It is the day to shout Alleluia and "sing joyfully to the Lord" (Ps 95:1). It is Easter Sunday; the day we have been preparing for with fasting and prayer for the last 40 days has arrived. Easter Sunday is a glorious day. This year Easter and Easter week corresponds to Passo-

ver. Our Orthodox sisters and brothers will celebrate Easter next Sunday.

In the times of desolation and despair we experience in life we have hope because of Easter. When we feel the most oppressed by our sinfulness we have hope because of Easter. When we become disheartened by the way we treat each other or disrespect each other, we have hope because of Easter. In his infinite love and goodness God our Father sent his only Son, Jesus Christ, to save us and redeem us from all the sin and situations that beat us down. We give thanks and praise on this Easter day for our salvation and redemption.

This spring we are participating in Ignite campaign. LITURGY CORNER

EASTER OCTAVE

Easter Day is eight days long. Easter reigns as the most important feast in the liturgical year. One single day cannot contain it. One entire week cannot contain it. We celebrate Easter for a week and a day. The period is called the Octave of Easter.

Weekday Masses are celebrated "as Solemnities of the Lord" (Universal Norms on the Liturgy Year and the General Roman Calendar, 68). The only difference is that the Creed is not recited and there is no Second reading. We include the Glory to God in the Introductory Rites. The Easter Sequence may follow the Responsorial Psalm. Each Gospel tells one story of how the Risen Christ appeared to his disciples. Whenever the priest chooses the first Easter Preface or Eucharistic Prayer I, he includes words and phrase that call the weekday "Easter day." The dismissal dialogue at the end of the Mass concludes with two alleluias. The Liturgy treats each weekday of the octave as if it were Easter Sunday all over again.

In the early days of the Church, those who were baptized at Easter participated at the cathedral Eucharist every day for a week. Their joy was so full that they kept coming back for more. During this period, the bishop offered them daily catechesis on the sacraments of the church during his homily at the Masses of the Easter Octave.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults does not explicitly encourage the newly baptized to participate in the Eucharist during the Easter Octave, but the prayers still presume that they are there. The Mass prayers assigned to the priest this week make frequent references to these neophytes. The Easter Octave is a sign of the Church's joy. Christ is risen, and we repeat the good news again and again—eight days a week.

WEDDING MUSIC INFO MEETING





Pledge amounts are based, in large part, on your previous generosity toward the Diocese of Des Moines, your history of parish support and whether you participated in the planning study. The Stewardship


