



THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION

Eight candidates (1 adult and 7 - 8th grade students) will receive this sacrament today.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states:

"Baptism, the Eucharist, and the sacrament of Confirmation together constitute the "sacraments of Christian initiation," whose unity must be safeguarded. It must be explained to the faithful that the reception of the sacrament of Confirmation is necessary for the completion of baptismal grace. For "by the sacrament of Confirmation, [the baptized] are more perfectly bound to the Church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit. Hence they are, as true witnesses of Christ, more strictly obliged to spread and defend the faith by word and deed."

There is an **outward sign** for every sacrament: a combination of words, actions and sometimes the use of a physical substance (e.g. water, wine, bread, holy oil). The outward sign is also an effective sign. We perceive the **outward sign** through our senses so it **shows us what Christ is doing for us**; as an **effective sign** it brings about interiorly what it shows us. **The outward sign for Confirmation is twofold: the imposition of hands and the anointing with the oil of chrism while the "effective words" are pronounced.**

From apostolic times the laying on of hands on the newly baptized signified the gift of the Spirit that completes the grace of Baptism. In the CATECHISM we read, *"For this reason in the Letter to the Hebrews the doctrine concerning Baptism and the laying on of hands is listed among the first elements of Christian instruction. The imposition of hands is rightly recognized by the Catholic tradition as the origin of the sacrament of Confirmation, which in a certain way perpetuates the grace of Pentecost in the Church."*

Very early in the history of the Church an anointing with perfumed holy oil called chrism was added to the laying on of hands to more clearly signify the gift of the

Holy Spirit. The CATECHISM tells us, *"This anointing highlights the name 'Christian,' which means 'anointed' and derives from that of Christ himself whom God 'anointed with the Holy Spirit.'"* The oil being used today was blessed by Archbishop Lucas on Monday of Holy Week.

Confirmation both confirms baptism and strengthens baptismal grace. Like baptism and holy orders confirmation imparts a **"permanent seal"** or **"indelible mark"** on the soul of the recipient. I like to say it's a **"tattoo on the soul"** that can never be erased.

A bishop normally administers the sacrament to those baptized as infants. A priest may normally confirm in limited circumstances such as when an adult is baptized or received into full communion with the Church or when someone is in danger of death. A bishop may give permission for a priest to administer the sacrament in other circumstances. Archbishop Lucas is finding it more difficult to administer the sacrament in the 140 parishes in the Archdiocese. I will be confirming our candidates today.

CHANGES WILL BE COMING (GRADUALLY)

In 2019, anticipating the net loss of at least 30 priests over the next decade due to retirements, the Archdiocese began to develop a plan to "cluster" parishes to conserve resources and provide pastoral services with a shrinking number of clergy. The plan has already been implemented in rural parishes and is gradually being implemented in the metropolitan area. Implementation depends on when pastors retire or when their 6-year appointments expire.

The plan calls for the clustering of Holy Ghost and St. Bernadette. The plan for St. Stanislaus has not yet been fully determined. Fr. Harry Buse, pastor at St. Bernadette is retiring at the end of June this year. I plan to retire in 2023. Fr. Jeffrey Mollner, currently serving parishes in Wayne, Laurel and Dixon, NE will take over at St. Bernadette on July 1. I will remain as pastor of both HG and St. S. for the next two years when Fr. Mollner will take over Holy Ghost.

Clustering involves the sharing of and consolidation of programs. For example: having one RCIA program instead of 2 or 3. We have had a shared Parish Religious Education Program for HG and St. S. for a number of years. Fr. Buse and I and our two Directors of Religious Education are in the process of developing a plan for the merging of our two programs into one joint program this fall. Both directors will work together to assure a smooth transition. I will work with Fr. Mollner as well to try to assure a smooth transition for him when he eventually takes over both parishes. Stay tuned for more information as it becomes available.

HOLY GHOST AND ST. STANISLAUS NEWS

The End of the Dispensation from the Sunday Obligation to Attend Mass Announced: On March 30, Archbishop Lucas, after conferring with the bishops of Lincoln and Grand Island, announced that he is ending the general dispensation from the obligation to participate in Sunday Mass, effective the weekend of Pentecost, May 22-23, 2021, in the Archdiocese of Omaha.

In his statement he noted that many parishes (like ours at Holy Ghost/St. Stan's) have experienced an increase in weekend Mass attendance recently. As more people are vaccinated we expect that to continue.

I am confident that our two buildings are large enough to comfortably accommodate the number of people who were coming to Mass before the shut-down. I don't think that number will grow significantly. I don't anticipate the need for any occupancy restrictions. We continue to make an effort to keep everything as clean as we can.

Drawing from the Letter "**Dies Domini**" ("**The Day of the Lord**") authored by Pope St. John Paul II, Archbishop Lucas goes on to say, "*While the responsibility to participate in Sunday Mass rests with each of us, there are persons who may consider themselves excused under certain circumstances. Those who are prevented from attending due to advanced age, sickness, disability or some other serious reason are excused. For the foreseeable future, those who feel they are at heightened risk of contracting or communicating COVID-19 are excused*".

I have been edified seeing many of our older senior citizens gradually returning. I look for the day when we will all be reunited again in person, in song and in prayer.

Archbishop Lucas said, "**The coming weeks provide an opportunity for us to respond again to the invitation of Jesus to come to Him. This is also an opportunity for each of us to share the invitation of Jesus with family members and neighbors.**"

We will endeavor to communicate any other new information, either from the Archdiocese or the parish, as we move to the feast of Pentecost with hope.
