The obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation continues to be suspended as long as the pandemic continues. This means that you are not presently obligated to attend Mass. You should only come to Mass if you feel comfortable doing so.

All COVID-19 positive persons, those who are symptomatic, and those living with them, must stay home.

Persons over age 65 and those with preexisting health conditions should continue to stay home during Phase II and avoid public gatherings, including in church.

Face masks are strongly urged for all those who come for Mass, Confession, and Adoration.

Sometime following Masses next Sunday, I will set out on a 12-day adventure west with my brother and his family. Our ultimate destination is Glacier National Park. Some recreation and refreshment will be helpful as we head into an unprecedented start to a school year in the time of pandemic. Plus, it will be the most time I've spent with my brother in years.

I am grateful that we will have Mass coverage while I am away. Father Paul Kubista, who currently serves as the Assistant to the Archdiocesan Synod, will be covering all of our daily and Sunday Masses. My absence will, however, means some slight changes to the daily schedule. ON THE WEEDS AND WHEAT

The following insights into today's Gospel come from the *Catena Aurea*, a collection of writings on the Gospels from the Church Fathers compiled by Saint Thomas Aquinas.

CHRYSOSTOM The field is the world. Seeing it is He that sows His own field, it is plain that this present world is His. It follows, The good seed are the children of the kingdom.

AUGUSTINE The tares the Lord expounds to mean ... all the children of the Evil one, that is, the imitators of the fraud of the Devil. As it follows, The tares are the children of the evil one, by whom He would have us understand all the wicked and impious.

REMIGIUS By the harvest is denoted the day of judgment, in which the good are to be separated from the evil; which will be done by the ministry of Angels. ... As then the tares are gathered and burned in the fire, so shall it be in the end of this world. The Son of man shall send forth his Angels, and they shall gather out of his kingdom all offences, and them which do iniquity.

RABANUS Observe, He says, Those that do iniquity, not, those who have done; because not they who have turned to penitence, but they only that abide in their sins are to be delivered to eternal torments.

REMIGIUS In these words is shewn the reality of the resurrection of the body; and further, the twofold pains of hell, extreme heat, and extreme cold. And as the offences are referred to the tares, so the righteous are reckoned among the children of the kingdom; concerning whom it follows, Then the righteous shall shine as the sun in the kingdom of their Father. For in the present world the light of the saints shines before men, but after the consummation of all things, the righteous themselves shall shine as the sun in the kingdom of their Father.
