## MONTHLY SOCIAL TEACHING - Solidarity

Pope Paul VI taught that if you want peace, work for justice. The Gospel calls us to be peacemakers. ## WEEKLY VIRTUE: Temperance (self-control) - St. Padre Pio

### KNOW IT:

Enables one to endure difficulties and pain for the sake of what is good.

### LIVE IT:

Exercise the freedom to say 'no' to one's wants and desires.

**PRAY IT:** Dear God, You generously blessed Your servant, St. Pio of Pietrelcina, with the gifts of the Spirit. You marked his body with the five wounds of Christ Crucified, as a powerful witness to the saving Passion and Death of Your Son. Endowed with the gift of discernment, St. Pio labored endlessly in the confessional for the salvation of souls. With reverence and intense devotion in the celebration of Mass, he invited countless men and women to a greater union with Jesus Christ in the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. Through the intercession of St. Pio of Pietrelcina, I confidently beseech You to grant me the grace of (here state your petition). Glory be to the Father... (three times). Amen.

**ST. PIUS OF PIETRELcina** - Best known as Padre Pio, St. Pius was born Francesco Forgione in 1887 in Pietrelcina, Italy. As a young boy he suffered many illnesses including typhoid. He joined Capuchin Franciscans at 15 and took the name of Pius or "Pio" in honor of Pope Pius I. He was ordained in 1910, and at this time he received the marks of stigmata, the wounds of Christ, but they eventually healed. Frequent illnesses continued to plague him as a young man. Padre Pio served in the Italian Medical Corps during World War I, but he was discharged early because of illness, which was likely tuberculosis. He was assigned to the friary in San Giovanni Rotondo. In 1918, while continuing to serve at the friary, the stigmata appeared again, and this time remained until his death. Many faithful came to see him at the friary, his days were long, beginning with Mass at 5 a.m. then hearing confessions all day with breaks to bless the sick. A simple man, content to do God's will on earth and with the ardent desire to serve the sick and poor in whom he saw Christ, he urged a hospital, Casa Sollievo della Sofferenza (House for the Relief of Suffering), to be built in San Giovanni Rotondo. It opened in 1956. Padre Pio died at the age of 81 in 1968 and in 2002 Pope John Paul II proclaimed him "St. Pio of Pietrelcina." His feast day is September 23.

## STEWARDSHIP

All is from God. We live justice & freedom when we live in this truth. We take care of the wealth & resources God has given us as stewards. Here's how our parish lives this:

1. You are invited to take on the attitude of being a steward.
2. One is then accompanied to live from this reality. Tithing is the concrete action as it follows God's Biblical teaching. Ideally, each soul is formed in living stewardship by pledging their tithe to God.
3. We then equip you to share this life of joy with others.

## ARRR—FOUR ESSENTIAL HABITS OF PRAYER

### ACKNOWLEDGE - RELATE - RECEIVE - RESPOND

### Luke 1:26-38 Annunciation

In the sixth month, the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a town of Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the house of David, and the virgin's name was Mary. And coming to her, he said, "Hail, favored one! The Lord is with you." But she was greatly troubled at what was said and pondered what

sort of greeting this might be. Then the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give him the throne of David his father, and he will rule over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." But Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I have

#### RELATE

no relations with a man?" And the angel said to her in reply, "The holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. Therefore the child to be

#### RECEIVE

born will be called holy, the Son of God. And behold, Elizabeth, your relative, has also conceived a son in her old age, and this is the sixth month for her who was called barren; for nothing will be impossible for God." Mary said, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it

#### RESPOND

be done to me according to your word." Then the angel departed from her.



### Acknowledge

We become aware of what is happening in our life, especially our emotions such as a feeling of disappointment, fear, joy, anxiety, or excitement. We simply recognize what is happening within ourselves and acknowledge it. We particularly note any changes in emotions and spiritual movements.

### Relate

We then take this feeling, desire, or thought to God in prayer. We directly explain what is happening with us to Him, perhaps relating it to Jesus, the Father, the Holy Spirit, or simply to the triune God. We tell it like it is, if we are angry, we say so, without letting any excuses get in the way of our sharing what we have acknowledged.

### Receive

We then wait in silent expectation for God to respond. Sometimes its instantly, other times it's a little movement in your heart of peace that begins to take away our anxieties. Or perhaps God's favorite response, were in some way He says "I love you" and when we authentically hear this, we melt in ecstasy.

