

A Note From Fr. LeRoy

On behalf of Fr. Timothy, Fr. Oswaldo, and myself, we would like to wish you all a, "Very Happy and Healthy New Year!" Time moves on, and it seems to do so with or without us. It's hard to believe we are already beginning the year 2022! It's interesting to note that this weekend we celebrate two major Solemnities or Feasts in our Faith-life: The Solemnity of Mary the Mother of God on January 1st and the Feast of the Epiphany on January 2nd. Both these celebrations should have a powerful impact on our life.

As Catholics we always begin the first day of the New Year with Mother Mary. Why is that? Well, not only because of the important role Mary plays in Salvation History (especially during the holidays) but if you ponder it, our Blessed Mother Mary was the first in a lot of things when it comes to our life in Jesus Christ. Recall, how Mary was the first to know that a Savior would be born when the angel, Gabriel, announced the good news that she would become the Mother of God. When Jesus, the Christ child, was born Mary was the first to see the human face of God. As the "Word made flesh," Mary was the first to hear the first word Jesus ever spoke. I wonder what that was? Mary of the first disciple of Christ as she not only taught Jesus while he was growing up, but also learned from him just who he was and how the Son of God came to reveal himself to us. Mary was there when Jesus performed his first miracle at the Wedding Feast of Cana, changing water into wine. Mary was with Jesus throughout his preaching and public ministry. She was there when Jesus also died on the cross! Mary was the first witness to the Church being born as she was there at Pentecost. So you see, Mary was the first in a lot of things when it comes to following Christ. It's no wonder then, we begin our New Year with Mary at our side.

Finally, we also celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany this Sunday as well. Mary was there too when the Three Magi (or Wisemen) visited our Lord in Bethlehem and offered their gifts of Gold, Frankincense and Myrrh. The gift of gold was given because Jesus was a King. The gift of frankincense was given because Jesus was God. And, the gift of Myrrh means Jesus was also human like us. It's important to know that these three visitors were from a foreign land and so, in a sense, represent all nations on earth who are invited to come to the Lord! This would include us! TAO Pastoral Care Ministry news . . .

This week's Pastoral Care column provides us with a Christian perspective of health "wholeness" from our US Catholic Bishops; along with an appeal from Harry and Mary Fleegel, directors of the non-profit Homeless Helping Homeless, for prayers and assistance for members of our community who are struggling to maintain health and wholeness in the face of homelessness.

Health and healing of our body, mind and spirit for our parishes and communities.

Health in the Christian perspective means wholeness — not only physical and emotional, but also spiritual and social. Health has to do with more than strictly medical concerns. The restoration of health and the maintenance of good health are not solely the responsibility of doctors, nurses, and other medical professionals. We bear a responsibility in this regard, both as individuals and as members of large social and religious institutions. (National Conference of Catholic Bishops, Health and Health Care {1981} paragraph 14)

We bear a responsibility

January is upon us: it will become brutally cold, windy, snowy, and dark. As we hunker down in our warm beds or bundle up for our mad dash to our cars, imagine what it must be like to have no car, no bed. Imagine how scary it is to have to sneak into a building and hide in a corner to avoid the bitter temps, or worse having to sleep outdoors in a tent with howling winds sucking all the warmth from your being. What it feels like to just curl up in a corner outside somewhere in Saint Cloud in January, your toes screaming in pain, while you shake and shiver uncontrollably, hopeless alone and afraid.

As we contemplate the blessings and challenges of this past year, let us turn to the Lord in prayer to seek out our call for the coming months. At Homeless Helping Homeless we were confronted with the task of operating a low barrier shelter, something that none of us had ever done before. We were faced with the scary thoughts of raising enough funds to cover the expense of feeding, housing, clothing, and comforting hundreds of God's children. We put our trust in God who then sent the Holy Spirit into your hearts, and you responded by providing us with food, clothing, volunteer time, funding, and prayer support.

We want to thank you all. We especially want to thank the Together as One Social Justice Committee and all members of St. Peter's, St. Paul's, St. Michael's and St. Joseph's, along with students and families of All Saints Academy, who put together Christmas gift bags for all the residents of Lincoln Center, Dallas Place and those on the street experiencing homelessness. Thank you Donella and Maddie and staff at Julies Bistro for preparing and donating meals for a holiday celebration.

In the new year, we ask that you remain open to Our Savior's message of love for all in His family, and consider offering extra prayers for an improvement in the situations of those experiencing poverty and homelessness. The Lincoln Center's needs this month includes winter gloves, long johns, men's pants, gas cards for those sleeping in cars, toilet tissue and volunteer time. Totus Tuus team leaders will receive an in-depth two-week training. Travel to six different parish areas during June and July, a break over the Fourth of July holiday.


