Amen. St. Ferdinand, Pray for us!

ST. FERDINAND OF CASTILLE - King of Castile in 1217 at age 18. King of Leon in 1230. King of Palencia, Valladolid, and Burgos. Married to Princess Beatrice, daughter of Philip of Swabia, King of Germany. The couple had seven sons and three daughters. Following the death of Beatrice in 1236, Ferdinand married Joan of Ponthiers, with whom he had two sons and a daughter.

A stern judge when it came to the law, he was gentle and forgiving in his personal life. Founded the University of Salamanca. Rebuilt the Cathedral of Burgos. Crusaded for 27 years against the Muslims in Spain. Successfully held back Islamic invasions in 1225, and took Cordoba and Seville from them in 1234-36. Founded the Cathedral of Burgos and the University of Salamanca. Converted the Great Mosque in Seville to a cathedral.

A man of great faith and devotion, especially to Our Lady, Ferdinand founded and funded hospitals, bishoprics, monasteries, and churches. He reformed Spanish law, and compiled it into a form used for centuries after. An excellent administrator and just ruler, often pardoning those who worked against the crown. Strove always to use his power to better his people and his nation.

PRAYER

Prayer is the joy of the Christian life. Here are some basic steps to get there:

- I. Start simply with 10 minutes each day in prayer or reading the Bible. It is so doable!
- 2. Transforming your relationship with God is next. The Prayer 101 experience is the concrete step.
- 3. The final step is complete commitment. This is achieved when we take a 1/2 hour of meditative/ contemplative prayer each day to nurture our relationship with God.

ARRR—FOUR ESSENTIAL HABITS OF PRAYER

ACKNOWLEDGE · RELATE · RECEIVE · RESPOND

LUKE 1: 26-38 ANNUNCIATION

In the sixth month, the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a town of Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the house of David, and the virgin's name was Mary. And coming to her, he said, "Hail, favored one! The Lord is with you." But she was

greatly troubled at what was said and pondered what sort of greeting

RELATE said to her in reply, "The holy Spirit will

come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. Therefore

the child to be born will be called holy, the Son of God. And behold, Elizabeth, your relative, has also

conceived a son in her old age, and this is the sixth month for her who was called barren; for nothing will be impossible for God." Mary said, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me

according to your word."
Then the
angel departed from her.

ACKNOWLEDGE

We become aware of what is happening in our life, especially our emotions such as a feeling of disappointment, fear, joy, anxiety, or excitement. We simply recognize what is happening within ourselves and acknowledge it. We particularly note any changes in emotions and spiritual movements.

RELATE

We then take this feeling, desire, or thought to God in prayer. We directly explain what is happening with us to Him, (Father, Son, and/or Holy Spirit). We tell it like it is! If we are angry we say so, without letting any excuses get in the way of our sharing what we have acknowledged.

RECEIVE

We then wait in silent expectation. Sometimes it's instantly, other times it's a little movement in our heart of peace that begins to take away our anxieties. Or perhaps it is God's favorite response, when in some way He says, "I love you." When we authentically hear this we melt in ecstasy.

RESPOND

After hearing from the Lord, we respond to what He has said. It naturally flows from our experience of receiving and powerfully leads us forward, confident we are doing the Lord's will. Thus we diligently emphasize in our lives what God asks of us and respond to what He is saying.

Scripture Meditations: Week Two- The Incarnation-Jesus' Public Life



This week we journey with Jesus in His public life and ministry. He reveals clearly who He is and calls us to be his disciples. But he never forces us, he invites us, desiring that we freely choose to love and follow Him. As you pray with Scripture this week be aware of this freedom to choose. The freedom to choose to live under His standard, the Standard of love; or to live under the standard of the evil one, which enslaves us.

MARCH 27-APRIL 2
Two Standards*

Grace to ask for at beginning of each prayer period this week: That I might be transfigured into another Christ, so that my life will reflect more brightly the Light of Christ in the world.

