

THOUGHTS ABOUT MY BACK SURGERY

By the time you read this my spinal fusion will have taken place already a few days ago. I am writing this before it takes place to make the deadline for the bulletin publication. I wish I were already looking back at it in the rearview mirror as the saying goes. I wish it could have been done months ago, even a year ago.

In the weeks leading up to this I have heard the assurances of so many prayers being offered and to be offered on my behalf for a successful operation and a full and speedy recovery. I'm for all of that too.

Farther back I was told that my hospital stay would be 4 days; but at my recent meeting with the surgeon he told me that it could range from 3 to 5 days. I'm hoping for three. I anticipate that my recovery will be more challenging and longer than it was after the first surgery three years ago.

I expect to experience a greater and more prolonged amount of pain and discomfort than I did the first time as this operation will be of a longer duration and more complicated as three vertebrae will be linked together rather than two.

In the wake of his attempted assassination St. John Paul wrote an Apostolic Letter "*Salvifici Dolores*" ("*On the Christian Meaning of Human Suffering*"), February 11, 1984. He quoted St. Paul's reference to the saving power of human suffering in Colossians 1:24, "*Now I rejoice in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I am filling up what is lacking in the afflictions of Christ on behalf of his body, which is the church.*" Paul's discovery of the power of his suffering united with Christ's brought him joy as it should for any Christian.

Our Lord drew close to the world of human suffering throughout his life. During his public ministry, he experienced not only fatigue, homelessness, and misunderstanding but other forms of suffering as well. The most intense sufferings were in his last hours: his betrayal by Judas, Peter's denials, the desertion of all the apostles but John; the crowning with thorns and scourging at the pillar, the mockery of the soldiers and others in the crowd on the way to Calvary; the abasement of being stripped of his garments and being nailed for three hours on the cross.

Our Lord spoke on numerous occasions (see for example Matthew 16:24 and Luke 9:23) about the conditions of discipleship meaning daily self-renunciation and taking up the cross to follow him.

Our personal sufferings can have meaning and value when offered to our Heavenly Father in union with the sufferings of Jesus. I look forward to the opportunity to make many such offerings for various reasons such as: in reparation for sin, for the souls of the departed, for healing for others in need, for special conversions and the like.

I look forward to it as a great invitation and opportunity.

The Year of St. Joseph & Father's Day

"Who, then, is the faithful and prudent servant, whom the master has put in charge of his household?"
(Matthew 24:45)

St. Joseph, because of his many virtues, is held up as the model for all fathers to strive to imitate. Though Jesus was not his biological son, St. Joseph exercised real fatherhood over the Lord. Mary, according to St. Luke (2:48), when the boy Jesus was found after being "lost" for three days, said, "*Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety.*"

Consider these thoughts of St. John Paul II

"The Church deeply venerates [the Holy] Family, and proposes it as the model of all families. Inserted directly in the mystery of the Incarnation, the Family of Nazareth has its own special mystery. And in this mystery, as in the Incarnation, one finds a true fatherhood: the human form of the family of the Son of God, a true human family, formed by the divine mystery. In this family, Joseph is the father: his fatherhood is not one that derives from begetting offspring; but neither is it an apparent or merely substitute fatherhood. Rather, it is one that fully shares in authentic human fatherhood and the mission of a father in the family."

"From the beginning, Joseph accepted with the obedience of faith his human fatherhood over Jesus. And thus, following the light of the Holy Spirit who gives himself to human beings through faith, he certainly came to discover ever more fully the indescribable gift that was his human fatherhood."

St. Joseph was chosen by God the Father to represent him as head of the Holy Family. All fathers are called by God to represent Him to their wives and children. Whereas scripture tells us that the Angel Gabriel spoke directly to Mary to communicate God's will, God spoke to St. Joseph in dreams. He always listened and then carried out what God wanted of him. Christian fathers are likewise called to listen attentively to God speaking in their lives and to be willing to carry out their duties.

At the beginning of this **Year of St. Joseph** Pope Francis issued a beautiful Apostolic Letter "**PATRIS CORDAE**" ("*With a Father's Heart*"), a work divided in seven sections. Each section focuses on qualities of St. Joseph every father should strive to cultivate in his own life. He should strive to be: 1.) A beloved father. 2.) A tender and loving father. 3.) An obedient father. 4.) An accepting father. 5.) A creatively courageous father. 6.) A working father (pursuing an honest living to provide for the family). 7.) A father in the shadows (Here Pope Francis says, "*Being a father entails introducing children to life and reality. Not holding them back, being overprotective or possessive, but rather making them capable of deciding for themselves, enjoying freedom and exploring new possibilities*").
