

PENTECOST AND THE GIFTS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT



Today we celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles on the 50th day after Our Lord rose from the dead. This stirring account appears in Chapter 2 of the Acts of the Apostles: ***“When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim” (2:1-4).*** The Apostles then went out into the streets of Jerusalem to proclaim Jesus, risen from the dead. They were utilizing the 7 gifts they had received.

When we receive the sacrament of Confirmation we can say it is our personal Pentecost. **The Catechism of the Catholic Church states:**

The Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit are Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Fortitude, Knowledge, Piety, and Fear of the Lord. They belong in their fullness to Christ, Son of David. They complete and perfect the virtues of those who receive them. They make the faithful docile in readily obeying divine inspirations. (CCC, 1831)

These traits are infused into every Christian as a permanent endowment at his baptism, nurtured by the practice of the seven virtues, and sealed in the sacrament of confirmation. We are thus enabled to do what the Apostles did.

Before becoming a priest, St. John Paul II was formed in the faith by his father (Karol, Sr.) at home. Looking back, John Paul II would call this time of his life ***“the first home seminary.”***

Among the many things his dad taught him was a **special prayer to the Holy Spirit**.

Author Jason Evert reveals this prayer in his book ***Saint John Paul The Great: His Five Loves***.

Karol, Sr., gave him a prayer book on the Holy Spirit, which he used throughout his life, and also taught him the following prayer and instructed him to recite it daily. It is duplicated here for your use.

Holy Spirit, I ask you for the gift of Wisdom to better know You and Your divine perfections, for the gift of Understanding to clearly discern the spirit of the mysteries of the holy faith, for the gift of Counsel that I may live according to the principles of this faith, for the gift of Knowledge that I may look for counsel in You and that I may always find it in You, for the gift of Fortitude that no fear or earthly preoccupations would ever separate me from You, for the gift of Piety that I may always serve Your Majesty with a filial love, for the gift of the Fear of the Lord that I may dread sin, which offends You, O my God. Amen.

Later on John Paul II would go so far as to attest that this prayer **appeared a half century later in his encyclical on the Holy Spirit, DOMINUM et VIVIFICANTUM**. If you are looking for an inspiring daily prayer, try the one John Paul II prayed every day!

Modesty in Dress at Mass (Part 2) - Excerpts from Pastoral Letter of Bishop John Yanta, Retired Bishop of San Antonio, Texas:

The four cardinal virtues are in play here (Wisdom 8:5-7). The wise person is guided by wisdom, the highest of riches that guides us to be prudent (doing and saying the right thing), justice (respects the dignity of other persons), fortitude (courage to go against popular, suggestive, provocative styles), and temperance (insures mastery over sensual temptations as occasions of sin). You can read more about these four cardinal virtues that play a pivotal role in our lives (CCC 1803-1809).

The road to modesty starts with the purification of the heart: ***“Out of the heart come evil thoughts, murder, adultery, fornication...”*** (Matthew 15:19). Bible beginners should be encouraged to get the basic overview of Jesus’ teaching by starting with the beatitudes in Matt. 5 in Jesus’ first sermon: ***“Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God”*** (Matt. 5:8). Part of the essence of that teaching is a wholesome, orthodox, first hand appreciation of God’s plan for our sexuality - its sacredness, its fulfillment in marriage, its place in family, Church, and world.

The Catechism speaks next, after the purification of the heart, about ***“the battle for purity”***. We, the baptized and the forgiven in the Sacrament of Penance/Reconciliation struggle against concupiscence of the flesh and disordered desires (CCC 2520).

Yes, we can help the devil in many ways including the way we dress. In the Act of Contrition we promise ***“to avoid the near occasion of sin”***. St. Paul writes about ***“provoking another”*** (Gal. 5:26).

When the community of believers comes together for the Eucharist (Mass) let no one be a distraction from Jesus or provide temptation (an occasion of sin) to another because of our manner of dress.

Lectors, Extraordinary Eucharistic Ministers, and Hospitality Ministers should model modesty of dress for the parish as parents do in the family, the domestic church.

May we cherish and bear witness to the virtues of prudence, temperance, chastity, and modesty for the sake of our own salvation and of others. St. Mary and St. Joseph, St. Ann and St. Joachim, parents and grandparents of their son and grandson, Jesus, intercede for us!