LUKE 5: 1-11 CALL OF THE APOSTLES

MARK 1: 40-42 HEALING OF MAN WITH LEPROSY

MATTHEW 17: 1-9 TRANSFIGURATION

One Person's Experience While Praying with Scripture

A common, if not constant, frustration I experience with *lectio divina* is the failure of my imagination to take me to the right place. I don't know if it is because my imagination is not a visual one or if it's a matter of distraction. Sometimes I can get to the place but I can't seem to interact (i.e. talk) with those who are there. So, I do what I can, although I feel like I'm observing from a distance more than participating in the scene. On occasion, I am more engaged than others, so I suspect it's a matter of practice. It's not always easy. Perhaps that's what prompted St. Ignatius to refer to it as spiritual "exercise".

MEDITATION ON THE TWO STANDARDS.

by St. Ignatius

The one of Christ, our Commander-in-chief and Lord; the other of Lucifer, mortal enemy of our human nature.

Prayer The usual Preparatory Prayer recognizing you are in God's presence under His loving gaze.



Consider the spiritual battle that takes place in the world between good and evil and bring it to a concrete imagination of a field of battle with Satan and his army on one side, and Christ and his army on the other, as you consider the following points:

THE CAMP OF SATAN

FIRST POINT The first Point is to imagine, as if the chief of all the enemy, seated himself in that great field of Babylon, as in a great chair of fire and smoke, horrible and terrifying.

SECOND POINT The second, to consider how he issues a summons to innumerable demons and how he scatters them, some to one city and others to another, and so through all the world, not omitting any places, or any persons in particular.

THIRD POINT The third, to consider the discourse which he makes with them, and how he tells them to cast out nets and chains; that they are to tempt with a longing for riches—as he is accustomed to do in most cases—that men may more easily come to vain honor of the world, and then to vast pride. So that the first step will be that of riches; the second, that of honor; the third, that of pride; and from these three steps he tempts to all the other vices.

THE CAMP OF CHRIST THE LORD

Now consider the camp of the supreme and true Captain, who is Christ our Lord.

FIRST POINT The first Point is to consider how Christ our Lord puts Himself in a great field of that region of Jerusalem, in a lowly place, beautiful and attractive.

SECOND POINT The second, to consider how the Lord of all the world chooses so many persons—Apostles, Disciples, all the baptized,—and sends them through all the world spreading His sacred doctrine through all states and conditions of persons.

THIRD POINT The third, to consider the discourse which Christ our Lord makes to all His servants and friends whom He sends on this expedition, recommending them to want to help all, by bringing them first to the highest spiritual poverty, and—if His Divine Majesty would be served and would want to choose them—no less to actual poverty; the second is to be of contempt for worldly honor; because from these two things humility follows. So that there are to be three steps; the first, poverty against riches; the second, contempt against worldly honor; the third, humility against pride. And from these three steps let them induce to all the other virtues.

At the end of the prayer enter colloquy (conversation) as guided:

FIRST COLLOQUY Speak to Mary asking for the following that she may obtain for you the grace from Her Son and Lord that you may be received under His standard (in His great army)

Ask for the highest spiritual poverty, and, if He would want to choose and receive you—not less in actual poverty.

Ask to imitate Him in suffering insults and injuries, if only you can suffer them without sin, or displeasure of His Divine Majesty; and with that pray a Hail Mary.

SECOND COLLOQUY Ask the same of **Jesus**, the Son of God, that He may get these for you from the Father; and with that pray the *Soul of Christ*.

THIRD COLLOQUY Ask the same of the Father, that He may grant it to you; and pray an Our Father

Soul of Christ, sanctify me
Body of Christ, save me
Blood of Christ, inebriate me
Water from Christ's side, wash me
Passion of Christ, strengthen me
O good Jesus, hear me
Within Your wounds hide me
Let me never be separated from You
From the malicious enemy
defend me
In the hour of my death call me
And bid me come to You
That I may praise You with Your
saints and with Your angels

Forever and ever, Amen.


