



Escuchar a Jesús y Hospitalidad Padre Jairo Congote

Vemos en los evangelios dos personajes muy importantes Marta y María amigas de Nuestro Señor. Ellas pueden representar dos posturas o actividades que se puedan tomar ante Jesús. Las dos son buenas, aunque no

iguales. Marta aparece como toda donación generosa, que se desvive por ofrecer la mejor hospitalidad que ella sabe brindar a Jesús. María por su parte es todo oído y receptividad al mensaje de Jesús. Marta se llena de actividad, mientras que María se llena de Jesús. En el mundo moderno hay muchas Martas y pocas Marías, por lo que hay que insistir cada vez más en la necesidad de escuchar a Jesús y de escuchar a los demás. Todo el mundo tiene su don y carisma de acción, especialmente para hablar, pero lo que más falta hace es el don de escuchar; más que un don de lenguas, como el día de Pentecostés, hace falta el don de oídos.

Marta creía que ella hacía lo más importante, ya que sin ella no habría comida; no se daba cuenta de que se afanaba con tantas cosas que perdía el sosiego y la paz y que además corría el riesgo de interrumpir la paz de los demás, comenzando por su hermana. Marta andaba distraída de lo que realmente era importante. De pronto Jesús, más que comer quería enseñar y que se le escuchara. Aparentemente María servía mejor a la necesidad y a la misión de Jesús, pero su hermana Marta no lo entendía. María escuchaba y guardaba las palabras de Jesús en su corazón, como la Virgen María lo había hecho durante la infancia de Jesús, por lo que, para san Lucas, era merecedora de bienaventuranza y bendición.

El evangelio no busca intentar oponer una vida activa con una contemplativa, como si una excluyera a la otra, porque las dos formas de vida son modos de darse y abrirse a Dios. El evangelio subraya la primacía del oír, escuchar, meditar y dialogar con Jesús. San Benito ponía como principio fundamental el "ora et labora" la oración y el trabajo, como los dos polos de la vida monástica y cristiana; pero san Benito recalcaba que la oración, el Oficio Divino, tiene la primacía y es lo más importante porque es de una manera especial "la obra de Dios". San Ignacio de Loyola veía las dos formas de relacionarse con Jesús como partes de una misma realidad y quería formar "contemplativos en la acción", compaginando las prioridades del evangelio de hoy. En nuestro mundo actual hay demasiada actividad cosas que distraen a la gente de Dios e impiden que se desarrollen buenas relaciones interpersonales; a veces tenemos tiempo para todo pero no para otras personas.

Hoy, más que nunca, necesitamos organizar nuestras prioridades para no estar ansiosos y preocupados con tantas cosas que nos distraen de lo más fundamental. Ya que solamente una cosa es necesaria, hacer a Jesús el centro de nuestra vida. Necesitamos, como María, tomarnos más tiempo para estar con el Señor y escuchar sus palabras.

La hospitalidad ha sido una virtud muy apreciada en la cultura hispana: "Mi casa es su casa". Nosotros tenemos una obligación especial de dar hospitalidad a los refugiados e indocumentados, al recordar y tener en cuenta que la mayoría de ellos son nuestros hermanos en la fe católica.



GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

"Our families need to ask for the gift of the Spirit! Through prayer, even in the busiest times, we give time back to God, we find the peace that comes from appreciating the important things, and we encounter the joy of God's unexpected gifts. Through daily prayer may our homes become, like the house of Martha and Mary, places where Jesus always finds a warm welcome (Pope Francis)." While it is necessary to attend to the details of hospitality, learning how to be present to people, experiences, and God is sometimes more important. Creating homes that are welcoming environments requires not only organization and structure but members who truly enjoy being there and celebrating life with one another.

Details can often get the best of us. While attending to details is important to success, our obsession with them can be problematic. Whether wanting to make a good impression, fear of failure, insecurity, or emotional immaturity, throwing ourselves into the "details" of hospitality can distract us from being present to those we want to serve. Conversely, focusing exclusively on being present without any attention to detail also sets our attempts at hospitality up for disaster! We need a balance of both. But creating a truly welcoming space in our homes and within ourselves requires still more.

We have to be empty of ourselves. Becoming a welcoming, hospitable person is not possible in someone focused on their own needs and desires. If the one we serve is the one who looks back at us in the mirror, then there is no space for anyone else. While Martha and Mary had different ideas of what it means to serve, they both had the inner space and freedom to do so. They were detached from themselves. Detachment becomes the challenge to hospitality and creating a God-centered, open-hearted space in our lives. When we impulsively act out of our personal agendas, violence, abuse, pride, greed, lust, power, control, passion, and self-aggrandizement encroach upon the space needed to be present to another human being. Not only can others not find a home in us, but even God cannot find a home in us!


