


FAMILY FORMATION

Please keep in your prayers those who are participating in the 33-Day Consecration to St. Joseph. They will be making an act of consecration on November 1st.


For those participating, Joseph's name means "increase". What do you expect to increase in your life as a result of this consecration? Are you asking for a particular favor or grace from St. Joseph?
