

# What's the Difference Between "Fear of the Lord" and Being Afraid of God?

For the past couple of weeks a segment of my weekly column has focused on the unfortunate situation that many people have abandoned Sacramental Confession because they are afraid of God. But we must not confuse that with "Fear of the Lord" which is one of the 7 Gifts of the Holy Spirit.

In the Book of Proverbs we read, "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge" (1:7). A footnote in the New American Bible reads, "Fear of the Lord: reverential fear and respect for God on account of His sovereignty, goodness and justice toward men." In Proverbs we also read, "The beginning of wisdom is the fear of the Lord" (9:10). A similar sentiment is expressed in Job 28:28 and Psalm 111:10. In the Book of Sirach we read: "Fear of the Lord is glory and splendor" (1:9) and "Fear of the Lord warms the heart, giving gladness and joy and length of days" (1:10) and "He who fears the Lord will have a happy end" (1:11).

The **CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH** says FEAR OF THE LORD is one of the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit which ensures our awe and reverence before God. In its purest state "Fear of the Lord" finds its motivation in fear of offending God whereas "servile fear" is a fear of being punished. But we must never forget that the object of the love of the Lord is divine goodness and that "perfect love casts out fear" (1 John 4:18).

St. Hilary of Portiers (AD 310 – 368) (not to be confused with St. Hilary of Rodham) had this to say about Fear of the Lord: "Fear is not to be taken in the sense that common usage gives it. Fear in this ordinary sense is the trepidation our weak humanity feels when it is afraid of suffering something it does not want to happen. We are afraid, or are made afraid, because of a guilty conscience, ... an attack from one who is stronger sickness, encountering a wild beast, suffering evil in any form. This kind of fear is not taught.

The Fear of the lord has to be learned because it can be taught. It does not lie in terror, but in something that can be taught. It has to be acquired by obedience to the commandments, by holiness of life and by knowledge of the truth.

For us the fear of God consists wholly in love, and perfect love of God brings our fear of Him to its

perfection. Our love for God [means] to observe His counsels, to obey His laws, to trust His promises.

Remember what the Catechism says:

"Man, tempted by the devil, let his trust in his Creator die in his heart and, abusing his freedom, disobeyed God's command. This is what man's first sin consisted of. All Subsequent sin would be disobedience toward God and lack of trust in his goodness"(n. 392).

And Scripture says, "Blessed are those who fear the Lord and walk in His ways!" (Psalm 128:1) So if you haven't been to confession for years ask, in prayer, that the gift of the Fear of the Lord you received in Confirmation be brought to perfection within you to help you to conquer being afraid of God so you can be reconciled.
