

A Note From Fr. Oswaldo

The Epiphany

Throughout the entire history of salvation, the word manifestation is present; as a real sign of presence or proof that what has been said is true. The prophecies are not fulfilled, if what they have said is not manifested. It is also a very good way to prove that what we say is going to come true, for example, if I say that I will be, well, my behavior will be better, I will leave the bad path and take the right path; Well, manifest it with real works and consistent over time and you will be believed.

With the Epiphany, God shows the nations that the prophecies have been fulfilled, that the signs and signals give a clear sample of the truth.

"The Greek term Epiphany had the meaning of a powerful entrance, on its own merits, into the fame of the people, and it referred to the arrival of the king in a city. It also served to indicate the appearance of a divinity or a prodigious intervention of it. This festival was born in the churches of the East in the second half of the s. IV, at the same time as Christmas in the West, and was intended to celebrate the birth and baptism of Christ. Subsequently, the two festivals were celebrated everywhere, and the Epiphany remained in the East as a memory of Baptism while in the West they proposed to celebrate above all the coming of the Magi, presented as the first fruit of the Gentiles, Jesus manifesting himself as the first fruit of all peoples. This is how the mystery hidden in God is revealed: "That the Gentiles are also co-heirs, members of the same body and partakers of the Promise in Jesus Christ, through the Gospel." Together As One Social Justice Activities and Invitations to Service

Today's column is written by Janet Reigstad, a parishioner at St. Paul's and a member of the TAO Social Justice committee, who is participating on the planning group for the 2023 MLK (Martin Luther King) Community Celebration in St. Cloud. TAO parishioners are warmly invited to participate in these multi-generational, multicultural events. There is no fee for attending, but you must register (see below).

The theme is "Our Beloved Community – the Courage to Celebrate Diversity". We know that being part of a community is an essential aspect of Catholic life – hence, we are the Together as One Catholic Community. Can we broaden our horizons to think of ourselves as part of the larger Beloved Community envisioned by Martin Luther King, Jr?

There are three events during the weekend, including the hallmark breakfast and speaker at the convention center on the Martin Luther King, Jr. holiday. There will be acknowledgement of the importance of persons who are employed to help our community through public works – refuse removal, snow plowing, etc. This is in remembrance that MLK emphasized the dignity of all work during remarks to striking sanitation workers in Memphis the evening before he was assassinated. Below is a description of each event:

<u>MLK Families:</u> Sat., Jan. 14th 9:30am–12:00pm Fun and dynamic activities for families at St. Cloud Technical and Community College.

MLK Spirit: Sun., Jan 15th 4:00-6:00pm Praise and worship celebration at Jubilee Worship Center (this is described by a planning team member as a "gospel and Christian music extravaganza").

MLK Justice: Mon., Jan 16th 7:30-10:30am (MLK Day) at the River's Edge Convention Center. There will be a hearty breakfast of chicken and waffles, and will feature special thanks and acknowledgment of Public Works professionals, a community service project, and awards.

The keynote speaker, Osheta Moore, is an author, pastor, public speaker, a black mama navigating race conversations, and a peacemaker. Her book, Dear White Peacemakers, written in the aftermath of George Floyd's death, is a breakup letter to division, a love letter to God's beloved community, and an eviction notice to the violent powers that have sustained racism for centuries. Additionally, there will be special King's Kids programming for children in grades K-5.
