

**“The splendor of Christ, risen from the dead,
has shown on the people redeemed by His
Blood.”**

These words are prayed in the Morning Prayer of the Church every morning during the Octave of Easter to remind us of this glorious mystery, the central mystery of our faith. Today, Easter Sunday, we celebrate the glory of New Life in Christ enjoyed by all who are living in the state of grace (that is free from the stain of mortal sin).

Every priest dedicates his life to strive to bring the graces of Easter, the graces Christ won for mankind by dying on the Cross and rising from the dead, to those who would receive them. We are happy to do so.

Easter is a beautiful fifty-day season in the Church year to rejoice in the new life God has given through Christ.

Fr. Phil and I are happy to be able to serve all of you at Holy Ghost and St. Stanislaus and pray that you may be blessed by the beauty of God’s love this Easter that you might come to attain, one day, the glories of eternal life. We thank you for remembering us with your prayers and other acts of kindness, especially during Holy Week.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF EASTER

Easter is the celebration of Christ’s resurrection, the culmination of Christ’s mission and the foundation of our faith. Easter is also the oldest Christian holiday, one that Pope Leo I regarded as the greatest feast of the liturgical year. As St. Paul wrote, **“If Christ has not been raised, then your faith has been in vain”** (I Cor 15:14).

St. Bede suggests the word **Easter** could be related to **Estre**, an ancient goddess of spring. The more common term for Easter was the Latin **“Pasch”** or Passover. Easter was the **Festa Paschalia** (Paschal Feast) a name that is plural because Easter is not just a one-day event but includes seven more days of celebration (called the Easter octave). The Church celebrates each day in the octave exactly the same as the Day itself. The name **Easter** is also related to the German word for east, **ostern**, where the sun rises. So the associations of light from the rising sun and the new life of spring naturally carry over to our celebration of new life through Christ risen in glory.

The fixing of the date of Easter was complex and somewhat controversial. The Council of Nicaea in AD 325 determined that Easter is to be celebrated on the first Sunday following the first full moon that occurs on or after the spring (vernal) equinox on March 20. (This explains why some years it is early and other years it is late. It all depends on the cycle of the moon.)

This bulletin is being submitted the morning that these final dinners take place but I want to make sure to offer my personal thanks to the dedicated volunteers who made them possible. It takes a lot planning and the sacrifice of time, energy and personal comfort to make these things happen. The challenge was even greater this year as everything had to be done on a “take out” basis. You not only provided great meals and we look forward to the opportunity, which we hope will be soon, for people to come together and share time together. It is my hope that your labor of love will reap a harvest of making some projects around our parishes possible that otherwise couldn’t happen.

Payroll Protection Plan Loans:

The pandemic, in which we have been immersed for the past year, has exacted a toll on the income of most businesses and churches and social service organizations in our country. Late last spring the government authorized the Payroll Protection Program for businesses and churches to apply for loans that might later be forgiven to help with utility and payroll expenses.

I devoted a great deal of time and energy to wade through the process and secured loans in May, 2020 for both parishes: \$30,455 for Holy Ghost and \$23,070 for St. Stanislaus. (The difference in the amounts is because there are more employees at HG.) I saw this as needed because we were not able to conduct our extra fund raising activities (Game On, Polish Festival, Fish Frys, Pasta Dinners, June Jamboree, etc.) as well as the drop-off in Sunday collections which still have not recovered fully.

A second round of the PPP was authorized earlier this year, and again I went through the application process for both parishes. I have already received authorization for St. Stanislaus and am waiting on the application for Holy Ghost to be processed.

I have done my part and now I ask you to do yours. What do I mean by that? Many? Most? of you have probably received a government stimulus check for \$1,400 from the federal government. Some have authentic needs; others don’t. If you find you really don’t need this money for regular expenses I ask you to prayerfully consider to give what you can to your parish. Believe me, God will reward you.

Divine Mercy Sunday – 2nd Sunday of Easter will be celebrated next Sunday. In a decree dated August 3, 2002, the Apostolic Penitentiary announced that in order *“to ensure that the faithful would observe this day (Divine Mercy Sunday) with intense devotion, the Supreme Pontiff himself established that this Sunday be enriched by a plenary indulgence...so that the faithful might receive in great abundance the gift of the consolation of the Holy Spirit. In this way, they can foster a growing love for God and for their neighbor, and after they have obtained God’s pardon, they in turn might be persuaded to show a prompt pardon to their brothers and sisters.”* The plenary indulgence is granted (under the usual conditions of a sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and a prayer for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff) to the faithful who, on Divine Mercy Sunday, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even a venial sin, recite the *Our Father and the Creed, and also adding a devout prayer (e.g. Merciful Jesus, I trust in you!)*. *Fr.
