

A Note From Fr. LeRoy

Most of you have maybe heard or seen the movie, "The Bucket List" starring Morgan Freeman and Jack Nicholas. It's a movie about two terminally ill men who meet each other and discover they have a wish-list of things they would like to do before they "kick the bucket!" It is both a humorous and yet some-what serious story about life and facing our own mortality at death. In the film, Morgan plays a man of faith in God while Jack is basically an agnostic or atheist. By the end of the movie, however, the viewer sees Jack beginning to step out of his cynicism and shell and come to a greater sense of faith in God as he fills his "bucket list" and eventually experiences his estranged family reconciled again. If you haven't seen it, you should rent it and enjoy.

I think everyone should have some sort of "bucket list" whether it be traveling to another country to see where your ancestors came from or going on a pilgrimage to Rome or the Holy Land or other place of spiritual interest. (For Catholics, I think Rome should be on everyone's list.) It might be seeing our nation's capital, going to some famous city, putting your bare feet into both oceans, holding your first grandchild, or going on a hot air balloon ride. Together As One Social Justice Activities and Invitations to Service

The following article from USCCB website seems fitting for November liturgies.

Grief is a natural part of life. Every person has their turn to experience the loss of a loved one.

The Catholic Church offers resources to help deal with the pain of such loss in healthy ways, and St. Edward Church in Nashville is establishing a grief ministry as a way to provide some of those resources to the faithful. "One of the things that we encounter frequently as a church is funerals and, as the church, we have this beautiful funeral liturgy to offer after someone's death," said Father Andy Bulso, pastor of St. Edward. "But it seemed like there was more that we could do, especially because oftentimes, the funeral is just the beginning for the families," he added. "We wanted to continue to support people as they go through the grieving process, which can last a really long time." "It changes over time and goes through periods of more intensity."

To prepare for this ministry, Father Bulso sent Julianne Staley, director of faith formation at St. Edward, to a grief and bereavement conference earlier this year in Denver. Staley learned a lot from the conference, including the difference between grief and mourning, what suffering truly means, and that the grief process is not progressive and is different for everybody.

"I've known for a long time that this is something that has been needed for the diocese, There are bereavement ministries at each church, but there are not many efforts that are put forth to help those in the weeks, months and even years after to support them in their grief and mourning," Staley added.

"The holidays are often a very difficult time for people who have experienced significant losses in their lives because it's one of those occasions that especially cause you to think about the loved ones you've lost and you miss them in a way that you wouldn't necessarily in day-to-day life," Father Bulso said. "So we knew that it was an especially meaningful and significant time to offer something like this."

Staley wants the program "to offer support, to offer comfort and to offer hope because the No. 1 question people are going to ask is, 'Is it ever going to get better' because it hurts so much when you lose a loved one. Everyone just wants that hope to know that it will be manageable one day, the pain of loss while we continue to live on earth and to live and honor that loved one until you meet again," she said.

Our theme this year is "Put on the Armor of God" from St. Paul's letter to the Ephesians. This week, we don the Shoes of The Gospel of Peace. The Gospel of peace is the good news of peace with God - as a result of being "justified by faith". We need the stability of a harmonious relationship with God if we are to stand firm against the enemy. The gospel of peace is also peace within. We need peace within ourselves if we are to win the victory. If we are guilty, anxious, and worried about the issues that can distress us, we cannot defeat fear and despair. The gospel of peace is also peace with others. The gospel of peace enables us to find the humility to do what it takes to live at peace with everyone.

The armor of God is a metaphor in the Bible from Saint Paul's letter to the Ephesians that reminds us about the reality of the spiritual battle we are in and describes the protection available to us. To put on the full armor of God is to apply all of the gospel to all of our life. Our victory in spiritual warfare is secured at the cross of Christ and in his blood that was shed there.

Last Wednesday we celebrated All Souls Day with Mass at 6:30. What a beautiful Catholic family experience, attending Mass together - one which should be done as often as possible as a family.

First Sacrament students had a Reconciliation Retreat last Saturday, focusing on the Mercy of God and the forgiveness that brings us back into full relationship with God through the Grace that comes to us through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Please continue to pray for these students and their families as they prepare for this beautiful Sacrament of God's love and mercy.

Uniquely Catholic Topic: Catholic Families. God wants to change the world through our families. There are *5 marks of a Catholic family*. *Catholic families worship together*, by attending Sunday mass weekly and actively participating in parish life-our spiritual home away from home, *they pray together*, in praising and thanking God for his blessings, we ask him for the grace to love each other and the world better, and seek his will for our lives and the lives of others. *They are called to an intimacy* where we can be vulnerable to one another and feel safe, they **put family first**, putting family activities over all other activities that would seek to compete with them. Lastly, *the Catholic family is a witness and sign*. We serve the world-at-large in a manner that is responsible and respectful of the integrity of the family unit.

Catechesis of The Good Shephard (CGS), a program for students age 4 - grade 3 is a method of helping children enter into a relationship with God. CGS takes place in a room called the "Atrium". This is what the entrance space in Basilicas was called in ancient times. The Atrium is "more like a church than a classroom." It is a place where the children learn to contemplate God.

Confirmation Students are moving through their Discipleship Training classes and we have an outstanding group of students. Last week we took a deep dive into the Liturgical year. The liturgical year is a cycle that keeps repeating itself year after year, but, from a spiritual standpoint, it is always new because it continues to draw us more deeply into our relationship with Christ. Unlike the secular year, which marks the passage of time, the liturgical year celebrates the sacred mysteries of the birth, life, death and resurrection of Jesus. Please pray for our Confirmation students and mentors, that their efforts will lead these students to become the strong Catholic Saints that God calls us all to be.
