

FROM FR. BROBBEY

ORDINARY TIME BUT NOT ORDINARY CHRISTIAN LIFE

The year 2022 began with my participation in the West Coast Priests Conference in San Diego California from January 3 through January 6. This package was a gift put together by a family or group of people from St. Francis of Assisi who wish to remain anonymous. It has been one of the best if not the best refresher course I have had in my almost 19 years of priestly life. It was such a great opportunity to sit at the feet of seasoned speakers like Dr. John Bergsma, Dr. Tim Gray, Ralph Martin, Fr. Cliff Ermatinger (exorcist) and others to drink from the fountain of wisdom and biblical exposition with a bit of protestant flavor on Catholic content. I wish to register my sincerest and heartfelt gratitude to these anonymous donors for this beautiful package. No terms in human language can adequately express my appreciation. Be assured of my prayers for you and your entire household anytime I lift the cup of salvation and call upon the Lord's name. God bless you until you want no more.

We are in Ordinary Time but Ordinary Time does not imply ordinary visualization and ordinary talks. It is an invitation to see Christ in the ordinary situation of life and find joy like Mary and Elizabeth in the house of Zechariah. In the beginning of Ordinary Time and coming right after the Baptism of the Lord, our Gospel reading for the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time will be from John 1:29-34 and John 1:35-42 for Year A and B respectively. Then in year C, we read the text on the wedding at Cana from John 2:1-11. Whilst everything seemed ordinary, John the Baptist "SAW," "the Lamb of God" (Jesus Christ) who takes away the sin of the World" and bore witness to Him (The Gospel of John 1:29 -42). John the Baptist "SAW" and hence Ordinary time is putting our eyes of faith into action. It is an invitation to see beyond the superficial things of life, events and people. It is a call to find in Jesus an object of fascination. John the Baptist "bore witness to Jesus". So, it is Ordinary time yet our conversations, internet browsing, text messaging, snapchatting, tiktoking, tweeting, phone calls are not all about us and others but also about Jesus - sharing and witnessing about Jesus, his love, his mercy, his grace, his forgiveness and reconciliation, salvation and humility in suffering.

In year C, we read the self-revelation of Jesus as our spiritual bridegroom at the marriage in Cana and Mother Mary's one line sermon, "Do whatever He tells you" as aptly described by Deacon Bill in his last Sunday homily. In this ordinary and fundamental situation of human life, Christ reveals his glory. Ordinary Time is the period to not only SEE but like John and his disciples to also LOOK and recognize Christ in the ordinary and fundamental situations of life. John saw Christ not in the temple, not in the synagogue but outside and in the ordinary life situation. We are admonished to LOOK and find Christ in our streets, market squares, shopping malls, traffic jams, workout places, workplaces, schools, friendships, marriages and families. Like Mary, when the angel departed from her, she reached out to her cousin Elizabeth to share the joy of the savior with her.

The angels who sang "Glory to God in the highest" on Christmas night have departed from us, let us reach out to the many "Elizabeths" in our world today and share the joy of our faith with them.

On this Word of God Sunday, we are called to reflect on the word of God like the remnants in the days of Ezra and Nehemiah. Men, women and children had access to the word of God set on a wooden pulpit and not in the Ark of the Covenant as in the book of Exodus. In the same way we also have access to the word of God both in soft and hard copies. Let us endeavor to make the word of God part of our lives in 2022, for his word is Spirit and Life. Scripture finds its fulfilment in Jesus who proclaims the Jubilee in his hometown of Nazareth. He declares; "these words have been fulfilled in your ears". Indeed, in Jesus, we find the Messiah who proclaims Economic, Political, Physical, Psychological, Emotional and Spiritual liberation.







LITURGY CORNER

Hearing Scripture

Imagine you're with a group of friends swapping stories about recent trips. But each of you brings a written copy for everyone else. When it's your turn, you don't tell the story while everyone listens. Instead, everybody pulls out your written account and reads along with you while you speak. Sound like fun? Sorry, that's not how we tell stories.

Listening is an art as rich as reading. We still do it in classrooms, seminars, phone conversations and the living room. Lively interaction between speaker and listener means the speaker proclaims ideas and the listener gives attention. In that low-tech communication, human beings connect.

The proclamation of Scripture recaptures the age-old art of speaking and listening. God's presence appears in the assembly as word. In actively listening to the Word of God, as we naturally do in conversation, we open our hearts to wonder. Technology has made the mass production of written materials more available now than ever. With little effort, Scripture readings can be placed in the hands of every worshiper. Advocates of this practice say it permits the worshiper to use sight, not just hearing. However, it's like having everyone read your trip story while you tell it. It can let the air out. The even requires both the proclamation of the reader and the eagerness of listeners. Hearing the word together bonds and expresses our community. If everyone reads the text silently, we become individuals again, with noses in our laps and faces turned down from one another.

We'll hear the Word of God with better attention if we prepare. Worshipers can read the texts prior to coming to Mass and pray over them throughout the week before. We may also discuss them with family and friends. Then our ears will be open to listen attentively to the Word of God. All eyes will be fixed on the one who reads. And our hearts will be joined as one body of believers. When the divine word resounds in our assembly-heads up! And listen.





FORMATION

Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, and before you were born, I consecrated you. – Jeremiah 1:5, CCC 2270

On January 22, 1973, the Supreme Court legalized abortion in the United States. Since then, more than 55 million babies have been aborted in America alone – over 1.1 billion documented worldwide. That equals two babies aborted every three seconds (statistics provided by Human Life Alliance).

This month in Family Formation, the Home Lessons focus on the Sanctity of Life, What Makes a Family, and Love. While these are some of the most controversial topics of our time, they are foundational to who we are – unique, unrepeatable beings, created by God to participate in a life of love with Him for all eternity.


