

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK —MARCH 21, 2021

Parents are the Primary Educators of Their Children.

This has always been the view of the Catholic Church, especially when it comes to formation in faith and morals. This was addressed very clearly in the **Constitution on the Church in the Modern World** (also known by its Latin title "*Lumen Gentium*" abbreviated "LG") by the Second Vatican Council and upheld by all successive Popes. **I think this is important to remember this in light of recent news about a draft of state health standards for Nebraska public schools. But more about that after a quick review of Church teaching.**

We must always remember that God Himself is the author of matrimony in the very creation of a man, Adam and a woman, Eve whom he commanded "*to be fruitful and multiply, to fill the earth and subdue it*" (see Genesis 1:28). Christian marriage is founded on the mutual consent of the couple to give themselves to one another in a lifelong, faithful union open to the gift of children.

LG stated, "*the institution of matrimony itself and conjugal love are ordained for the procreation and education of children, and find in them their ultimate crown.*" The document goes on to state that the sacrament of matrimony is "*a special sacrament by which husbands and wives are fortified and receive a kind of consecration in the duties and dignity of their state.*" Christian spouses are to help one another to grow in holiness and to form their children morally and spiritually.

LG states that parents are the primary educators of their children and that schools, whether parochial or public, merely assist them but not replace them when it comes to moral formation.

At issue in Nebraska is the proposed inclusion of certain patently immoral sex education topics in a 60-page draft of state health standards. I commend Governor Ricketts for saying that certain topics should be deleted. As reported in the Omaha World Herald on March 12, 2021 said, "*The standards ... would not only teach young children age-inappropriate content starting in kindergarten, but also inject non-scientific, political ideas into curriculum standards.*"

About these "standards" the World Herald reports that Kindergarteners would be taught about different kinds of family structures, including "cohabitating" and same-gender families. Fourth graders would be taught the difference between sex assigned at birth and gender identity. Fifth graders would be taught that people are not simply male and female but that gender expression and gender identity exist along a spectrum. Sixth graders would be taught that a person simply chooses to be heterosexual, bisexual, lesbian, gay, queer, etc.

It is important that Catholic voices be heard at the Nebraska Department of Education to prevent such child abuse. Vatican II clearly said, "*with parents leading the way by example and family prayer, children and indeed everyone gathered around the family hearth will find a readier path to human maturity, salvation and holiness*"

when such matters are best addressed and taught in the home by parents.

16. Should I go to confession if I haven't committed any sins since my last confession?

No, you should stay at home and wait for your canonization papers to arrive! Seriously, if it's been several weeks since your last confession, you have probably not examined your conscience very carefully. "*The just man,*" the Book of Proverbs tells us, "*falls seven times a day*" (Prov 24:16). If you're struggling to find matter to confess, examine your conscience on the 10 Commandments, on your sins of omission, on the seven capital sins or on **whether you in fact love the Lord with your whole heart, mind, soul and strength** (Lk 10:27).

18. How often do I need to confess?

The Church recommends that Catholics receive the Sacrament of Penance frequently. Strictly speaking, after they've reached the age of reason, Catholics are obliged to confess their serious sins at least once a year (CIC 989), **but the minimum should not be made a maximum.**

Catholics should come to confession as soon as possible after they've committed a mortal sin. If they're seeking to grow in holiness, **the regular practice of confession at least once a month is commended.**

19. What are the effects of the sacrament?

The Sacrament of Penance is a **spiritual resurrection bringing us to life again after we were dead through mortal sin** (Lk 15:24). It reconciles us with God in loving friendship and restores us to his grace. **It is normally followed by peace, joy, serenity and spiritual consolation.** The sacrament also reconciles us with the Church, repairing or restoring the damage our sins have done to our communion with others. The sinner also auspiciously anticipates the judgment that will come at the end of his life, choosing the path of life over the path of death (CCC 1468-1470).

FOOD FOR THOUGHT

Children stop their ears to keep from hearing bad news: an angry parent, an unwelcome order, an unpleasant prohibition. As adults, we sometimes stop the ears of our heart to keep from hearing God's voice, lest there too we hear bad news, only to discover that we have shut out the good news of his incredible love for us.
