

LITURGICAL CORNER

The Responsorial Psalm

We often call the Responsorial Psalm the "response" to the First Reading. That's true, but it's really "responsorial" since it has a responsory—a refrain that occurs with each verse.

The psalm is indeed a response or a comment on the First Reading. In Ordinary Time, the Gospel text we hear falls in the Bible somewhere between last Sunday's Gospel passage and next Sunday's Gospel. The first reading leaps from some place in the Old Testament because its theme resembles the Gospel. The psalm echoes the reading we just heard. It's sort of a grandchild to Sunday's Gospel.

In the Book of Psalms, very few psalms have a refrain (e.g., Psalms 46 & 67). But on Sundays we treat them all alike. We give them refrains, and we put them in the mouths of our assemblies, often changing them into first person.

The refrains that appear in the lectionary, incidentally, are part of the official texts of the Mass. The verses are drawn from another translation. Refrains do not always match the wording in the verses.

We have quite a bit of freedom with the psalm. Since psalms were written as songs, the church urges us to sing them at every Mass. But because some assemblies struggle with new music, they can learn one or a few psalms for a whole season. Although easier to sing, their rapport with the first reading may suffer.

If we substitute, it's important to replace the psalm with a psalm. It's really not supposed to be a popular hymn, or even a song with a refrain that's drawn from, say, one of the epistles.

The reason has to do with how Christians use psalms. Jesus, a good Jew, surely prayed them daily. Many passages of the New Testament quote the psalms to show their fulfillment in the life of Christ. And they have proven useful for prayer in virtually every culture and age of history.

We also have freedom to change the structure of the psalm. It doesn't have to be responsorial. We can sing it all together, like a hymn.

Listen carefully to the first reading and figure out its connection to the psalm. Then we can really pray the psalm while we sing.

SPOTLIGHT ON SAFETY



Ladder Safety—3 Ladder Safety Tips for Avoiding Falls

Here are three simple tips for working more safely with ladders. Follow each of them every time you work with a ladder.

1. Inspect the Ladder Before You Use It—Each Time You Use It

Begin by checking the ladder's duty rating to see if it can support the weight of your body and your tool belt. Then, inspect the ladder's fails, rugs, feet, and spreaders or rung locks for any signs of damage or defects. Never use a damaged ladder, and always remove a defective or damaged ladder from use and tag it "not safe for use." Be sure the damaged ladder is repaired or removed from service.

2. Position Your Ladder Properly

It's very important to position your ladder properly before using it. For all ladders, always make sure the ladder is on level, solid footing, and be sure to position the ladder near your work so that you're not over-reaching. For extension ladders, always obey the 4-1 rule, meaning set the base of the ladder one foot away from the base of the building for every four feet of height. In addition, tie off the ladder at the top and (when possible) at the bottom.

3. Use Your Ladder Safely

Seems sensible enough, but sometimes people forget, neglect, or don't know how to use a ladder safely to avoid injuries or deaths. Using your ladder safely includes things like:

- Maintaining three points of contact with the ladder at all times
- Never standing on either of the top two rungs of a stepladder
- Never stepping on any of the top four rungs of an extension ladder
- Having a partner hold and steady a ladder as you use the ladder to climb up and down. Never carrying tools and materials while climbing a ladder (instead, use a rope to haul or hoist materials).



Family Formation (Grades Preschool - Grade 5)

Family Formation is a family-based catechetical program that helps families grow in the transforming love of God by understanding and living the Catholic Faith. Families gather together in the parish once a month. Using the lessons provided, trained catechists teach the children in grade-level classrooms while parents attend an adult teaching on the same topic. Parents are then provided all the Home Lesson materials needed for the rest of the month to teach the Faith to their family.

Preparation for First Reconciliation & First Holy Communion (Typically 2nd grade)

The sacraments of Reconciliation and Holy Communion are typically celebrated the first time during the child's 2nd grade school year. Children prepare to receive the sacraments as registered students in the Family Formation program or through attendance at St. Francis of Assisi Catholic School.

Preparation for Confirmation (Typically 9th grade)

The sacrament of Confirmation is one of the sacraments of initiation, along with Baptism and Eucharist. At St. Francis, preparation for Confirmation typically occurs during the student's 9th grade year and the sacrament is received during the fall of their 10th grade year. Students will attend seven small group sessions in preparation and meeting times will be set by each small group with most starting in the fall. Students will attend a retreat and receive the sacrament of Confirmation in the fall of 2023.

Youth Ministry (Grades 6-12) Now includes 6th grade!

Youth Ministry is comprised of EDGE for 6-8th grade students and FISH for 9-12th grade students. Both programs are open to the youth of our parish who attend public, private, and home schools. In Youth Ministry, our youth can learn about their faith, find a Catholic community, and experience Jesus all while having fun and serving others.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd*

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) is a Montessori-based faith formation program for children ages 3-12. CGS takes place in specially prepared space called the Atrium. During Atrium time, the children are presented works of the atrium, after which they are invited to work with that presentation or any other presentation they have been presented. Prayer is essential to children, by working in concentration with these works of the atrium, children are able to enter into prayer more freely, unique to their individual needs. *Space is limited.
