

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK —MARCH 14, 2021

Welcome Back!

It has been nice to see that more and more people are coming back to Mass in person. You have been missed. Vaccinations continue to be given in great numbers and the rate of infections and hospitalizations continues to go down. It has been over two weeks since I had my second vaccination. It has puzzled me to observe that many young adults, who have the least worries, have stayed away while older folks have not been afraid. I'm hoping that no one had gotten so used to not being physically present in church that they forget to come back.

DO NOT GIVE IN TO FEAR! One of the most frequent statements made by Jesus in Scripture is "Be not afraid!" Sometimes that's easier said than done. But controlling our fear rather than letting it control us is what matters. When we're overcome by fear we make bad decisions. We lose hope and can easily drift away from God.

LAETARE SUNDAY

The Fourth Sunday of Lent is called "**Laetare Sunday.**" The word "**Laetare**" means "**Rejoice!**" It is taken from the first word of the Latin Introit (Entrance Antiphon). "**Rejoice Jerusalem; be glad for her all you who love her**" (Isaiah 66:10). It corresponds to the Third Sunday of Advent known as "**Gaudete Sunday.**" ("**Gaudete**" is a Latin word that also means "**Rejoice.**")

We are midway through Lent and are given a brief pause in the somberness of this penitential season. Rose vestments may be worn instead of purple or violet. Whereas the organ and other instruments are traditionally not played during Lent they are allowed on this day.

In the past it was on this day that Catechumens preparing for baptism at the Easter Vigil were introduced to the Creed, the last and decisive step before baptism.

This particular Sunday has also been called "**Rose Sunday.**" This name comes from the papal blessing of a golden rose, a symbol of spiritual joy. The floral spray was blessed by the pope and sent to some notable person or institution to acknowledge and honor special service or loyalty.

Joy is one of the fruits of the Holy Spirit ... the expectation of more than simply any "good." It is the expectation of union with the "Ultimate Good" and source of joy and that is GOD. This, of course, comes to us through Christ's Resurrection. We know that on earth this joy can only be partial but that it will be perfect for the Blessed in Heaven. This joy that Jesus gives can never be taken away.

What does sacramental confession do for a soul soiled by sin? Through the Prophet Isaiah God Himself tells us, "**Come now, let us set things right, ... though your sins be like scarlet, they may become white as snow; Though they be crimson red, they may become white as wool**" (1:18). Lent is the perfect time to give your soul a good spiritual power washing.

5. How do I examine my conscience well?

One does so by asking for God's help and prayerfully examining one's actions in the light of Christ's teaching and example.

Some review their behavior by the Ten Commandments, others by Christ's command to love God and love others, others by their correspondence to the beatitudes, others by comparing their behavior to the most important Christian virtues, and others by the seven "capital" sins (pride, envy, anger, sloth, greed, lust and gluttony).

It is not enough merely to focus on how one's broken God's "rules," but rather how one has damaged his relationship with God and others and hurt himself interiorly. It is also important to examine for sins of omission (the things we should have done but failed to do).

8. What are the qualities of a good confession?

A good confession is humble, sincere and complete. It's humble when we accuse ourselves of our sins with a deep sorrow for having offended the Lord while imploring his loving mercy.

It's sincere when we tell all of our sins honestly and truthfully, without exaggerating or excusing them.

It's complete when we confess all of our mortal sins, including the number of times we have committed each one.

9. What is sin and what sins need to be confessed in the Sacrament of Penance?

The Catechism says *sin is an offense against God that ruptures our communion with Him and with His Church* (CCC 1440). In Canon Law the Church says that *all grave or mortal sins must be confessed as soon as possible* (CIC 988).

10. What is a mortal sin?

A mortal sin involves an action whose object is grave matter that is committed with full knowledge and deliberate consent. "**Grave matter**" is generally understood to be something that violates the **Ten Commandments**. "**Full knowledge**" means that one is aware that God or the Church he founded considers the act sinful (even if one doesn't totally understand why it is sinful).

"**Deliberate consent**" means a consent sufficiently intentional to be a personal choice (CCC 1857-1859).

11. What are the consequences of a mortal sin?

According to the Catechism a mortal sin "**results in the loss of charity and the privation of sanctifying grace, that is, of the state of grace. If it is not redeemed by repentance and God's forgiveness, it causes exclusion from Christ's kingdom and the eternal death of hell, for our freedom has the power to make choices for ever, with no turning back**" (CCC 1861). This is why it is so important for mortal sins to be confessed to a priest as soon as possible.
