

Welcome parishioners, newcomers and to those visiting!

Merry Christmas! We celebrate the Christmas season until the feast of the Baptism of the Lord on January 9 so continue to wish people "Merry Christmas."

During this holy season I want to thank all of our ministers and volunteers who made the Advent season and Christmas masses beautiful and worshipful: our musicians, servers, lectors, mass coordinators. Eucharistic ministers and the Art & Environment committee. Thank you for your prayerful ministry.

This weekend we celebrate the feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. Pope Benedict XVI taught us that "Jesus willed to be born and to grow up in a human family and deserves the title 'Holy', for it was fully engaged in the desire to do the will of God, incarnate in the adorable presence of Jesus. Yet his family was a family like all others and as such, it is a model of conjugal love, collaboration, sacrifice and entrustment to divine Providence." Our family can be holy families. like the family in Nazareth, by living with the same values.

We will celebrate this feast day by praying a consecration to the Holy Family at all masses this weekend.

Saturday, January 1, the Solemnity of Mary Mother of God, is not a Holy Day of Obligation this year. There will be one mass at 9:00 am.

Bishop Joensen reminds us that the Diocese continues to strongly encourage masks at all indoor liturgies and other events, especially for those who are unvaccinated and without natural immunity. Also masks are required for all ministers during the distribution of Holy Communion.

SIGN OF PEACE

We are excited to announce that the Sign of Peace is now back in the Mass! Parishioners are welcome to extend a sign of peace through a handshake or hug before communion when directed. Those wishing to continue social distancing are invited to make a non-physical sign of peace.

At the Sign of Peace, worshipers are invited to show their peace and love before receiving the Eucharist, which accomplishes their unity most perfectly. The nature of the sign is to be determined by the culture of the people who express it. In the United States, the bishops let local communities determine the actions and words. We have no set formula or gesture for extending this sign. Most often worshipers will shake hands and say, "Peace be with you." But you may also see them kiss or embrace, wave or flash a two-fingered Sign of Peace. Although today it would seem cold to omit the Sign of Peace, it is optional. Introduced in the 1960s to a bashful Church unaccustomed to speaking to one another at worship, it broke the silent mood before Communion. Now it has become a welcome expression of unity among those preparing for communion together in Christ.

The invitation to extend the Sign of Peace comes from the deacon. The deacon directs posture, gesture, and action in the liturgy. He tells us when to stand or sit, when to leave and when to show peace.

The placement of the Sign of Peace still confuses some who think it comes too late to say hello and too early to say goodbye. However, the purpose of the sign is not to extend a greeting. It is to express our love; it foreshadows our Communion. It's like an all-for-one huddle before the team charges into play. Team members should have said hello to one another long before. In fact, some communities take a few moments before Mass begins precisely to encourage worshipers to greet those near them. Such a greeting allows people to feel at home, and it can also be shared by catechumens who will be dismissed after the homily. The Sign of Peace has a purpose deeper than a greeting—it expresses the unity of those baptized in Christ.

When extending the Sign of Peace, attentive worshipers resist turning it into a break. This is not the time to congratulate someone on their anniversary, to set up an appointment, or to exchange messages with the servers. It is the time to express peace and love.

We ask this through Christ Our Lord. Amen



Liturgical Link

- Why do you think Jesus called the temple "his Father's house"?
- In what way is your church "your Father's house"?
- Just as Mary did, reflect on the past year and share your most memorable family moment.
- What is your favorite thing to do at Church?
- God worked miracles in the life of St. Reparata.
 Share a time when you saw God's hand at work in your life.

Spiritual Challenge | Practice of Charity

- Consider the interrelationship among God, creation, and humankind. How can you step up your role in this relationship during this year?
- Remember those who might be suffering from seasonal depression or who have lost a loved one during the past year.
- Rather than wrapping another physical present for family members, gift them with your presence through an experience that you can do together.
- Consider a creative activity you can do a clan after attending Mass. Your celebration of togetherness will reinforce God's celebration of you.
- Consider inviting a struggling friend or parishioner to join your home meal. Talk about memories or topics that bring you both joy.
- Consider your family, biological, spiritual, and otherwise chosen. How might you give thanks for them in coming years?
- Make a commitment to enhance your prayer life in this New Year so that you feel led by God's Spirit rather than the chaos of the times. Perhaps this is the year that you can try another prayer discipline, such as lectio divina.
- Consider becoming involved in one of your parish's liturgical ministries.
- Reflect on the concepts of "epiphany" and the multifaceted ways God can manifest in your life.
- In what ways might God be calling you to defy the status quo-your own or societies? How could this benefit you and those around you?

To conclude our Advent theme to *Wonder* in the birth of our Lord, we *Wonder* in *His love*. More accurately, we wonder in love itself, for God IS LOVE (1 John 4:16). This love was present from the beginning of the world and throughout all of history.

At St. Francis, we proclaim the infancy narrative from the Gospel of Luke at our Christmas Masses, but another option is to read the genealogy of Jesus from Matthew 1. The genealogy doesn't make for a gripping narrative, but it proclaims something fascinating about how God works throughout history. In the telling of Jesus' ancestry, we see God setting the world up to receive the Messiah.

Love was working in the hundreds and thousands of years leading up to the birth of Christ - leading up to Love itself entering the world taking on humanity. God loves us so much that he descends to our level so we may have a God who can relate to our humanity.

We are not alone in our suffering, our pains, our trials, and our tribulations. Indeed, we have a God whose name is *Emmanuel* or "God with us." Love is always with us.

Through the Sacrament of Eucharist, we receive Love through the bread and wine that becomes the body and blood of Christ so that Love dwells in us and we are commissioned to take Love out to the world. This reality is what we celebrate at Christmas.

At Christmas, we stand amazed and wonder in Love itself who came down to earth so we might know Him and love Him in return.


