

MONTHLY SOCIAL TEACHING - Call to Family, Community & Participation

The person is not only sacred but also social. How we organize our society - in economics and politics, in law and policy - directly affects human dignity and the capacity of individuals to grow in community. Marriage and the family are the central social institutions that must be supported and strengthened, not undermined. We believe people have a right and a duty to participate in society, seeking together the common good and well-being of all, especially the poor and vulnerable.

WEEKLY VIRTUE: Generosity

KNOW IT: Giving of oneself in a willing and cheerful manner for the good of others

LIVE IT: Be selfgiving; focus on one act of charity/ kindness each day; share **PRAY IT:** Dear St Joseph Moscati, true model of Christian doctors, in the exercise of your medical profession, you always took care of both the body and soul of every patient. Look on us, who have recourse to your heavenly intercession, and obtain for us both physical and spiritual health so we may comply with our Christian duties and glorify God our Father. Amen.

ST. GIUSEPPE MOSCATI - was the first modern medical doctor canonized. Born July 25, 1880 in Benevento, Italy, he lived out the Gospel through his position as a teacher and physician. He saw Confession and Communion as the "first medicine." He once said, "Remember that you have to deal not only with the bodies but also with the moaning souls coming to you." To help the poor, he often donated his medical services or paid for his patients' prescriptions. St. Joseph Moscati also felt it was important to support priests and those in religious life with his prayers because, as he said, "They are easily forgotten by the living, since Christians often think that they do not need prayers." He carried a Rosary in his pocket as a reminder throughout his day and as a way to draw him to Our Lady -- and through her, to Jesus -- when he needed to make important decisions. St. Joseph Moscati died on April 12, 1927 of natural causes in his office between patient appointments. He was beatified on November 16, 1975 by Pope Paul VI and canonized on October 25, 1987 by Pope John Paul II. His body rests in Naples, Italy, in the Church of Gesu Nuovo.

STEWARDSHIP

Everything we have is from God. Jesus asks us to live in this truth by giving a portion back to Him, called a tithe. Here are some basic steps to get there:

- I. Start with giving 1% of your income back to God such as to the Church or the poor.
- 2. The next step would be to step out in trust and give a half tithe or 5% of your income to God.
- 3. The last step would be to give God a full tithe (10%) as He asks of us. We are always able to give more but this provides a foundation.



"As the journey of Advent continues, as we prepare to celebrate the nativity of Christ, John the Baptist's call to conversion sounds out in our communities. It is a pressing invitation to open our hearts and to welcome the Son of God Who comes among us to make divine judgement manifest. The Father, writes St. John the

Evangelist, does not judge anyone, but has entrusted the power of judgement to the Son, because He is the Son of man.

"And it is today, in the present, that we decide our future destiny. It is with our concrete everyday behavior in this life that we determine appeared on his tilma. This image is on display our eternal fate. At the end of our days on earth, at the moment of death, we will be evaluated on the basis of our likeness or otherwise to the Baby Who is about to be born in the poor grotto of Bethlehem, because He is the measure God has given humanity.

"Through the Gospel John the Baptist continues to speak down the centuries to each generation. His hard clear words bring health to us, the men and women of this day in which even the experience and perception of Christmas often, unfortunately, reflects materialist attitudes. The 'voice' of the great prophet asks us to prepare the way for the coming Lord in the deserts of today, internal and external deserts, thirsting for the water of life which is Christ." - Benedict XVI

Almighty and merciful God, may no earthly undertaking hinder those who set out in haste to meet your Son, but may our learning of heaven's wisdom gain us admittance to his company.

> The feast of St. Juan Diego, which is ordinarily celebrated today, is superseded by the Sunday liturgy. Juan Diego was the man to whom the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared on December 9, 1531 near what is now Mexico City. When the local bishop told him to ask the Lady for a sign that she truly was appearing to him, our Lady told him to collect roses from the

hillside (these "miraculous roses" were native to Spain-the bishops home land and did not grow in Mexico.) She instructed him to carry them in his cloak. As Juan released the roses and they tumbled to the floor at the feet of the bishop, a miraculous image of Our Lady in the Basilica of Guadalupe in Mexico City. Scientists have study the miraculous image and found it is "completely outside of science. "The feast of Juan Diego is followed, December 12, by the feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Let us remember the words spoken by her to Juan Diego and receive them as though spoken to each one of us: Am I not here, who is your Mother? Are you not under my protection?




