

### **The Catechism and St. John Chrysostom on Prayer**

***"Prayer is the lifting up of the heart and mind to God."*** This simple, yet profound, definition is often attributed to St. Teresa of Avila. It also appears at the beginning of Part 4 of the CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH. Prayer is the first spiritual discipline to which Our Lord referred in THE SERMON ON THE MOUNT. It is also the first of the three pillars of Lenten observances.

The CATECHISM asks, ***"Where does prayer come from?"*** (n. 2562). It continues: ***"Whether prayer is expressed in words or gestures, it is the whole man who prays. ... Scripture speaks sometimes of the soul or the spirit, but most often of the heart (more than 1,000 times). According to Scripture, it is the heart that prays. If our heart is far from God, the words of prayer are in vain."*** (n. 2562).

Saint John Chrysostom, Archbishop of Constantinople, died in the early 5th century and was one of the greatest fathers, doctors, and preachers of the Early Church. What follows are some of his thoughts on prayer offered here to help you reflect on your own prayer during Lent.

***"Prayer and converse with God is a supreme good: it is a partnership and union with God. I do not mean the prayer of outward observance but prayer from the heart, not confined to fixed times or periods but continuous throughout the day and night."***

***"Prayer is the light of the spirit, true knowledge of God, mediating between God and man. The spirit, raised up to heaven by prayer, clings to God with the utmost tenderness; like a child crying tearfully for its mother. ... It seeks the satisfaction of its own desires and receives gifts outweighing the whole world of nature."***

***"The apostle Paul says: 'We do not know how we are to pray but the Spirit himself pleads for us with inexpressible longings.'"***

He tells us that prayer can have a transforming effect on the soul and in our daily lives. He said it is like decorating a house. ***"Paint your house with the colors of modesty and humility. Make it radiant with the light of justice. Decorate it with the finest gold leaf of good deeds. Adorn it with the walls and stones of faith and generosity. In this way you will make it a perfect dwelling place for the Lord. You will be able to receive him as in a splendid palace, and through his grace you will already possess him, his image enthroned in the temple of your spirit."***

Of course none of this is possible for one whose soul is in the state of mortal sin. That is why it is SO

important to receive that spiritual cleansing in sacramental confession. We all need to get more serious about improving our prayer life.

### **Pretzels & Lent**

Some say pretzels originated as a Lenten snack because it is shaped like arms crossed in prayer. One source says the word ***"pretzel"*** comes from: a Latin word meaning branched, with little arms. That makes the shape as well as the food itself right for Lent, a time of fasting and spiritual renewal. 

Another explanation says the word comes from a Latin word for ***"little reward"***. That's what the snack was called because of the legend of a 7<sup>th</sup> century monk who made them and gave them as little rewards to children for learning their prayers. The monk took a strip of bread dough that was left over, twisted it into the shape of arms folded in prayer and baked it as a nice pretzel.

### **The Sacrament That Could Save Your Soul ... Why are you Waiting???**

#### **1. Why do I have to confess my sins to a priest?**

That's the way Jesus set it up on Easter Sunday evening. He told his apostles that just as God the Father had sent him — and God the Father sent him to save us from our sins — so he was sending them. He breathed on them the power of the Holy Spirit, giving them God's power to forgive sins, since no one can forgive sins but God alone. He told them that whatever sins they forgive are forgiven and whatever sins they retain are retained (Jn 20:21-23; Mk 2:7).

Since the apostles were unable to read minds, the only way that they would know which to forgive and which to retain is if people told them their sins. Jesus thus established the essential structure of the sacrament of confession.

Just as he uses priests to give us his Body and Blood at Mass so he uses them to give us His mercy in Penance.

#### **2. What do I need to do to make a good confession?**

The sacrament consists of three actions on the part of the penitent:

**Contrition**, which is sorrow for one's sins;

**Confession**, that is examining one's conscience and telling one's sins to the priest;

**Penance**, namely a desire to make up for one's sins and amend one's life. Together the three are called the "acts of the penitent."

Together the three are called the "acts of the penitent." The **words of absolution** (forgiveness) are spoken by Jesus through His priest so the penitent knows with certainty, not just wishful thinking, that the sins have, indeed, been forgiven.
