

A Note From Fr. Oswaldo

Jesus, Says one word...

At this time, we feel the joy of being invited to the house of the Lord; It gives us hope that one day we will reach the kingdom of heaven. The liturgy invites us to be prepared, the message is clear, it will arrive without warning, at any moment the doors will open and we must be ready to enter and receive what we have fought so hard for. The celebration of Christ the King of the Universe closes a cycle and begins Advent, which prepares the Nativity of Jesus. The figure of the mountain where all the people will go is at the top of the mountain and climbing implies effort. Looking up means putting our hope in the values of heaven, and not in earthly things, because they will pass, but the Word of God will not. To wake up from the dream, that is, to see reality, to find in Christ the way, the truth and the life.

A time of hope, like the trust that the soldier put in Christ, when he asked him to heal his servant. "Sir, I have a servant in my house who is in bed, paralyzed, and suffers a lot." He replied: "I am going to cure him". (Mt 8, 5-11). The official asked only for a word from Jesus. Do we know how many words the Bible has? But the officer replied: "Lord, I am not worthy to have you come into my house; if you say a single word, my servant will be healed."

How many words do we need to believe in God, put our trust in Jesus, follow him and have him as the only God and savior? All are welcome to participate in the incredible growth God's love brings us each week. Faith formation catechesis and Sacraments. Tell family and friends with kids... its where Families Belong!

Our theme this year is "Put on the Armor of God" from St. Paul's letter to the Ephesians. Because of the Holiday last week, there was no class, but the theme will continue this week with the Shield of Faith. As our Faith gets stronger, it "drives away all cowardice". That stronger Faith pleases God and He richly rewards it. The armor of God is a metaphor in the Bible from Saint Paul's letter to the Ephesians that reminds us about the reality of the spiritual battle we are in and describes the protection available to us. To put on the full armor of God is to apply the gospel to all of our life. Our victory in spiritual warfare what is secured at the cross of Christ and in his blood that was shed there

Last Wednesday there was no classes due to the **Thanksgiving Holiday**. From our ACC faith formation office, we hope you had a wonderful Thanksgiving filled with the love of family and friends! May God bless all our families as we enter into the Advent season.

First Sacrament students are preparing diligently for Reconciliation on December 14th. Their studies have been focusing on the Mercy of God and the forgiveness that brings us back into full relationship with God through the Grace that comes to us through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Please continue to pray for these students and their families as they prepare for this beautiful Sacrament of God's love and mercy.

Uniquely Catholic Topic: Each week we have a segment in our weekly presentation things that make us <u>Uniquely Catholic</u>. So far this year, our topics to date have been <u>St. Paul</u>, <u>Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament</u>, the <u>Real Presence in the Eucharist</u>, <u>Catholic families</u>, and <u>Catholic Priests</u> who help us live our faith in so many ways.
