At Home with Jesus

What now?

The ultimate goal of each Lenten experience is to transform us into being more fully the person God created us to be, and in being transformed, achieving the happiness for which our hearts long. What we chose to do for Lent in the areas of self-denial, prayer, and giving to those in need, ideally, should not end on

Easter Sunday. For example, if your self-denial was to refrain from gossiping, the habit you developed during Lent, of refraining from giving in to the temptation to gossip, should continue.

As parishioners of Holy Spirit we were invited and encouraged to increase our prayer by entering into meditative, contemplative prayer as we prayed (daily) with Sacred Scripture. This habit of meeting God in His Word was designed to facilitate an encounter and to experience His love in a profound and personal way. Now, take the time to review your **journal** entries. Notice the graces asked for and the ways in which our Lord bestowed them.

Another common way of praying meditatively is to pray the HOLY ROSARY meditating on the various mysteries of the lives of Jesus and Mary. When you sense a movement in your heart as you contemplate the mysteries, accompanied by a desire to stay in that mystery, you should know you are free to stay right there. This becomes a point of meditation. This is where God desires to speak to you.

As this road we travel becomes illuminated with the Light of the Risen Lord, what is next? You are now invited to prayerfully consider a commitment to continue this journey in prayer. Prayer is our relationship with God. When that relationship is rightly ordered, the other relationships in our lives flourish as well. Regular prayer happens when we are consistent. Essential for consistency in prayer is choosing and sticking to a time of day, place, and a personal commitment to pray. God is calling each one of us to encounter Him in prayer. How will you respond?

Lent is like a long 'retreat' during which we can turn back into ourselves and listen to the voice of God, in order to defeat the temptations of the Evil One. It is a period of spiritual 'combat' which we must experience alongside Jesus, not with pride and presumption, but using the arms of faith: prayer, listening to the word of God and penance. In this way we will be able to celebrate Easter in truth, ready to renew the promises of our Baptism. Pope Benedict XVI

PRAYER

Prayer is the joy of the Christian life. Here are some basic steps to get there:

- I. Start simply with 10 minutes each day in prayer or reading the Bible. It is so doable!
- 2. Transforming your relationship with God is next. The Prayer 101 experience is the concrete step.
- 3. The final step is complete commitment. This is achieved when we take a 1/2 hour of meditative/ contemplative prayer each day to nurture our relationship with God.

Divine Mercy Indulgence



Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska of the Blessed Sacrament was born as Helena Kowalska, in Poland on August 25, 1905. She was the third of 10 children to a poor and religious family. In 1924, Faustina experienced her first vision of Jesus. While at a dance with her sister, Natalia, Faustina saw a suffering Jesus and then went to a Cathedral.

According to Faustina, Jesus instructed her to leave for Warsaw immediately and join a convent. On April 30, 1926, at 20-years-old, she finally received her habit and took the religious name of Sister Maria Faustina of the Blessed Sacrament and in 1928, she took her first religious vows as a nun. On February 22, 1931, Faustina was visited by Jesus, who presented himself as the "King of Divine Mercy" wearing a white garment with red and pale rays coming from his heart. She was asked to become the apostle and secretary of God's mercy, a model of how to be merciful to others, and an instrument for reemphasizing God's plan of mercy for the world.

Jesus' words to Sister Faustina from her diary-

I desire that the first Sunday after Easter be the Feast of Divine Mercy Mankind will not have peace until it turns with trust to my Mercy. (299, 300)

My daughter, tell the whole world of my inconceivable mercy. I desire that the feast of mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of my tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of my mercy. The soul that will go to confession and receive Holy Communion will receive complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. (699)

On that day all the divine flood gates through which graces flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to me even though its sins are as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. (699)


The graces of My mercy are drawn by means of one vessel only, and that is trust. The more a soul trusts, the more it will receive. Souls that trust boundlessly are a great comfort to Me, because I pour all the treasures of My graces into them. I rejoice that they ask for much, because it is My desire to give much, very much (1578).

To receive these graces, the only condition is to receive Holy Communion worthily on Divine Mercy Sunday (or the Vigil celebration) by making a good confession

beforehand and staying in the state of grace and trusting in His Divine Mercy. By these conditions, our Lord is emphasizing the value of confession and Holy Communion as miracles of mercy. The Eucharist is Jesus, Himself, the Living God, longing to pour Himself as Mercy into our hearts.

In addition, our Lord says through St. Faustina that we are to perform acts of mercy: "Yes, the first Sunday after Easter is the Feast of Mercy, but there must also be acts of mercy" (742).

For those who cannot go to church and for the seriously ill, they can pray and receive a spiritual Communion, or arrange for an Extraordinary minister to bring Holy Communion to their home.





"Jesus, I Trust in you" DIVINE MERCY The image that reminds us of God's endless love and mercy

Stop at Holy Spirit's Divine Mercy Prayer Cove on the south side of the church to pray and ask for Mercy!

The Divine Mercy message is one we can call to mind simply by remembering ABC:

- A Ask for His Mercy. God wants us to approach Him in prayer constantly, repenting of our sins and asking Him to pour His mercy out upon us and upon the whole world.
- B Be merciful. God wants us to receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others. He wants us to extend love and forgiveness to others just as He does to us.
- C Completely trust in Jesus. God wants us to know that all the graces of His mercy can only be received by our trust. The more we open the door of our hearts and lives to Him with trust, the more we can receive.

This message and devotion to Jesus as The Divine Mercy is based on the writings of Saint Faustina Kowalska, an uneducated Polish nun who, in obedience to her spiritual director, wrote a diary of about 600 pages recording the revelations she received about God's mercy. Even before her death in 1938, the devotion to The Divine Mercy had begun to spread.


