KNOW IT: Being still, listening, and being willing to talk to God as a friend **PRAY IT:** May God the Father, who made us, bless us. May God the Son, who redeemed us, send healing into our midst. May God the Holy Spirit, who gives us life, move within us. May God give us eyes to see to God, ears to hear God, and hands to bring God's work into the world. May we walk with God and preach the word of God to all. May the angel of peace watch over us and lead us at last by God's grace to the eternal Kingdom. Amen.

LIVE IT:

Cultivate a spirit of prayer and recollection; maintain the proper posture (kneeling, sitting still, etc.) **ST. DOMINIC -** Born in Spain, Dominic was trained for the priesthood by a priest-uncle, studied the arts and theology, and became a canon of the cathedral at Osma, where there was an attempt to revive the apostolic common life described in Acts of the Apostles. On a journey through France with his bishop, Dominic came face to face with the Albigensian heresy. The Albigensians, or Cathari, "the pure ones", held to two principles: one good, one evil in the world. All matter is evil; hence, they denied the Incarnation and the sacraments. On the same principle, they abstained from procreation and took a minimum of food and drink. The inner circle led what some people regarded as a heroic life of purity and asceticism not shared by ordinary followers. Dominic sensed the need for the Church to combat this heresy, and became part of the preaching crusade against it. He continued this work for 10 years. His fellow preachers gradually became a community, and in 1215 Dominic founded a religious house at Toulouse, the beginning of the Order of Preachers or Dominicans. Dominic's ideal, and that of his Order, was to organically link a life with God, study, and prayer in all forms, with a ministry of salvation to people by the word of God. His ideal: contemplata tradere: "to pass on the fruits of contemplation" or "to speak only of God or with God."

CHARISMS

2. The discernment begins by taking a Charism workshop. You are taught how to see God working through you. The goal is to have each person discover & use 1 charism

 Then you're ready to enjoy & can help others discern theirs.

The Presentation of the Lord

According to Jewish law, the firstborn male child belonged to God, and the parents were to present him in the Temple on the 40th day after his birth, by offering a sacrifice of "a pair of turtledoves, or two young pigeons" (Luke 2:24). On that same day, the mother would be ritually purified. Mary and Joseph kept this law,

even though, Mary remained a

virgin after the birth of Christ, she would not have had to go through the ritual purification.

At the time Jesus was presented in the temple, "there was a man in Jerusalem named Simeon, and this man was just and devout, waiting for the consolation of Israel" (Luke 2:25) When Mary and Joseph brought Jesus to the Temple, Simeon embraced the Child and prayed:

Lord, now you let your servant go in peace, your word has been fulfilled. My own eyes have seen the salvation which you have prepared in the sight of every people: a light to reveal you to the nations and the glory of your people Israel.

The original date of the feast was February 14, the 40th day after Epiphany, because Christmas wasn't yet celebrated as its own feast. Before the last part of the fourth century Christmas, Epiphany, the Baptism of the Lord, and a feast celebrating the Wedding at Cana were all celebrated on the same day. In the last quarter of the 4th century the Church started to celebrate Christmas (the Feast of the Nativity of the Lord) on December 25, so the Feast of the Presentation was moved to February 2-forty days later.



The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord is also known as Candlemas Sunday. Inspired by the words of the Canticle of Simeon ("a light to reveal you to the nations") by the 11th century, the custom had developed of blessing candles on the Feast of the Presentation. The candles were then lit, and a procession took place through the darkened church while the Canticle of Simeon was sung. Because of

this tradition the feast also became known as Candlemas. While the procession and blessing of the candles is not often, but sometimes performed in the United States today, Candlemas is still an important feast in many European countries.

The emphasis on light, serves to remind all of us that we are to be bearers of the Light of Christ in the darkness of the world, as we bring Christ to others by our actions and words.

Light as many candles as you feel necessary and pray the Canticle of Simeon as a family

Give a blessed candle to a neighbor with a a note that wishes them a blessed Feast of the Presentation

February II is World Day of the Sick


