Pontifical Good Friday Collection

Pope Francis has asked our parishes to support the Pontifical Good Friday Collection, which helps Christians in the Holy Land. Your support helps the Church minister in parishes, provide Catholic schools and offer religious education. The Pontifical Good Friday Collection also helps to preserve the sacred shrines.

The wars, unrest and instability have been especially hard on Christians. In these times of crisis, the Good Friday Collection provides humanitarian aid to refugees.

When you contribute to this collection you become an instrument of peace and join with Catholics around the world in solidarity with the Church in the Holy Land.

PLEASE BE GENEROUS!

The collection will be taken up at the liturgies on Good Friday. There is no special envelope. If you will not be able to be present on Good Friday and would like to make a donation, please put it in an ordinary envelope marked "**Holy Land Collection**" with the regular collection. Checks should be made to Holy Ghost or St. Stan's.

HOLY WEEK & THE PASCHAL TRIDUUM

The celebration of the Resurrection of the Lord on Easter is preceded by Holy Week beginning on Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord (as it is properly known). On this day the Church recalls the entrance of Christ the Lord into Jerusalem to accomplish his Paschal Mystery. As Jesus entered the holy city crowds hailed him as King of the Jews and cut branches from trees (palm and olive) waving them and placing them on the streets before him as he entered the city riding a donkey as had been foretold. The Liturgy begins with this joyful acclamation and switches dramatically as the scripture readings focus on His Passion, this year according to St. Mark.

The Paschal Triduum consists of the liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday beginning with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper. At the conclusion of Mass the Blessed Sacrament is taken in procession to a repository other than the main tabernacle reminding us that as Our Lord left the Upper Room he would not return there until Easter when he appeared to the apostles (minus Judas and Thomas).

Friday of the Passion of the Lord (Good Friday) is the ONLY day of the Church year when Mass is

not offered. We commemorate Our Lord's time in the tomb, meditate on His Passion (every year from the Gospel of St. John), and venerate the cross. It is a good day to spend in silence ... a real challenge for many people in this day and age.

Holy Saturday & the Easter Vigil: another day of silence and keeping vigil. The Blessing of Food will take place at Holy Ghost at 10 a.m. and St. Stan's at 1 p.m. The Easter Vigil, the holy night in which the Lord rose again is considered the "mother of all holy vigils" according to St. Augustine. The Church keeps watch awaiting the Resurrection of Christ and celebrates it in the sacraments. It begins after dark with the lighting of a new fire and the Paschal Candle representing Christ risen from the dead. As it is carried into the darkened church small candles receive their light from it and, gradually the space is filled with light. The Gloria will be sung for the first time since the last Sunday in Ordinary Time before Ash Wednesday. On this night and at all the Easter Masses all the faithful will renew the baptismal promises made for them by their parents and godparents as we take personal responsibility for professing and living our faith.

20. Can a priest reveal what he has heard to others?

No. A priest can never reveal the sins a person has confessed. This is known as the "**Seal of confession**," which admits of no exceptions (CCC 1467). If a priest were to violate the seal of confession he would be automatically excommunicated (CIC 1388).

Over the centuries several priests have died and many have been imprisoned because they refused, even under threat of torture and execution, to break the inviolable seal of confession. This is one of the most beautiful aspects of the sacrament and of the priesthood: the priest who hears our confession, in order to protect the secrets we have whispered to God through him, will allow himself to be imprisoned, tortured or even killed. That's how seriously he and the Church take the seal and the sacrament.

24. I'm reluctant to go to confession because I don't know the Act of Contrition by heart.

Confession is not meant to be a memory test. It is good when Catholics have memorized one of the many beautiful acts of contrition, which sum up all of the sentiments and resolutions a Catholic should have in coming to confession.

But if you do not know an Act of Contrition by memory, you can always express your sorrow and firm purpose of amendment in your own words, ask the priest to help you, or pray, "Jesus, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner who loves you!"

30. May I receive the sacrament if I'm divorced?

If you are civilly divorced but have not remarried or were validly married in the Church after receiving a declaration of nullity for your first marriage, then, yes, you may receive the Sacrament. If you have remarried outside of the Church or have entered into a cohabitating relationship, then those predicaments must be addressed before you can receive absolution.
