UPDATED SCHEDULE

We have entered into Phase II of the archdiocesan directives for the celebration of public Mass during the pandemic. Please see the inside pages of this bulletin for all the details. The short of it is this: We are able to host Masses for up to 96 people. In order to ensure that we stay within the given limits, we will require registration for our Sunday Masses. Daily Masses, for the present, do not require registration. To register for a Sunday Mass, which you can do from the preceding Monday until two hours before the Mass, please call the parish office (telephone registrations will end at Noon on Friday) or visit our website (www.goodshepherdgv.org) to find the appropriate registration link.

RETURNING TO PUBLIC MASSES AT GOOD SHEPHERD

BACKGROUND On May 23, 2020, Governor Walz amended Executive Order 20-56 to allow larger gatherings of faith-based groups in Minnesota. Subsequently, Archbishop Hebda sent a letter to the entire Archdiocese indicating that we could begin reopening churches for public liturgy (Phase II) on Wednesday, May 27, 2020. Parishes are to open only if they have adequate personnel and supplies to implement the archdiocesan directives. During Phase II, the maximum number of persons admitted into a church building is limited to 25% of seating capacity or 250 persons, whichever is less.

WHAT THIS MEANS FOR GOOD SHEPHERD Given the newest information from the Archbishop and the Governor, we will now hold public Masses for up to 96 people (roughly 25% capacity). Please continue reading to learn about the expectations for those coming to Mass, registering for Mass, and what to expect when you come to Good Shepherd.

SCHEDULE The schedule moving forward, which is subject to change, will generally run as follows:

Sunday Mass

Saturday at 5 p.m.
Sunday at 8:30 and 10:30 a.m.

Weekday Mass, Confession, Adoration:

7:30 a.m. + Weekday Mass
8:15 to 9:15 a.m. + Confessions and Eucharistic Adoration

Saturday Morning Mass, Confession, Adoration:

8 a.m. + Daily Mass
8:45 to 10 a.m. + Confessions and Eucharistic Adoration

GENERAL NOTES The obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation continues to be suspended as long as the pandemic continues. This means that you are not presently obligated to attend Mass. You should only come to Mass if you feel comfortable doing so. That said:

All COVID-19 positive persons, those who are symptomatic, and those living with them, must stay home.

Persons over age 65 and those with preexisting health conditions should continue to stay home during Phase II and avoid public gatherings, including in church.

We will continue to broadcast Mass online.

All the faithful should continue to follow hygienic practices at home: wash hands often, avoid touching the face, cover coughs and sneezes, etc. It is also recommended to use the restroom at home before coming to church.

Face masks are strongly urged for all those who come for Mass, Confession, and Adoration.

If you are able to do so, please bring your own hand sanitizer for use within the church.

SIGNING UP FOR MASS During Phase II, the maximum number of persons admitted into the church building is limited to 25% of our seating capacity. This means that we will be able to admit no more than 96 people into the church at a time.

We will use a signup procedure for Sunday Masses. To sign up for a Sunday Mass, please visit our website. You may also call the parish office by Noon on the preceding Friday.

In order to accommodate as many people as possible, please only sign up for one Sunday Mass. You will need to sign up each member of your household so that we can have an accurate count. If you do not sign up for a Sunday Mass, you might not be able to attend.

We will have people here ahead of Sunday Masses to check for your registration. This is to ensure that those who signed up for a specific Mass have seats. We will keep count of those who enter and allow for "walk-ins" as our capacity permits.

If demand necessitates adding Sunday Masses, we will do so and inform you of the addition.

WHEN YOU GET TO GOOD SHEPHERD When you come to Good Shepherd, enter through the canopy door. This will be the only way in. Before entering the church, sanitize your hands at one of the three hand sanitizer stations, utilizing the markings on the floor to maintain social distancing.

To make seating as efficient as possible, please enter the church using the back set of doors from the gathering space. Ushers will be present to help seat you as quickly as possible. It will be important for you to allow the ushers determine where you (and your household) will sit so that we can accommodate all of the people who register.

HOLY COMMUNION Distribution of Holy Communion will take place after Mass so as to allow for greater social distancing. We will have two stations for the distribution of Holy Communion — one for each side of the church. The congregation will be released one pew at a time to go to the appropriate station. After receiving Holy Communion, the faithful will continue out of the church and back to the parking lot. We recognize that many people would like to stay and pray. However, given the directives and need for social distancing, this will not be possible during Phase II.

Those sitting on the Good Shepherd side (left side of the church when facing the altar) will receive Holy Communion at the front set of doors leading to the gathering space. This side of the church will receive from front to back. Those in the front pew will receive first, then the second pew, then the third pew, and so on. Movement will be in the side aisle.

Those sitting on the Marian side (right side of the church when facing the altar) will receive Holy Communion at the back set of doors leading to the gathering space. This side of the church will receive from back to front. Those in the last pew will receive first, then the second-to-last pew, then the third-to-last pew, and so on. Movement will be in the side aisle.

OTHER CONSIDERATIONS DURING MASS Congregational and choir singing will be temporarily discontinued, as singing expels many more respiratory particles than speaking does. During Phase II, our Sunday Masses will be simple and spoken, much like a daily Mass.

We will not take up a collection during the offertory. Instead, we will have collection baskets on the way into and out of the church. We also encourage electronic giving.

DISCLAIMER We are implementing precautionary cleaning and disinfecting practices and social distancing guidelines to help reduce the risk of exposure to COVID-19. However, Good Shepherd cannot guarantee that visitors are 100% safe from exposure. Attendance at liturgies is at your own risk.



PRAY FOR COVID-19 ANOINTING CORPS, PATIENTS, FAMILIES AND MEDICAL SUPPORT TEAMS

- † One Hail Mary for the patient's family and friends, asking the Blessed Mother, Our Lady of Sorrows, to intercede to comfort them; and
- † One Glory Be in thanksgiving for the priest and for his protection, as well as the medical team attending to the patient.
