MONTHLY SOCIAL TEACHING - Option for the Poor and Vulnerable

A basic moral test is how our most vulnerable members are faring. In a society marred by deepening divisions between rich and poor, our tradition recalls the story of the Last Judgement (Mt 25:31-46) and instructs us to put the needs of the poor and vulnerable first. In teaching us charity, the Gospel instructs us in the preferential respect due to the poor and the special situation they have in society; the more fortunate should renounce some of their rights so as to place their goods more generously at the service of others.

WEEKLY VIRTUE: Courtesy - St. Nicholas

Know IT: Treating other people with respect, recognizing that all are made in God's image and likeness.


LIVE IT: Be aware of other's feelings and expressions; be polite, well-mannered **PRAY IT:** God of joy and cheer, we thank you for your servant, the good bishop Nicholas. In loving the poor, he showed us your kindness; in caring for your children, he revealed your love. Make us thoughtful without need of reward so that we, too, may be good followers of Jesus. Amen.

St. NICHOLAS - Saint Nicholas was born c. 280 in a part of present-day Turkey. He lost both of his parents as a young man and used his inheritance to help the poor and sick. A devout Christian, he later served as bishop of Myra, a city now called Demre. Saint Nicholas is believed to have died on December 6, 343. Over the years, stories of his miracles and work for the poor spread to other parts of the world. He became known as the protector of children and sailors and was associated with gift-giving. The Dutch celebrated his feast day, Dec 6. A common practice for children was to put out their shoes the night before, and in the morning, they would discover the gifts that were left there for them. Dutch immigrants brought the legend of Saint Nicholas, known to them by his nickname, Sinterklaas, to America in the 1700s. Sinterklaas became Santa Claus, and became a part of the Christmas holiday. In the 1820 poem "An Account of a Visit from Saint Nicholas" by Clement Moore, he is described as a jolly, heavy man who comes down the chimney to leave presents for deserving children and drives a sleigh pulled by flying reindeer. Cartoonist Thomas Nast added to the legend with a drawing of Santa wearing a red suit with white fur trim. Once a kind, charitable bishop, Saint Nicholas had become the Santa Claus we know today.

STEWARDSHIP

Everything we have is from God. Jesus asks us to live in this truth by giving a portion back to Him, called a tithe. Here are some basic steps to get there:

I. Start with giving 1% of your income back to God such as to the Church or the poor.

2. The next step would be to step out in trust and give a half tithe or 5% of your income to God.

3. The last step would be to give God a full tithe (10%) as He asks of us. We are always able to give more but this provides a foundation.

Advent Week 1

Advent is the season during which we ponder the coming of our Lord and savior: His coming in the past as a babe born of the Virgin Mary; His coming to us through Grace; and His coming at the end of time as just judge. As we remember and anticipate we also prepare and look forward to celebrating. The words of the Exultet-the Easter proclamation, remind us just for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is what we celebrate "O, Happy Fault that merited such and so great a Redeemer!" "O truly necessary sin of Adam, which the death of Christ has blotted out!"

The Season of Advent is therefore a season of vigilant waiting, that prepares us to welcome the mystery of the Word Incarnate, who will give the 'Light' to the womb of the Virgin Mary, but essentially this time prepares us not only to welcome this great event but to incarnate it in our lives. We could say that the true light enters the world through the immaculate womb of Mary but it does not stay there. On the contrary, this light flows out into our dark, obscure, sinful lives to illuminate them, so that we can become the light that illuminates the world. For this reason, let us live this time of waiting not only to celebrate a historical memory but to repeat this memory in our lives and in the service of others. To wait for the Lord who comes, means to wait and to watch so that the Word of Love enters inside us and focuses us every day of our lives.

As Blessed John Henry Newman reminded us in a homily for the Advent Season: "Advent is a time of waiting, it is a time of joy because the coming of Christ is not only a gift of grace and salvation but it is also a time of commitment because it motivates us to live the present as a

Grant your faithful, we pray, almighty God, the resolve to run forth to meet your Christ with righteous deeds at his coming, so that, gathered at his right hand, they may be worthy to possess the heavenly Kingdom.

time of responsibility and vigilance. This 'vigilance' means the necessity, the urgency of an industrious, living 'wait'. To make all this happen, then we need to wake up, as we are warned by the apostle to the Gentiles, in today's reading to the Romans: 'Besides this you know what hour it is, how it is full time now nearer to us now than when we first believed" (Rm 13:11).

We must start our journey to ascend to the mountain of the Lord, to be illuminated by His Words of peace and to allow Him to indicate the path to tread (cf. ls 2:1-5). Moreover, we must change our conduct abandoning the works of darkness and put on the 'armor of light' and so seek only to do God's work and to abandon the deeds of the flesh (cf. Rm 13:12-14). Jesus, through the story in the parable, outlines the Christian life style that must not be distracted and indifferent but must be vigilant and recognize even the smallest sign of the Lord's coming because we don't know the hour in which He will arrive (cf. Mt 24:39-44) Excerpted from the website of Congregation for the Clergy


How're invited to paricipate in the GIVING TREE


