

The Solemnity of the Ascension of Our Lord into Heaven

In the Creed we say of Jesus, *“He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.”* In the Gospel of St. Mark we read, *“So then the Lord Jesus, after he had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven, and sat down at the right hand of God”*(16:19). St. Luke makes a similar reference (24:50-51).

On Easter morning Our Lord, appearing to St. Mary Magdalene said, mysterious words to Mary Magdalene: *“I have not yet ascended to the Father; but go to my brethren and say to them, I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God”* (John 20:17).

According to Scripture this event took place on the 40th day after the Resurrection. The 40th day after Easter falls on a Thursday each year but the date changes according to the date of Easter. This year it falls on May 13.

In a very real way, Jesus’ ascension into heaven is the goal for each one of us. He goes before us, and we are to follow Him there. In the Ascension, the domain of God’s glory is opened to us, and Jesus, in His glorified humanity, takes His rightful place at God’s right hand. It is a privilege for all of us that one of our own, a man like us in all things but sin, has been so glorified. This mystery is also commemorated in the Second Glorious Mystery of the rosary.

There will be Mass at St. Stan’s on Wed., May 12 at 5:30pm and on Thurs., May 13 at 7 am at Holy Ghost, 8am at St. Stan’s and 6:30pm at Holy Ghost.

MAY IS MARY’S MONTH! Pope Paul VI wrote and encyclical letter in which he described the month of May as the *“month which the piety of the faithful has especially dedicated to Our Blessed Lady,”* and it is the occasion for a *“moving tribute of faith and love which Catholics in every part of the world [pay] to the Queen of Heaven. During this month Christians, both in church and in the privacy of the home, offer up to Mary from their hearts an especially fervent and loving homage of prayer and veneration. In this month, too, the benefits of God’s mercy come down to us from her throne in greater abundance.”*

This Christian custom of dedicating the month of May to the Blessed Virgin arose at the end of the 13th century. In this way, the Church was able to Christianize the secular feasts which took place at that time. In the 16th century, books appeared and fostered this devotion.

The practice became especially popular among the members of the Jesuit Order — by 1700 it took hold among their students at the Roman College and a bit later it was publicly practiced in the Gesu Church in Rome. From there it spread to the whole Church.

These practices have been recommended by various popes and are offered as suggestions for honoring Our Lady during Her month. **Pray the Regina Coeli** (Queen of Heaven).

The Rosary is one of the most excellent prayers to the Mother of God. *“The Roman Pontiffs have repeatedly exhorted the faithful to the frequent recitation of this biblically inspired prayer which is centered on contemplation of the salvific events of Christ’s life, and their close association with the Virgin Mother.”*

Litanies of the Blessed Virgin Mary: These consist of a long series of invocations to Our Lady, which follow in a uniform rhythm, thereby creating a stream of prayer characterized by insistent praise and supplication while reminding of her various titles.

Consecration and Entrustment to Mary: The Popes have frequently expressed appreciation for the pious practice of “consecration to the Blessed Virgin Mary” and the formulas publicly used by them are well known.

St. Louis de Montfort is one of the great masters of the spirituality underlying the act of “consecration to Mary”. He “proposed to the faithful consecration to Jesus through Mary, as an effective way of living out their baptismal commitment.”

Mass Schedule During My Recovery

What will the Mass schedule be like while I am laid up after my surgery? Weekend Mass times will probably remain the same as usual. Daily Masses will alternate with Communion Services the same way we handle that when either Fr. Phil or I are gone. One week Mass will be M-W-F at HG and T-Th at St. Stan’s; the next week M-W-F- at St. Stan’s and T-Th at HG.

My surgeon says I will need 4 weeks for recovery. After my first surgery I was back offering Mass on the 10th day. I started driving on the 11th day. We’ll see what develops this time.
