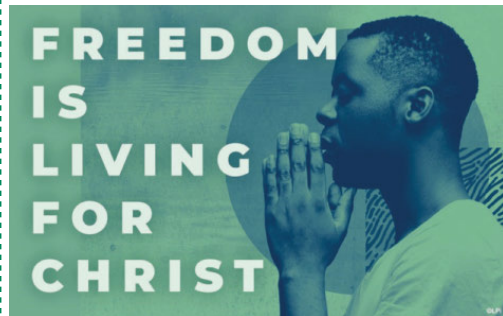
**14TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME GOSPEL
MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER
UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE**

Freedom properly defined is freedom properly understood. The Cambridge Dictionary tells us that it is, "the condition or right of being able or allowed to do, say, think, etc., whatever you want to, without being controlled or limited." That same dictionary defines liberty as, "the freedom to live, work, and travel as you want to." Both definitions sound very similar. Is there a difference between freedom and liberty? Many are accustomed to believing that freedom and liberty are interchangeable and simply involve possessing rights and privileges. For the Christian, however, there is a big difference between the two.

St. John Chrysostom directs that "the only person who is free is the one who lives for Christ." There are many other inspirational people throughout history who see freedom as something far greater than liberty. True and properly understood freedom has little to do with entitlement or self-promotion. For the believer, it is a matter of the heart and soul. Freedom (and liberty, for that matter), seen only in terms of the world, can quickly be taken away. The freedom spoken of by St. John Chrysostom can only be lost by personal choice. When one lives for Christ, they live in pursuit of virtues that enlighten one's soul (faith, hope, and love) and strengthen one's character (justice, fortitude, temperance, and prudence). Rather than having the ability to acquire or do more things, true freedom asks us to be detached. Privileges, rights, and responsibilities are important, but they do not define us.

The world is not always open to listening to the truth. "I am sending you like lambs among wolves," Jesus tells his disciples. The secular definitions of freedom and liberty are very attractive. They promise us a great deal. It is no wonder Jesus asks his disciples to travel with very little. The Gospel is not dependent upon things or anything those with worldly power or investment can say or do. When one chooses to live for Christ, they choose to live with peace. That's what true freedom will give us. If we do not want what Christ offers, we can close the door, and the messenger will walk away. Distracted by the lure of personal liberties, we risk losing our freedom. We will not have anything truly life-giving to share with others.

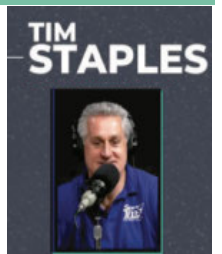

SE NECESITAN TRABAJADORES

Padre Jairo Congote

"La mies es abundante, pero los trabajadores son pocos". El dueño de la mies es Dios. Tenemos que rezar para que Dios envíe más trabajadores a su mies. El mundo entero es el campo de Dios maduro para cosechar. Hay que evangelizar a la gente y enseñarle los caminos del Reino. Pero los trabajadores son los obreros y son pocos. La oración por las vocaciones está tristemente descuidada hoy en día. Pero es un apostolado muy necesario. La disminución del número de sacerdotes y de vocaciones al sacerdocio es bastante alarmante. "Los envío como corderos en medio de lobos". Jesús es consciente de las oposiciones contra el Evangelio. El diablo intentará detener la difusión del Evangelio. Los discípulos no deben ser complacientes e ingenuos, pues el mundo está repleto de enemigos, tentaciones y distracciones. Jesús mismo fue llevado a la cruz por sus enemigos. Sus discípulos no deben esperar un destino menos que el que sufrió su Maestro. La advertencia de Jesús no es más que una advertencia realista. Él quiere que sus seguidores sean conscientes del enemigo, pero les asegura su presencia y protección: "Yo estaré siempre con ustedes hasta el final de los tiempos"; "Ni un pelo de su cabeza será dañado".

"No laves bastón ni bolsa de viaje; no laves sandalias". Esta instrucción puede sonar poco práctica para los hombres modernos. Pero en la época de Jesús, era un consejo práctico: no llevar nada de valor. Los discípulos tienen que ir por el camino, de dos en dos, fueron "enviados en pares", para que haya apoyo y protección, y para que cualquier testimonio pueda ser verificado por dos testigos. Deben tener cuidado con los ladrones y delincuentes en el camino. Llevar cualquier cosa de valor, bolsa de viaje, dinero y demás, seguramente atraerá a esos elementos anárquicos. Sandalias son necesarias para viajar a pie. Los discípulos deben demostrar que son verdaderamente pobres. Un bastón es necesario para defenderse, pero el Evangelio de Lucas lo prohíbe, por dos razones: primero, los discípulos deben ser un signo de paz para la gente, y deben mostrar que no tienen intención de tomar represalias; y segundo, porque capa, bastón y bolsa de mendicidad era el uniforme de filósofos errantes que aceptaban la recompensa de un mendigo a cambio de su sabiduría. Los discípulos no mendigan: "El obrero vale su salario".

