

The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass – Part 1

Some people complain that the Mass is boring or that they don't get much out of it. This could be true for a number of reasons: failure to pay much attention; too many external (or internal) distractions while at Mass and the like. But the most likely reason is that they really don't understand the deeper meaning of what the Mass IS. **The Mass is a sacrifice – the renewal of the sacrifice on Calvary.** First we need a little background.

What is a SACRIFICE?

A sacrifice is a special kind of gift-offering to God, our Creator. In everyday life we give gifts at Christmas, birthdays, etc. to those we love and respect as a sign of our love. It helps us strengthen our relationship. Since ancient times people have sought to make offerings to God. Pagans offered human sacrifice to false "gods" to win their favor or calm storms or turn aside other calamities.

Others who acknowledged the true God sought to honor him as creator and giver of all things.

How was this done?

Somehow the gift, which is seen, must be transferred to God who is invisible. God was represented by the altar upon which the gift was placed: animals or produce from the fields. The "gift" had to be destroyed to show that it no longer belonged to the giver, that it was "given" to God. This was most commonly done through the burnt offering or holocaust. In the Jewish religion this was usually done by the Levites, the priestly class, as most felt themselves to be unworthy to do it themselves.

The exterior sacrifice is meant to be symbolic of the interior sacrifice. Without an interior sacrifice the exterior sacrifice is meaningless. In everyday language we speak of *making sacrifices* for others or for a special cause. Spouses make sacrifices for one another; parents for children. We give of our time, our luxuries our energy for another **out of love.**

What are the purposes of sacrifice?

Sacrifices made to God are to **adore Him, to thank Him, in petition for favors sought from Him, to make reparation or atonement.**

Sacrifice in the Old Testament

God gave Moses detailed instructions on sacrificial offerings as told in the Book of Leviticus. The High Priest offered morning and evening unbloody sacrifices of incense, flour, oil and frankincense in the morning and evening. Then he offered a bloody sacrifice of a lamb. On the Sabbath, two lambs, with bread and wine were offered as well.

On solemn feasts, such as Passover, Pentecost, Rosh Hashanah (the Day of Atonement), the Jews sacrificed hundreds of animals. Among the Jews there were different ranks or orders of priests, as the high-priestly class, the priests and the Levites. These ranks prefigured the three levels of Holy Orders: Bishop, Priest, Deacon.

Jewish sacrifices of the Old Testament prefigured the Sacrifice of Christ on Calvary and ceased with the destruction of Jerusalem in 70 A.D. and the passing of the Old Law.

Christ established a New Covenant on Mount Calvary in the ONE, TRUE Sacrifice. He was Himself the priest who offered Himself as Victim in reparation for the sins of all time. The Cross was the altar upon which the sacrifice was offered.

In the Letter to the Hebrews there is a beautiful reflection on the Priesthood of Jesus Christ: that He is the Faithful and Compassionate High Priest; that His Priesthood and Sacrifice are Eternal.

* * * * *

"But when Christ came as high priest of the good things that have come to be - passing through the greater and more perfect tabernacle not made by hands, he entered once for all into the sanctuary, not with the blood of goats and calves but with his own blood, thus obtaining eternal redemption.

For if the blood of goats and bulls and the sprinkling of a heifer's ashes - can sanctify those who are defiled so that their flesh is cleansed, how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal spirit - offered himself unblemished to God, cleanse our consciences from dead works to worship the living God.

For this reason he is mediator of a new covenant: since a death has taken place for deliverance from transgressions under the first covenant, those who are called may receive the promised eternal inheritance." (Hebrews 9:11-15)

2 New Doors for St. Stanislaus

The north and south doors on the east end of the church will soon be replaced with new insulated doors that will replicate the original ones. (I think they were made of wood and had deteriorated over time.) They will be painted to match the other doors on the east end but will have a wood-grain texture embossed on the surface with windows with diamond-paned glass similar to the front doors. They are being donated in memory of Christine Lessing Stavneak Chuck Bogus.

The End of the Dispensation from the Sunday Obligation to Attend Mass Announced: On March 30, Archbishop Lucas, after conferring with the bishops of Lincoln and Grand Island, announced that he is ending the general dispensation from the obligation to participate in Sunday Mass, effective the weekend of Pentecost, May 22-23, 2021, in the Archdiocese of Omaha.

In his statement he noted that many parishes (like ours at Holy Ghost/St. Stan's) have experienced an increase in weekend Mass attendance recently. As more people are vaccinated we expect that to continue.

I am confident that our two buildings are large enough to comfortably accommodate the number of people who were coming to Mass before the shut-down. I don't think that number will grow significantly. I don't anticipate the need for any occupancy restrictions. We continue to make an effort to keep everything as clean as we can.

Drawing from the Letter "**Dies Domini**" ("**The Day of the Lord**") authored by Pope St. John Paul II, Archbishop Lucas goes on to say, "While the responsibility to participate in Sunday Mass rests with each of us, there are persons who may consider themselves excused under certain circumstances. Those who are prevented from attending due to advanced age, sickness, disability or some other serious reason are excused. For the foreseeable future, those who feel they are at heightened risk of contracting or communicating COVID-19 are excused".

I have been edified seeing many of our older senior citizens gradually returning. I look for the day when we will all be reunited again in person, in song and in prayer.

Archbishop Lucas said, "**The coming weeks provide an opportunity for us to respond again to the invitation of Jesus to come to Him. This is also an opportunity for each of us to share the invitation of Jesus with family members and neighbors.**"

We will endeavor to communicate any other new information, either from the Archdiocese or the parish, as we move to the feast of Pentecost with hope.
