



A Note From Fr. LeRoy

As you know Bishop-elect Patrick Neary CSC will be ordained and installed as the Tenth Bishop of our Diocese of St. Cloud on Tuesday, February 14th at 1:00 pm. at St. Mary Cathedral. This Mass and ceremony are by invitation only, however, on the eve of the ordination, Monday February 13th at 5:30 pm. at St. Mary Cathedral there will be a prayer vigil and Solemn Vespers for our new bishop which is open to the public. There will also be a reception for the bishop in the lower church that same evening so you may have an opportunity to meet and greet the new shepherd of our Diocese. I, encourage you then to join us for these Solemn Vespers as our Fr. Patrick prepares for his new role. Not since Bishop Jerome Hanus have we had an actual ordination of a bishop within our diocese. Both Bishop John Kinney and Bishop Donald Kettler were already bishops in a previous diocese and so they were simply "installed" as a bishop for us. For this reason, we will not only have Archbishop Bernard Hebda as the presider and ordaining bishop, but I believe we will also have the Papal Nuncio to the United States as witness to the ordination. There will be other dignitaries as well such as the Bishops of Minnesota and our Midwest Region present, not to mention the proud parents of Bishop-elect Patrick present at the ceremony.

Each Pastor was given two tickets for each parish they pastor as special invitations to attend as well. My first choice is the two Trustees of St. Peter and St. Paul, giving them first chance. I am not sure what decision Fr. Timothy will make. If you have a great urge to go, you can take that up with him!

We are thankful that a new shepherd has been appointed for the St. Cloud Diocese, and we are hopeful that he will continue to support the strong Catholic Faith and Tradition we have here in Central Minnesota. I encourage everyone, even if you are not able to attend the evening vespers to pray for our new bishop, that the Holy Spirit will guide his decisions and leadership with faith, hope, courage, generosity, wisdom and good counsel. Bishop-elect Neary will have a lot of decisions to make in the near future in regard to the direction of our diocese as he face the challenges of decrease in vocations, parish ACC merging, a declining Catholic population, and ever-growing secular challenges of our society.

Again, with this said, please keep Bishop-elect Patrick Neary CSC and all bishops, priests, and deacon in your

Together As One Pastoral Care Ministry news...... The holidays are behind us and for some, that is a great relief. For others who suffer from depression it is yet another source of pain. In reading articles taken from John Hopkins Hospital and other institutions, I have learned some interesting facts that I will share.

It is during these celebratory times that many people suffer. We are always told to be aware of our surroundings which is great but more importantly we need to be aware of the people around us and what they may be feeling. Depression is not something that our loved ones can just "snap out of". Contrary to popular belief suicide rates spike in the light of spring, not the darkness of winter.

Surprisingly, the highest number of suicides take place in April, May and June. Our young people tend to take their own life during these months. One theory is fear of the unknown after graduation, perhaps? Fear of where our world is going? It takes 10 SEC-ONDS for someone to make that final decision to end their life. You might speak with a friend/child/spouse and leave the room and there is no way to stop what they are planning.

PLEASE-please if you know of someone suffering from depression or anxiety or seems to be more sad than usual, go out of your way to ask how they really are, suggest professional. Prayers are always needed and let us keep anyone with mental health issues in our daily prayers. Pray for those families who have lost a loved one to suicide. The survivors carry guilt, sadness and usually guestion what they could have done to prevent a tragedy. All are welcome to participate in the incredible growth God's love brings us each week. Faith formation, catechesis and Sacraments. Tell family and friends with kids... *its where Families Belona!*

"The Chosen" season 2 continues on Wednesday evenings at St. Peters. Please Join us for community meal and fellowship as we learn about the life and ministry of Jesus.

Our theme this year is **"Put on the Armor of God"** from St. Paul's letter to the Ephesians (Eph.6:10-17). Each week we learn how to apply each piece of the Armor of God to our lives to avoid the tactics and snares of the evil one. Last week we brought the full armor together, to show how we can equip our souls to avoid the snares of the evil one and strengthen and defend God's holy Church. Now, more than ever, we must equip ourselves as soldiers for Christ! **Community meal** continues every Wednesday with Faith Formation. *Please join us!*

First Sacrament students look forward to the First Eucharist Learning Stations on February 15th from 3:15 – 7:15pm at St. Peters. They will learn how the Sacrament of the Eucharist is not merely an instrument for the giving of grace—here is the actual Giver of grace Himself, Jesus Christ our Lord truly and personally present. The Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist is central to our Catholic faith. Belief in the Eucharist as the True Body and Blood of Christ is essential to being a Catholic. Please continue to pray for these students and their families as they prepare for this beautiful Sacrament of God's love and mercy.

Uniquely Catholic Topic: Each week we have a segment in our weekly presentation things that make us <u>Uniquely Catholic</u>. This week we discussed the 7 Sacraments and how they fill us with Grace, which is the free and undeserved assistance God offers us so that we might respond to his call to share in his divine life and attain eternal life. God's grace, as divinely offered gift, does not take away or restrict our freedom; rather, it perfects our freedom by helping us overcome the restricting power of sin, the true obstacle to our freedom. Catechesis of The Good Shephard (CGS), a program for students age 4 – grade 3 is a method of helping children enter into a relationship with God. CGS takes place in a room called the "Atrium". This is what the entrance space in Basilicas was called in ancient times. The Atrium is "more like a church than a classroom." It is a place where the children learn to contemplate God.

Confirmation Students are working hard to develop the habit of service through service hours in the community as well as the church. Last week, we prepared and packaged food for a community youth shelter, helping kids like themselves who need a helping hand. Please pray for our Confirmation students and mentors, that their efforts will lead these students to become the strong Catholic Saints that God calls us all to be.