"La paz a esta casa". Los discípulos son los mensajeros de la paz de Dios. En el lenguaje bíblico, la paz es "shalom". No es sólo la ausencia de conflictos o guerras. Más bien, es la presencia de armonía y bienestar total de una persona y de toda la comunidad. Shalom significa que todo está totalmente bien porque el favor de Dios descansa en cada una de las personas. Sólo Dios puede ser la fuente de esta paz. Esto es lo que dijo Jesús: "La paz les la dejo. Mi paz les doy. No la doy como el mundo da la paz". Hoy en día, la gente busca la paz, pero no tienen éxito, porque la buscan lejos de Dios. La verdadera paz sólo llegará cuando la gente aprenda a obedecer los mandamientos de Dios y a vivir según su voluntad. Jesús envió a sus discípulos como mensajeros de la paz para ayudarles a vivir según el plan y los mandatos de Dios. Si rechazan el mensaje de los discípulos, la paz no puede permanecer con ellos. Esto es lo que ocurre ahora en el mundo. Estamos en constante agitación, confusión y problemas porque la gente rechaza las enseñanzas de Dios y desobedecen sus mandatos.

"Quédense en la misma casa, comiendo y bebiendo lo que tienen, porque el obrero vale su salario. No vayan de casa en casa". Los discípulos no van por ahí mendigando comida y sustento. Es obligación del pueblo mantenerlos. Al mismo tiempo, no pueden ser exigentes y demandantes. Deben contentarse con lo que la gente les ofrece. Anunciar el Evangelio no es sólo una obligación de los discípulos; los laicos también tienen su parte en esta misión apoyando a los misioneros.

Los discípulos volvieron de su misión, y se regocijaban porque habían logrado mucho, y habían expulsado a muchos demonios: "Maestro, hasta los demonios se nos someten en tu nombre". Jesús respondió rápidamente: "He visto a Satanás caer del cielo". Es una fuerte advertencia a sus discípulos contra el orgullo. Satanás cayó del cielo, es decir, fue expulsado del cielo a causa de su orgullo. Los discípulos deben tener cuidado, en medio de sus éxitos y logros misioneros, nunca olviden que es Dios quien hizo todas esas cosas, y ellos son sólo sus instrumentos. Por eso, Jesús añadió: "No se alegren tanto de que los demonios se sometan como de que sus nombres estén inscritos en el cielo". La tentación del poder es la más insidiosa de todas. Por eso, los discípulos no deben jactarse de su poder sobre los demonios. Por el contrario, deben alegrarse, a pesar de sus debilidades y limitaciones, Dios los utilizó como instrumentos suyos y, por tanto, participan en su plan de salvación para la humanidad. Entonces, tienen la seguridad de que sus nombres ya están escritos en el cielo.

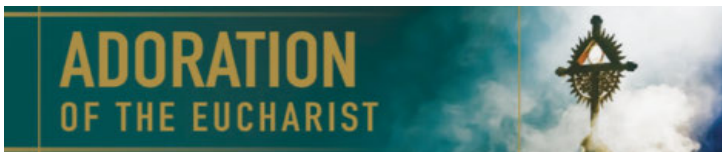

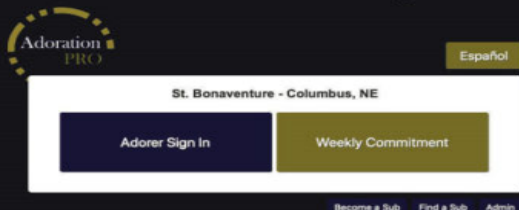

WHEN GOD SPEAKS LIKE A POLISH GRANDMOTHER

A friend of mine had a Polish grandmother who was famous for giving her children some blunt advice every time they left the house: "Eyes straight ahead. Mind your own business."

Every mother knows her children best, and this mother knew hers liked to argue and sometimes liked to show off. She knew that could lead to trouble. She could not anticipate every scenario they would encounter each time they departed from her. All she could do was distill what she knew about life, safety, and manners into a few simple words, and hand them over to her children like a set of car keys or a hastily scribbled map. In this way, a woman who rarely said "I love you" expressed her devotion. And long after she was dead and buried, her aging sons and daughters repeated these words to themselves, like a child wrapping himself in a warm blanket.

Jesus does much the same for us, in many portions of the Gospels. "Ask the master to send out laborers for his harvest... Carry no money... Eat what is set before you... Know that the Kingdom of God is at hand... Rejoice because your names are written in Heaven."

He knows us best — knows our strengths, but even more importantly, he knows our weaknesses. He doesn't always have the space to address each of these explicitly in the pages of Scripture, but what he can do is distill the truth of effective evangelization into a few simple words, and hand them over to us as food for our journey of discipleship. In this way, a God who addresses the entire world and every soul who ever lived also speaks intimately to each one of us.