### Respond

After hearing from the Lord, we respond to what He has said. It naturally flows from our experience of receiving and powerfully leads us forward, confident we are doing the Lord's will. Thus we diligently emphasis in our lives what God asks of us and respond to what He is saying.

## 7 Spiritual Works of Mercy

### FOCUSING ON BEARING WRONGS PATIENTLY

### What are the 7?

- To instruct the ignorant.
- To counsel the doubtful.
- To admonish the sinners.
- To bear patiently those who wrong us.
- To forgive offenses.
- To comfort the afflicted.
- To pray for the living and the dead.

Bearing wrongs patiently is a difficult, yet ultimately rewarding act of mercy for all involved if practiced regularly. It is easy to grow resentful and bitter, wanting someone or something to blame for the setbacks and situations we face. It is also easy to become frustrated with those living with us in our homes day in and day out, but to seek patience, willingly riding through setbacks and focusing not on wrongs but on rights and reconciliation is much more fruitful in the long run, especially with those we see on a daily basis. Bearing wrongs patiently takes courage and a good starting point is to remind ourselves of the ways Christ has provided for us and forgiven us in the past, and reminding ourselves of this might make it a little easier to do the same for others.

# Stewardship - A WAY OF LIFE

*What will you give back to God from the blessings you have received?*

## WHAT IS A STEWARD?

Stewards are people who are entrusted to caring for someone else's property. Jesus parables such as those that work in the vineyard or those entrusted with the talents. A modern day example might be someone who owns a ranch but has a steward take care of the entire operations of the property. This means that as a parish, or an individual, everything we have belongs to God. So it's His time, His talents, His money, etc. This radical attitude shift means we ask the question, 'God what do you want me to do with your money, with your time, etc.' It also means that our identity is wrapped up in God. We belong to Him as His steward and have confidence God will richly provide for us.

## STEWARDSHIP - A WAY OF LIFE, NOT A PROGRAM

Stewardship is recognizing that we are stewards and God desires our response to Him to be living out stewardship, both as a parish and as families, as a way of life. The U.S. Bishop's Pastoral Letter "Stewardship: A Disciple's Response" states it this way: "Beginning in conversion, change of heart and mind, this commitment is expressed not in a single action, nor even in a number of actions over a period of time, but in an entire way of life."

## CHALLENGES OF LIVING STEWARDSHIP

Lived stewardship brings great freedom and joy. But getting there takes trust and sacrifice. We are called as a parish, families and individuals, to respond completely to Jesus Christ, no matter what the cost. So as we more deeply enter into being a Stewardship Parish, we do so with courage and trust.

## LIVING STEWARDSHIP CHANGES US

### *What changes for our parish?*

One change will be to highlight stewardship as the way God does and will support our parish community. So Holy Spirit parish will offer more and more classes, events, etc., without 'fees'. Jesus tells us in Mt 10:8, 'Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give.' We will start with no fees for Catechesis classes or parish study groups and no free will offering at our Wednesday night food and fellowship. We already started doing that for Sunday morning coffee and rolls. Plus we decided to not mail out the raffle tickets so people wouldn't feel 'obligated' to buy them, but can freely do so if they want.

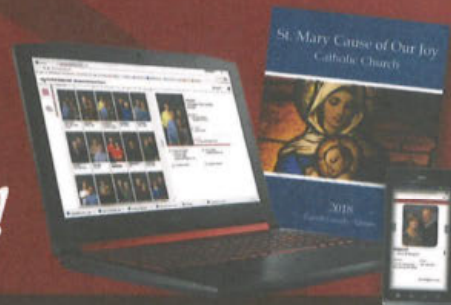
### *What changes for us?*

One example will be for us to reflect upon how we give. For instance, responding to our call to give God the 'first fruits' instead of what is left over. How many times have we used the excuse that I didn't pray or give because I ran out of time or money? A good steward gives to the owner what is asked and is able to take care of their own needs with what remains. You could think of it as percentage giving, the portion the Lord asks to have back, instead of what we might decide how much we want to give. Or one could speak about it as giving from one's substance versus one's abundance. This helps us understand our role as stewards. Our parish will emphasize this form of giving, practically lived out in tithing by our members.

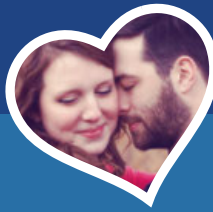
