PRAY IT: St Isaac Jogues, by your preaching and by your blood, the Eternal Word did consecrate the first-fruits of the faith in the vast regions of North America. Pray for us, O martyr of Christ, that by the example of our lives, we may bring others to follow Christ and so assist in increasing the harvest of souls, sown by you in America. Amen.

ST. ISAAC JOGUES - was a French Jesuit priest who chose to work with the Huron Indians. After his arrival in 1636 in upper state New York, he became ill and was blamed for starting an epidemic. Relations improved and for several years he successfully ministered to the Native Americans. In 1642, he was captured by Mohawk Indians, enslaved at their village, starved, tortured, and mutilated. He was forced to watch the killing of Christian converts. During his captivity it is claimed that he baptized a number of dying children, marking the first baptisms in the state of New York. He spent 13 months as a slave before Dutch settlers helped him escape and return to France. He did not stay and before returning as a missionary, the Jesuits requested a dispensation from the pope. According to Church law, a priest needs "canonical digits" to celebrate Mass, and several of his fingers had been cut, chewed, or burnt off. The pope granted the request, saying, "It would be shameful that a martyr of Christ not be allowed to drink the Blood of Christ." In 1646 he returned to New York as an ambassador to the Mohawks. Soon after concluding a treaty, he was captured by a band of hostile Mohawks because of their superstitions attributing the illness in the village to the evil they thought he left with them. He was given his freedom, only to be beheaded (near what is now Auriesville, NY) by a small group of Mohawks. Isaac Jogues was able to face unimaginable difficulty and martyrdom because he allowed Christ to fill him. His life is an inspiration to young Christians who may be facing persecution in secular society for their faith and is a saint for those who have been knocked down by life. Canonized in 1930, his feast day is October 19.

PRAYER

Prayer is the joy of the Christian life. Here are some basic steps to get there:

- I. Start simply with 10 minutes each day in prayer or reading the Bible. It is so doable!
- 2. Transforming your relationship with God is next. The Prayer 101 experience is the concrete step.
- 3. The final step is complete commitment. This is achieved when we take a 1/2 hour of meditative/ contemplative prayer each day to nurture our relationship with God.

Sacred Triduum

Holy Thursday In the Catholic Church, in the Mass of the Lord's Supper, during the Gloria all church bells may be rung and the organ played; afterwards, bells and organ are silenced until the Gloria of the Easter Vigil. After the homily of the Mass, "where a pastoral reason suggests it", a ritual washing of the feet follows. The Mass concludes with a procession of the Blessed Sacrament to the altar of repose. Eucharistic adoration is encouraged after this, but if continued after midnight should be done without outward solemnity. Some faithful travel to several churches to pray at their Altar of Repose, a practice called Seven Churches Visitation. Before Vatican II Mass concluded with a ritual stripping of all altars, except the altar of repose, but leaving the cross and candlesticks. In the present form as revised in 1955, the altar is stripped bare without ceremony later.



The liturgical color for the Mass vestments and other ornaments is white in the Catholic Church.

Good Friday On Good Friday, Christians recall the passion and crucifixion of Jesus. In the Catholic ritual, clergy traditionally begin the service prostrate in front of the altar. Mass is not celebrated on Good Friday and the communion distributed at the Celebration of the Lord's Passion is consecrated on Holy Thursday. Also in Catholicism, images of saints may, in accordance with local custom, be veiled throughout the last two weeks of Lent. Votive lights before these images are not lit. Crucifixes that are not movable are veiled until after the Good Friday service. Catholic faithful typically venerate the crucifix by kissing the feet of the corpus. Veneration of a simple wooden cross is common as well, with the faithful touching and/or kissing it. The Catholic Church uses red vestments, symbolic of the blood of Jesus Christ.

Holy Saturday Holy Saturday, also known as Black Saturday, is a commemoration of the day that Jesus lay in his tomb. In the Catholic Church, daytime Masses are never offered.

Easter Sunday A vigil service is held after nightfall on Holy Saturday, or before dawn on Easter Sunday, in celebration of the resurrection of Jesus. The ceremony of darkness and light is held at the beginning of the Easter Vigil Mass. The paschal candle, whose lighting symbolizes the resurrection of Christ from the dead, is lit from the new Easter fire. The solemn procession to the altar with the Paschal candle is formed. Once everyone has processed in, the Exsultet is intoned.

After the Exsultet, everyone is seated and listens to seven readings from the Old Testament and seven Psalms. At least three of these readings and associated psalms must be read, which must include the account of the first Passover from the Book of Exodus. These readings account salvation history, beginning with Creation.

In Catholic practice, during the Gloria at the Mass, the organ and church bells are used in the liturgy for the first time in two days. If the lights of the Church have been previously left off, they are turned on as the Gloria begins. The Paschal candle is used to bless the baptismal font to be used in the celebration of the sacrament of baptism. The Great Alleluia is sung before the Gospel is read, Alleluia being used for the first time since before Lent. People receiving full initiation in the Church, who have completed their training, are given the Sacraments of Christian initiation (Baptism, confirmation, and the Holy Eucharist). The Easter Vigil is an especially appropriate day for Holy Baptism.

In current practice, the use of lighting to signify the emergence from sin and the resurrection of Jesus varies, from the use of candles held by parishioners. Color of vestments is white, often together with gold, with yellow and white flowers often in use in many parishes.

Easter Masses are held throughout the day and are similar in content to the Easter Vigil Mass.

- To instruct the ignorant.

Bearing wrongs patiently is a difficult, yet ultimately rewarding act of mercy for all involved if practiced regularly. It is easy to grow resentful and bitter, wanting someone or something to blame for the setbacks and situations we face. It is also easy to become frustrated with those



living with us in our homes day in and day out, but to seek patience, willingly riding through setbacks and focusing not on wrongs but on rights and reconciliation is much more fruitful in the long run, especially with those we see on a daily basis. Bearing wrongs patiently takes courage and a good starting point is to remind ourselves of the ways Christ has provided for us and forgiven us in the past, and reminding ourselves of this might make it a little easier to do the same for others.




