#### PRAYER

Prayer is the joy of the Christian life. Here are there:

I. Start simply with 10 minutes each day in prayer or reading the Bible. It is so doable !

2. Transforming your relationship with God is next. The Prayer 101 experience is the concrete step.

3. The final step is complete commitment. This is achieved when we take a 1/2 hour of meditative/ contemplative prayer each day to nurture our relationship with God.

## FIRST SATURDAY DEVOTIONS

On December 10, 1925, our Blessed Mother and the infant Jesus appeared to Sr. Lucia, Jesus said:

Have compassion on the Heart of your Most Holy Mother, covered with thorns with which ungrateful men pierce it at every moment, and there is no one to make an act of reparation to remove them.

Then our Lady said:

... I promise to assist at the hour of death, with the graces necessary for salvation, all those who, on the first Saturday of five consecutive months, shall confess, receive Holy Communion, recite five decades of the rosary, and keep me company for 15 minutes while meditating on some basic steps to get the 15 mysteries of the rosary, with the intention of making reparation to me.

#### FIVE TYPES OF OFFENSES THUS FIVE SATURDAYS

- Blasphemies against
- 1. The Immaculate Conception
- 2. Mary's virginity
- 3. Mary as mother of God and all people
- 4. Blasphemies of those who publicly seek to sow in the hearts of children, indifference or scorn or even hatred of this Immaculate Mother
- 5. Offenses of those who outrage her directly in her holy images.

#### HOW TO MAKE REPARATION

- 1. Approach each Saturday with a loving desire to make reparation to and console the Sorrowful and Immaculate Heart of Our Mother
- 2. Confession in the spirit of reparation within 8 davs
- 3. Essential Reparatory Communion on First Saturday (or Sunday with permission of priest)
- 4. Recitation of the rosary in reparation of sins against her Immaculate Heart
- 5. 15-minute meditation on Mary's life in Christ

#### **FRUITS OF THIS** DEVOTION

To those who faithfully follow our Lady's requests, she has promised to assist at the hour of death with the graces necessary for salvation. This



means that our Blessed Mother will be present at the hour of death with the actual grace of final perseverance.

This devotion is for the conversion of sinners. So numerous are the souls which the justice of God condemns for sins committed against me that I come to ask for reparation. Sacrifice yourself for this intention and pray. (Our Lady to Sr. Lucia June 13, 1929)

Sister Lucia wrote: In His Providence, God decided that the peace in the world will depend on this devotion.

Whether the world has war or peace depends on the practice of this devotion, along with the consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. This is why I desire its propagation so ardently, especially because this is also the will of our dear Mother in Heaven. (Sr. Lucy, March 19, 1930)

Another fruit of this devotion is that it will lead one to do all he can to make reparation for the sins which pierce her Immaculate Heart.
