

# Pastor's Message—From Father Dave

Jesus summoned them and said to them, "You know that those who are recognized as rulers over the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones make their authority over them felt. But it shall not be so among you. Rather, whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all."



James and John, known as "The Sons of Thunder," want Jesus to promise that they will have the best seats in the Kingdom of Heaven. Jesus has told His Apostles a number of times that they are on their way to Jerusalem, where He will be betrayed, tortured, and killed. He also tells them that they must be willing to do the same. Five days before Jesus is crucified, James and John are arguing and pushing to have the "best seats in the house." They don't understand what Jesus is trying to teach them about the connection between suffering and new life.

Jesus goes on to use the familiar and traditional image of leadership in our Gospel. The rulers of the Gentiles were known as autocrats who manipulated and controlled the actions of others. This model of leadership has been used in all cultures and in all times of human history. In some ways, it is pretty easy to lead and to follow in this model. Leaders like the power and control over the people, and followers like the fact that they don't have to think for themselves and that they don't have to take responsibility for any decisions or actions. But Jesus tells the Apostles that this type of leadership shouldn't happen in the Church. Those who are called to leadership must be willing to serve the needs of their people.

The authority for any Christian leader, whether it is of a parish, business, or family, must rest in love, not force. Those who are called to be a leader in our Church, community, or neighborhood must be willing to serve the needs of the people whose lives and well-being have been entrusted to them.

The world may assess a man's greatness by the number of people whom he controls and who are at his beck and call; or by his intellectual standing and his academic eminence; or by the number of committees of which he is a member; or by the size of his bank balance and the material possessions which he has amassed; but in the assessment of Jesus Christ these things are irrelevant. His assessment is quite simply, 'How many people have you helped?'" –William Barclay

# Taking Charge of Your Schedule

We use the word "should" all the time. I SHOULD exercise more. I SHOULD pray more often. I SHOULD go to bed earlier. I SHOULD call that friend. It's easy to fill our lives with the pressure of "shoulds" and not actually do those things we "should" do. We have limited time each day and limited time on this earth. What we do matters. So often we feel like our scheduling is running our lives. But is your schedule in charge of you or are you in charge of your schedule?

If you find yourself living with a lot of "shoulds" or looking for your purpose, here are some ways to help reorient your time.

- 1. <u>Know Your Priorities:</u> Make a list of the top 5 things that are most important to you. Then, make a list of the top 5 areas you spend most of your time during the day. Do they match up, and if not, why? In prayer we can bring our schedule to God and ask "is this how You want me to spend my time?".
- 2. Shift from "Should" to "Want": This simple switch in language can make a big impact. "Should" is full of pressure and implies that we have already failed to meet an expectation. "Want" is an action word and gives us a sense of agency. For example, "I want to pray a rosary" instead of "I should pray a rosary". Repeat those sentences out loud and feel the difference.
- 3. Say No, so You Can Say Yes to What Matters: When we are aware of our priorities, we can make informed decisions about what activities help us live out our purpose and what does not. It is ok to say no to something so we can say yes to what God has set before us. If your vocation is a marriage, it's important to say no to friends sometimes so we can say yes to intentionally loving our spouse. This love then fills up our cup, pouring into our kids, friends, and colleagues.

Reorienting our schedules is not easy. It takes patience and dedication to be intentional about living the life you want to live. ### Inspiration for the week

It's the positions of power and great authority that people often admire. We equate success with six figure incomes, high positions, management, and influence. We even go above and beyond to find favor with our bosses so that we can get a little extra recognition and maybe the next promotion when it comes up. This is the way of the world. Those who have their values set on earthly things are going to work by earthly rules. We forget that it doesn't work that way in the Kingdom of God. Success is measured not from the place of status, influence, or prestige but from the place of humility, service, and sacrifice. The authority that one hopes to achieve is not an authority over others but an authority that comes from wisdom and developing one's relationship with God. Jesus flips the tables on our priorities. Even the first disciples had a tough time understanding this. They really thought that they would somehow receive a privilege or bonus from being faithful. We often operate under that same illusion.
