

“Corpus Christi” Sunday

(The Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ)

Corpus Christi (literally “the Body of Christ” in Latin) is the traditional name for today’s solemnity of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. It is one of the 10 solemnities on the universal Church calendar. The traditional date for the celebration is on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday (last Sunday in case you forgot). However, it is a solemnity that is transferable to the nearest Sunday as it is in the United States. (It’s rather like Epiphany. Technically Epiphany is celebrated on January 6, the 12th day of Christmas, but in our country it is transferred to a Sunday.)

Although the Eucharist was instituted on Holy Thursday, the Liturgy that day focuses more on the upcoming betrayal of Jesus by Judas and Jesus’ washing the feet of the apostles, giving them an example of humble service. Some centuries ago this feast developed to allow the faithful to contemplate more deeply the meaning of the gift of the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist and has traditionally accompanied by processions outdoors with the Blessed Sacrament in the monstrance culminating with Benediction. It is heartening to see the reemergence of such public processions. (Every year on this day there is a beautiful procession between Our Lady of Lourdes and St. Peter’s.)

The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us that, *“in the most Blessed Sacrament of the Eucharist ‘the body and blood, together with the soul and divinity, of our Lord Jesus Christ and, therefore the whole Christ is truly, really and substantially contained’”* (Catechism, 1374).

If we don’t believe the Eucharist is the Body and Blood of Jesus, Who is God, then we shouldn’t trust the Church, which has always taught this. If we don’t trust the Church, we have little reason to believe the Bible, for the Bible was compiled, established, and interpreted by the Church. If we don’t believe in the Eucharist, the Church and her Bible, then we have no objective basis

for believing in Christianity. We then exist in a subjective, new-age confusion or in the empty hopelessness of agnosticism. Instead, we must believe that the Eucharist is the Body and Blood of the Son of God or we cannot rightly claim to be Catholic.

The Eucharist is the Heart of the Church

On November 8, 2017, Pope Francis began a new series of catechesis, wherein he described the Eucharist as the “heart” of the Church. The Holy Father proclaimed. *“It’s essential for us Christians to understand well the value and meaning of the Holy Mass, to live ever more fully our relationship with God.”*

As Catholics we must believe with ALL of our hearts, minds, and souls that at every Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, the validly ordained priest changes bread and wine into the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ, in what is defined as *‘Transubstantiation.’* This is a true MIRACLE that has been done “in remembrance” of Christ since He instituted the Mass at the Last Supper on Holy Thursday. This belief is under attack today.

Sadly, there seems to be many in the last fifty years of Church history who demonstrate by their mannerisms and their manner of dress in the presence of the Eucharistic Lord that they do not believe in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist.

Protestants broke away from the Catholic Church in the 1500s do not have the Eucharist because they do not have validly ordained priests who have been ordained by validly ordained bishops. **Their bread and wine remain just bread and wine no matter what words that their ministers pronounce.** When Protestant groups separated from the Catholic Church they lost the fullness of the One True Faith founded by Christ and, no matter how sincere they may be, they do NOT have the Most Blessed Sacrament.

We Catholics understand Chapter 6 of St. John's Gospel literally: ***"Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him"*** (JN 6:54-56).

We must never forget what a great privilege it is to receive the Very Body and Blood of Our Lord and strive to NEVER receive in the state of mortal sin and thus be guilty of the sin of sacrilege.
