WEEKLY VIRTUE: SINCERITY

KNOW IT:

Trustfulness in words and actions; honesty and enthusiasm towards others

LIVE IT: Tell the whole truth; build trust by words and actions; state what one is sorry for **PRAY IT:** O Saint Vincent Ferrer, our guardian, because God our eternal Father has blessed you with an inexhaustible fountain of grace and blessing, we beg you to hear our prayers and to assist us with your powerful intercession which is even more effective now that you are in heaven than it was when you were on earth. Amen.

St. VINCENT FERRER - Vincent felt that he was the messenger of penance sent to prepare men for the judgment. For twenty years, he traversed Western Europe preaching penance and awakening the dormant consciences of sinners by his wondrous eloquence. His austere life was but the living expression of his doctrine. The floor was his usual bed; perpetually fasting, he arose at two in the morning to chant the Office, celebrating Mass daily, afterwards preaching, sometimes three hours, and frequently working miracles. After his midday meal, he would tend the sick children; at eight o'clock he prepared his sermon for the following day. He usually travelled on foot, poorly clad. Vincent was a renowned preacher who helped to end the Great Western Schism. He lived to see the election of Pope Martin V in November 1417, whereby the Great Western Schism was officially ended. He was canonized by Calixtus III at the Dominican Church of Santa Maria Sopra Minerva, Rome, 3 June, 1455. "Saint Vincent Ferrer was drawn with a trumpet because when he preached, his voice could reach 3 miles away, and it was a miracle," the caretaker said. The saint was pictured with wings because a number of people have seen him assume wings and fly off to a suffering person while preaching.

2. The discernment begins by taking a Charism workshop. You are taught how to see God working through you. The goal is to have each person discover & use I charism

 Then you're ready to enjoy & can help others discern theirs.

Catholic Meditation

From "Christian Meditation: A Beginners' Guide to Catholic Mental Prayer" beginningCatholic.com

The *meditation* itself is the heart of your prayer time. Let the passage provide material for a *conversation* with God:

ask him questions, tell him things. Above all, **listen** to him, both in the words of Scripture and in how those words guide your thoughts.

If you need help with this part of Christian meditation, try something like:

- Pretend that God wrote these words just to you, right now, to tell you something important. What is it? How will it affect your life?
- Imagine the scene in the reading. Picture yourself there, hearing the words, seeing the action. Follow the Lord, watch him, listen. What is he teaching you?
 - What does the passage tell you about God? What is he like? What does he value? What does the passage say about *you*?
 - Does the reading's message, or a part of it, describe *you*, for good or bad? What specific things should you change in your life to be closer to the Gospel message you're reading?

The goal of Christian meditation is closer union with Christ.

You **don't** want to reduce mental prayer to a simple reflection on the passage you're reading. You should get to know Christ better, *and love him more*. You should learn of his boundless love for you, *so you can grow closer to him*. You should see how he acts and loves and gives his very life for you, *so you can become more like him*. You should see how he seeks and does the will of the Father, *so you can, too*.

The goal of Christian meditation is **not** just to think good thoughts about the passage. What counts is how we **apply** those thoughts to our lives.



God communicates with us through our thoughts. We must take those thoughts, form resolutions, and act on them.

"What? God talks to us through our thoughts?" Yes, indeed!

> In prayer, God most often affects our **thoughts** to communicate with us. Often it's a gentle, normal movement of thought. Occasionally it may be a sudden and strong realization.

You also sense God's voice through your conscience, imagination, and

even your heart and feelings. Christian meditation can use all of these.

Of course, other things besides God affect your thoughts & emotions! Not all of them are good. Make sure that the message you're hearing in Christian meditation is consistent with the truths found in Scripture, the teachings of the Church, and general "good living."

- Don't be afraid to put the ball back in God's court if you're not sure: "Lord, I'm not sure if this is from you or not. If it is, please tell me more clearly at some other time. Until then, I won't act on it."
- Check out any relevant Church teachings. The Holy Spirit guides and forms the Church — he never asks us to act contrary to its genuine teachings! (*Catechism* 1783-5, 2039)
- Ask a priest for help if you're still doubtful about something, or if you think God is asking you to make unusual changes in your life. Most priests will be delighted to help you advance in prayer.

When your thoughts drift during prayer, regain focus with the words of the passage.

And don't forget: Form some **specific** resolutions based on your Christian meditation. Know how you are going to apply these thoughts to *your* life, *today*.

HOLY SPIRIT PARISHIONER HIGHLIGHT: CODY HAMILTON

Holy Spirit parishioner Cody Hamilton is a super volunteer. What does that mean? He donates lots of his time helping out at Holy Spirit! Currently he is the Environment Coordinator for our parish. Doesn't sound like much? It is surprising how many jobs need to be done around our church to keep it looking great and in time with the church 'seasons.' Most obvious is the Christmas and Easter seasons. Everyone sees the beautiful flowers on display. Cody takes the lead in placing the flowers, coordinates the volunteers needed to decorate the church spaces, and then helps schedule volunteers to water them. He also makes sure the correct liturgical colors, corresponding to the liturgical calendar, are in place in the church. (There are six liturgical seasons: Advent, Christmas, Lent, Sacred Paschal Triduum, Easter and Ordinary Time.)

He helps prepare the spaces for the penance services and for any Marian devotions and November's month of remembrance. In addition, Cody helps with the Wednesday night Food & Fellowship, with the parish archives, and is a past Catechist Assistant. Cody says "When I am helping with the cleaning of the church, I get to dust the tabernacle off; it feels like I am dusting Jesus off, getting him all cleaned up. Also, my friends and neighbors really like the photos I take of the church flowers and decorations in the church, especially the Christmas pictures."

Cody joined Holy Spirit in 2014. He says, "I feel like Holy Spirit is more of a family than just a church, especially with having the school attached. That really makes it more of a family. I love kids!"

Although Cody was born and raised in Fargo, he spent a lot of time with his Grandma and Grandpa. Summers were spent at his grandparent's lake home near Detroit Lakes. Then when they retired, it was six months in Florida during the winter and six months at the summer lake home. After his grandparents died, Cody really became closer to Jesus. He said Grandma was always telling him, "You go to Church!"

Cody likes to go to the 9am Mass because "the choir is great and it is a central time, not too early and not too late... plus the donuts are great!" He also likes to do adoration (at the Our Lady of Guadalupe Chapel near St. Mary's Cathedral) at Noon because "it is like having lunch with Jesus."

What does Cody do with any spare time? He works at the Fargodome to pay the bills, and he enjoys paper crafts and makes greeting cards to send to his family and friends in his free time.

Cody looks forward to when he can move to be closer to his family. He has one brother who is in the Army National Guard living in Colorado Springs and is engaged to be married. He wants to live close to them and any future nieces and nephews they may have. "I hope they have lots of kids... I just love kids!"
