



A Note From Fr. Oswaldo

Not an hour more, not an hour less.

When the rule of adding an hour, or subtracting according to whether it was summer or winter, was installed to save energy, protect the world from global warming and be more productive, it was thought of everyone's benefit. It was a measure from science and human terminology; but what about faith, life after this life. For Christians who believe in the resurrection, how can we take a micro second out of life or add another minute? When the time stipulated by God for each one of us runs out, we cannot do anything. Theology speaks of the economy of salvation, because Christ with his incarnation advanced the time of redemption, but shortened the time that we will remain in the world. This Economy or plan of salvation will be known by all in the Final Judgment: "Then He will pronounce, through his Son Jesus Christ, his definitive word over all history. We will know the ultimate meaning of the entire work of creation and of the entire economy of salvation, and we will understand the admirable paths by which his Providence will have led all things to their ultimate end. The Final Judgment will reveal that God's justice triumphs over all the injustices committed by his creatures and that his love is stronger than death." (CCC, 1041).

The Jews were asking Jesus about the day after death, when we wake up, when we open our eyes, who we will see. We have faith in Christ, that we will all be like angels and the only vision will be, the glory of the Father. "For they will be like the angels and sons of God, for he will have raised them up." (Lk 20 27-38). God has time, vain illusion is to say that we can steal one more moment in this world, time is running out, convert and believe in the Gospel. This earthly life is limited, life in Christ is infinite.

The Archdiocese provides a full range of pastoral ministries to those serving in the United States Armed Services, enrolled in U.S. Military Academies, undergoing treatment at any of the 153 Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Centers, working in civilian jobs for the federal government beyond U.S. borders, and for families of these populations. The fund was established in 1985 by Pope John Paul II. Please prayerfully consider if and what you can donate to this worthy cause.

Youth and Adult Faith Formation

Faith Formation classes are underway, and what a great group of families we have! Faith formation catechesis and Sacraments. Tell family and friends with kids... **its where Families Belong!** Community meal continues every Wednesday as well – **PLEASE** join us!

Our theme this year is “Put on the Armor of God” from St. Paul’s letter to the Ephesians. So far, we’ve discussed the **Belt of Truth** and the **Breastplate of Righteousness**. The armor of God is a metaphor in the Bible from Saint Paul’s letter to the Ephesians that reminds us about the reality of the spiritual battle we are in and describes the protection available to us. To put on the full armor of God is to apply all of the gospel to all of our life. The whole armor is the expression of our full trust in God and what he has done for us through Jesus Christ. Our victory in spiritual warfare what is secured at the cross of Christ and in his blood that was shed there.

Last Wednesday we celebrated **All Souls Day** with Mass at 6:30. What a beautiful Catholic family experience, attending Mass together – one which should be done as often as possible as a family.

Catechesis of The Good Shephard (CGS), a program for students age 4 – grade 3 is a method of helping children enter into a relationship with God. CGS takes place in a room called the “Atrium”. This is what the entrance space in Basilicas was called in ancient times. The Atrium is “more like a church than a classroom.” It is a place where the children learn to contemplate God.

Uniquely Catholic Topic: Rosary Retreat with Real Presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. One of the most important Catholic beliefs is the real presence of Jesus Christ in the Body and Blood of Communion. The term “**Real Presence**” refers to Christ’s actual presence in the bread and the wine - a profound mystery. With the words of consecration, the whole of Christ is truly present – Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity – under the appearances of bread and wine. Last week we had special guest **Patrick Norton** lead us in a Rosary retreat, with a scriptural Rosary around the Altar, while in the Real Presence of Jesus in the exposed Blessed Sacrament. It was truly a beautiful time together, reinforcing the lessons of the power of the Rosary and the beauty of Eucharistic Adoration. Our Catholic faith is so full and beautiful! Special thanks to Patrick and his wife Sandy for their dedication to the faith and for bringing 1st class relics from St. John Vianney, St. Maria Goretti, and St. Therese of Lisieux, as well as miraculous medals to help protect us every day. St. John, St. Maria and St. Therese – Pray for us!

Confirmation Students are moving through their Discipleship Training classes and we have an outstanding group of students. Last week we took a deep dive into the Nicene Creed, a very easy way to describe what it means to be Catholic and what we believe as Catholics. Please pray for our Confirmation students and mentors, that their efforts will lead these students to become the strong Catholic Saints that God calls us all to be.

A note from Catholic Charities....

Every month, Catholic Charities Food Shelf relies on members on a local parish to assist them with operating the Food Shelf. Decades ago, many local Catholic and Lutheran churches committed to one month of service annually. The Church of St. Peter is one of Catholic Charities partners in the battle against hunger in our area.

In recent years, we have been challenged to recruit enough volunteers to help our community’s largest Food Shelf. Many regular volunteers have retired after years of service and new or younger volunteers have been slow to step up. As the numbers of people needing to use the Food Shelf has risen, the number of people willing and available to assist has dropped. Please consider devoting a few hours during December to assisting at the Food Shelf. The Food Shelf is open all day every Monday and Friday from 9:00am until 3:00pm. Every Wednesday 11:00am until 7:00pm. Volunteers receive onsite training so they can assist clients using the Food Shelf. It is not difficult, and allows you to provide a very real, necessary and meaningful service to others. There are a variety of time slots each day that run about three hours each.

The most difficult step to take is often the first step. After giving it a try most people find it to be a very fulfilling experience are happy to return and volunteer year after year. Understandably, many of us are busy, or we think someone else is better equipped to help. The truth is, we are all called to work together to create something good for all of us. Please consider giving this a try!
